6A-1.0014 Comprehensive Management Information System

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Revise the statewide comprehensive management information system based on recommended changes from school districts. This also includes state reporting and local recordkeeping procedures. The rule also adopts the updated FDOE Information Database Requirements: Volume I – Automated Student Information System, 2016 and Volume II – Automated Staff Information System, 2016. The effect maintains compatibility among state and local information systems’ components.

SUMMARY: This amendment adopts the updated FDOE Information Database Requirements: Volume I – Automated Student Information System, 2016 and Volume II – Automated Staff Information System, 2016. These documents describe the data elements, procedures and timelines for state reporting, local recordkeeping and statewide records transfer to be implemented by each school district and the department within the statewide comprehensive management information system.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification. (1) Each school district and the department shall develop and implement an automated information system component which shall be part of, and compatible with, the statewide comprehensive management information system. Each information system component shall contain automated student, staff and finance information systems and shall include procedures for the security, privacy, and retention of automated records. The procedures for the security and privacy of automated student records shall be in accordance with the requirements of 20 U.S.C. 1232g(b)(3), 34 C.F.R. Part 99, and Sections 1002.22, 1002.221, 1002.222, and 1002.225, F.S.

(a) No later than March 5 of each year, the Department shall produce a preliminary "CAPE Industry Certification Funding List." This list shall be based on certifications identified on the previous year's "CAPE Industry Certification Funding List" and on the most recently approved "CareerSource Florida Recommendations."

(b) School districts shall submit any request to include an industry certification, not on the preliminary "CAPE Industry Certification Funding List," to the final "CAPE Industry Certification Funding List" to the Department of Education. The Department shall grant the request based upon the following criteria:

1. The request demonstrates that the certification meets the requirements for inclusion on the list as specified in paragraph (7)(a) of this rule; and,

2. The requests is received no later than April 1.

(c) Districts shall be notified of the recommendation for inclusion on the list through a posting by June 15 on the Department's web site at the following link: <http://www.fldoe.org/academics/career-adult-edu/cape-secondary> <http://www.fldoe.org/workforce/fepea/default.asp>.

(e) Postsecondary dual enrollment courses must be registered by the district as career-themed courses in order for the "CAPE Industry Certification" or "CAPE Acceleration Industry Certification" earned in these courses to be included in the additional FTE membership calculation, under the conditions specified in section 1011.62(1)(o)1.b., F.S.

(14) Registration of career and professional academies and career-themed courses. The Department of Education shall maintain a web site for school districts to register high school career and professional academies, middle grades career and professional academies, and career-themed courses.

(a) through (b) No change.

(c) For career-themed courses, school districts shall annually submit up-to-date information on each career-themed course by school during an initial registration period from October 16 to November 30, and shall be allowed to submit updates after the initial registration period during the subsequent period of February 1 to March 1 and August 1 to August 10. RULE TITLE: Notice Requirements for Opportunity Scholarship Program.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Remove obsolete and unnecessary notification deadlines.

SUMMARY: Prior to 2014-15, school grades for high schools came in the winter. Now all school grades are released in the summer. This eliminates the need to set a separate deadline for announcing Opportunity Scholarship Program (OSP) eligible schools.

5. **Fifth Prize.** Upon the Florida Lottery's receipt of a fifth prize winner's required documentation, the Florida Lottery will ship the winner \$75 in Lottery Scratch-Off tickets* and the team hats and polo shirts. The winner will also be provided a certificate with the necessary information to obtain the team football tickets from the fulfillment entity.

6. **Sixth Prize.** Upon the Florida Lottery's receipt of a sixth prize winner's required documentation, the Florida Lottery will ship the winner \$50 in Lottery Scratch-Off

tickets* and the team hats and polo shirts. The winner will also be provided a certificate with the necessary information to obtain the team football tickets from the fulfillment entity.
