PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to implement Laws of Florida 2012-65 and make revisions necessary to clarify the language in the Chapter and to formalize policy.

SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED: Chapter 62B-49, F.A.C., establishes the Joint Coastal Permit program. Activities that required both a coastal construction permit and an environmental resource permit are authorized by a single joint coastal permit. The Department proposes to amend Chapter 62B-49 and add a new rule to implement the Laws of Florida 2012-65. The Department also proposes to clarify language in order to reduce confusion in the permitting process and reduce Requests for Additional Information (RAI's). The Department proposes to add conditions and amend portions to expedite the permitting process. Lastly, the Department proposes to amend procedures to allow for electronic submittal of applications.

69L-6.026 Periodic Reports

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Rule 69L-6.026, F.A.C., requires employers who are issued stop-work orders, where the assessed penalty exceeds \$50,000, to file quarterly compliance reports with the Division of Workers' Compensation. The Division is now able to efficiently monitor such compliance through the use of their data systems, which renders the filing of such employer reports unnecessary. Likewise, given the elimination of the need to file such reports, the rule, likewise, becomes unnecessary and is repealed.

SUMMARY: Repeal of Rule 69L-6.026, F.A.C.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

SUMMARY: The guidelines regarding the "Computation of Time" that governed when the Division of Workers' Compensation's Employee Assistance and Ombudsman Office could initiate contact with an injured employee or their representative were made obsolete by the 2002 amendment of s. 440.191, F.S.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: the guidelines relating to the "Computation of Time" found in Rule 69L-26.003, F.A.C., have been inconsistent with statute since the revision of s. 440.191, F.S., in 2002. The 2002 statutory revisions to s. 440.191, F.S., removed restrictions that had otherwise limited contact between injured employees and representatives from the Division of Workers' Compensation. There are no significant costs associated with the repeal of Rule 69L-26.003, F.A.C.

(1) The Governing Board ~~will~~ ~~may suspend or~~ ~~revoke~~ a permit, ~~at any time~~ after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, upon a determination that one or more of the following has occurred based on one or more of the following grounds:

- (a) Material misstatement or misrepresentation in the application for a permit;
- (b) Failure to comply with the provisions set forth in the permit;
- (c) Disregard or violation of any of these rules or Chapter 373, Part III, F.S.; or
- (d) Material change of circumstances or conditions from those existing at the time such permit was issued.

(2) Prior to the commencement of any activity for which a permit has been issued, the permittee, the property owner or the party in legal control of the subject property may request revocation of the permit. A request to revoke a permit shall be submitted to the District in writing. The party requesting revocation of a permit shall be deemed to have waived the right to notice and an opportunity to request a hearing under Section 120.60(5), F.S. The District will provide such notice and an opportunity to request a hearing to the other party(ies). Upon confirmation that no activity has taken place pursuant to the

permit the District will revoke the permit provided no request for a hearing has been received. The District may administratively cancel a permit upon the request of the permittee or permittee's authorized agent, and confirmation by the District that no activity has taken place under the permit.

(3) Submittal of a Completion Report pursuant to paragraph 40D-3.411(1)(a), F.A.C., is not required if a permit has been revoked.

Applications will be reviewed by the Board utilizing District Forms No. 91-25 and 91-25 (a) through (f) Waterways Assistance Program Application Evaluation and Rating Worksheet (effective date 4-24-06); and 93-25 and 93-25 (a), (b) and (c) Waterways Assistance Program Navigation Districts Application

Evaluation and Rating Worksheet (effective date 4-24-06), hereby incorporated by reference and available from the District office.

(2) Project Funding Ratio: All financial assistance and support to eligible governmental agencies shall require, at a minimum, equal matching funds from the project sponsor, with the exception of public navigation projects that meet the provisions of subsection 66B-2.005(6)(7), F.A.C., land acquisition projects in accordance with subsection 66B-2.005(7)(8) and Rule 66B-2.008, F.A.C., and small-scale spoil island restoration and enhancement projects that meet the provisions of Rule 66B-2.014, F.A.C. derelict vessel projects consistent with Rule 66B-2.0015, and Waterway Cleanup Projects approved under Rule 66B-2.0016. Applicant's in-house costs are limited pursuant to paragraph 66B-2.008(1)(c), F.A.C. All financial assistance to seaports shall require equal matching funds. The District shall contribute no more than fifty percent (50%) of the local share of the cost of an inlet management or beach renourishment project. The District shall not contribute funding to both the state and local shares of an inlet management or beach renourishment project.

(3) through (6) No change.

(7) Land Acquisition: All land acquisition projects shall qualify for a maximum of twenty-five (25) percent program funding. All pre-agreement expenses for land acquisition must be completed within one-year of the date of application for funding. All funded land acquisition projects must construct the required boating access facility within 7 years of completion of the land acquisition, or the District may require the applicant to refund the program funding. Immediately upon acquiring title to the land, the applicant shall record a declaration of covenants in favor of the District stating that if the required boating access facility is not constructed within 7 years and dedicated for the public use as a boating access facility for a minimum period of 25 years after completion of construction, the District shall require the applicant to refund the program funding.
