1.1 Purpose of this Request for Qualifications

The Apalachee Regional Planning Council (ARPC), through this Request for Qualifications (RFQ), is seeking a qualified environmental consulting firm with engineering capabilities to provide assistance with various ARPC programs and activities.

1.2 Background Information

The ARPC anticipates a need for environmental, engineering, and construction project management consulting services for its projects and programs over the next five years.
