The Ordinance amends the Monroe County Land Development Code bv modifying Sections (Definitions), 130-4 (Temporary Emergency Housing), and 130-5 (Temporary Uses) establishing regulations concerning temporary emergency housing (providing for the occupancy for persons displaced by a disaster and/or relief workers) and non-emergency housing (providing occupancy for workers involved in improvements to county-owned airport property). The Ordinance contains provisions regulating placement, setbacks, and duration of time for approval of temporary housing. The Ordinance also adds a definition for public assembly.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes.

- 5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in § 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 7. The Ordinance is consistent with the Monroe County Comprehensive Plan generally, and specifically with Objective 102.1, and Policies 102.3.2, 501.1.6, 501.2.2, and 501.2.3.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in § 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes, as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following Principle:
- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (c) Protecting upland resources, tropical biological communities, freshwater wetlands, native tropical vegetation (for example, hardwood hammocks and pinelands), dune ridges and beaches, wildlife, and their habitat.
- (m) Providing adequate alternatives for the protection of public safety and welfare in the event of a natural or manmade disaster and for a post disaster reconstruction plan.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Monroe County Ordinance No. 005-2015 is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING ISLAMORADA ORDINANCE NO. 15-03

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Islamorada, Village of Islands, Florida, Ordinance No. 15-03 (the "Ordinance.")

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by § 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Islamorada, Village of Islands, is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by Islamorada, Village of Islands on February 12, 2015, and rendered to the Department on March 16, 2015.
- 3. The Ordinance amends the Islamorada, Village of Islands Code of Ordinance, Chapter 30 (Land Development Regulations), Article 4 (Administrative Procedures), Division 2 (Development Review Process), Section 30-213 (Public Hearing and Notice) and Article VI (Specific Use Restrictions), Division 11 (Alcoholic Beverage Use Permit). This amendment provides for notice requirements informing property owners of an issuance of an Alcoholic Beverage Use Permit within 500 feet of the property subject to the application, and prohibiting any Alcoholic Beverage Use Permits within 300 feet of places of worship, schools, and child care facilities. The Ordinance also provides procedures and criteria to obtain a variance from the 300 feet prohibition.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. §§ 380.05(6) Florida Statutes.
- 5. Islamorada, Village of Islands is a local government within the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern. §380.0552, Florida Statutes and Florida Administrative Code Chapter 28-26.
- 6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

- 7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in § 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Islamorada, Village of Islands Comprehensive Plan generally, and specifically with Policy 1-4.2.1.
- 9. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes, as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following Principles:
- (n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintaining the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the Islamorada, Village of Islands No. 15-03 is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.
