6A-1.0014 Comprehensive Management Information System

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To revise existing requirements of the statewide comprehensive management information system to implement changes recommended by school districts and to change state reporting and local recordkeeping procedures for state and/or federal programs as described in the updated FDOE Information Database Requirements. The rule also adopts the updated FDOE Information Database Requirements: Volume I – Automated Student Information System, 2018 and Volume II – Automated Staff Information System, 2018. The effect maintains compatibility among state and local information systems’ components. The statewide comprehensive management information system provides the data on which the measurement of school improvement and accountability is based.

25-6.0426 Recovery of Economic Development Expenses

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Among other things, Rule 25-6.0426, F.A.C., limits an investor-owned electric utility’s recoverable economic development expenses to the greater of: (a) the amount approved in the utility’s last rate case escalated for customer growth; or (b) 95 percent of the expenses incurred for the reporting period not to exceed the lesser of 0.15 percent of gross annual revenues or \$3 million. Rule 25-6.0426 would be amended to increase an investor-owned electric utility’s recoverable economic development expenses on a phased basis through 2023 and to counter the effects of inflation since the cap was originally set.

59G-6.005 Reimbursement Methodology for Services Provided by Medical School Faculty

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the amendment to Rule 59G-6.005, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), is to update the aggregate reimbursement amount available for eligible providers.

SUMMARY: The amendment specifies the legislative appropriation for state fiscal years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019.
SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: A checklist was prepared by the Agency to determine the need for a SERC. THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

59G-6.005 Reimbursement Methodology for Services Provided by Medical School Faculty.

(1) This rule applies to all providers who are enrolled in Florida Medicaid who:

(a) Are defined as practitioners under the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' Physician Quality Reporting Systems program (PQRS).

(b) Provide medical services, dental services, behavioral health services, hearing services, and vision services to Florida Medicaid recipients receiving services through the fee-for-service delivery system.

(c) Are employed by, or contracted with, a Florida public or private, non-profit, accredited medical, dental, or optometry school to provide supervision and teaching of medical, dental, or optometric students, residents, or fellows.

(2) Reimbursement.

(a) Florida Medicaid reimburses providers for covered medical, hearing, vision, dental, and behavioral health services listed on the applicable Florida Medicaid fee schedule, incorporated by reference in Rule 59G-4.002, F.A.C., at either:

1. One-hundred-ninety percent of the Medicare rate, based on Florida locality code 0910299, listed on the January-June 2015 Medicare Part B physician fee schedule – Loc 99 (01/02), incorporated by reference, and available at http://medicare.fcso.com/Data_files, and at <http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-08250>.

2. One-hundred-ninety percent of the Florida Medicaid rate if the service is not covered by Medicare.

(b) Florida Medicaid reimbursement to providers for clean claims submitted to the Florida Medicaid Management Information System specified in this rule shall not exceed \$36,543,054 ~~27,864,092~~ for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 ~~2016-2017~~ and shall not exceed \$47,676,137 for Fiscal Year 2018-2019.

(c) Florida Medicaid will reconcile claims reimbursed in accordance with this rule on a quarterly basis. Any claims reimbursed after the maximum reimbursable amount is reached

will be recouped, or adjusted to the standard Florida Medicaid rate, as appropriate.

(3) Exclusions. Florida Medicaid does not reimburse providers in accordance with this rule for the following:

(a) Services rendered to dually eligible Medicare and Medicaid recipients.

(b) Vaccine, laboratory, and radiology services.
