14B-1.002 Port Project Funding Application Procedures and Requirements.

(1) An application shall be accepted only from an eligible port. The port shall apply for the grant by submitting to the Council Application, entitled "Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Project Application," Form 01-016, revised March 2019, hereby incorporated by reference, ~~October, _____ 2015~~ at

~~<https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-06097>~~. Applications for program funds shall be submitted in electronic format and can be obtained utilizing SeaCIP (www.seacip.com). Applications shall be submitted by the appropriate duly authorized official of such port. The submission deadline for submitting applications for the upcoming Department of Transportation fiscal year funding cycle shall be determined by the Council in consultation with the Department each calendar year and noted in SeaCIP. Applications for other Department of Transportation fiscal funding cycles may be electronically submitted utilizing SeaCIP by an eligible port at any time during the calendar year.

(2) through (5) No change.

(6) Council staff shall have up to fifteen (15) days from receipt of an application to examine the application and notify the applicant ~~via SeaCIP~~ of any apparent errors or omissions and request any relevant additional information. The applicant shall have up to fifteen (15) days from receipt of the request to provide the additional information. The application shall be considered incomplete if the requested information is not provided.

(7) The project information required to be submitted by the applicant port is contained in SeaCIP and includes the following information:

(a) No change.

(b) Total funding requested, ~~phase or~~ year of request, state funds requested, local funds available, and source of port matching funds.

(c) through (e) No change.

(8) Approved projects shall remain eligible for funding for a period of three calendar years from the date of original Council approval, or for three sequential fiscal-year funding cycles, whichever is greater. Approved projects that have any major change shall require the submission of a new or modified application for consistency review by the Council and agencies. For purposes of this subsection, major change means a deviation from an approved project that is reasonably expected to have any of the following impacts:

(2) Pursuant to Section 311.09(7), F.S., upon receipt of the list of eligible projects approved by the Council and the appropriate related project information, the Department of Economic Opportunity shall review the projects to evaluate their economic benefit and consistency with the Florida Seaport Mission Plan and state economic development goals and policies. It is the expectation of the Council that within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the list of projects and supporting applications, the Department of Economic Opportunity will notify the Council of those projects which are ~~not~~ consistent. Should additional information be requested from one or more applicants to evaluate project consistency, the time limit for the Department of Economic Opportunity's review and notice to the Council may be extended up to fifteen (15) days following receipt of the requested information.

(3) Pursuant to Section 311.09(6), F.S., upon receipt of the list of eligible projects approved by the Council and the appropriate related project information, the Department of Transportation shall review the projects for consistency with the Florida Transportation Plan and the Statewide Seaport and Waterways System Plan. It is the expectation of the Council that within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the list of projects and supporting applications, the Department of Transportation will notify the Council of those projects which are consistent ~~identify those projects which are not consistent and notify the Council of projects found to be inconsistent~~. When additional information is requested from one or more applicants to evaluate project consistency, the time limit for the Department of Transportation's review and notice to the Council may be

extended up to fifteen (15) days following receipt of the requested information.

Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 45 No. 18, January 28, 2019 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

61A-4.020 Storage Permits.

(1) Manufacturers, rectifiers, ~~distributors~~, vendors and cooperatives or pool buying vendors who require additional storage outside of their licensed premises must obtain a permit therefor. ~~No Such permits can be obtained from the Division without fee, provided that the storage room is located in the same county as the parent place of business of the licensee or agent of such cooperatives or pool buying vendors to whom the permit was issued and provided that no such permits shall be issued to a structure which is or is a part of any the residence or garage of a licensee or any employee of any licensee.~~

(2) Distributors who require additional storage outside of their licensed premises must obtain a permit therefor. No such permits shall be issued to a structure which is a part of any residence or garage of a licensee. Such permits may be obtained without a fee provided that the off-premises storage is located in the same county as the parent place of business.

(3) Such permits authorize the storage of alcoholic beverages only in sealed containers. Applications for such permits shall be made on Form DBPR ABT 6017, Application and ~~Inspection Report~~ for Off-Premises Storage Permit, effective MM-DD-2019, adopted and incorporated herein by reference. This form is available upon request from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco, 2601 Blair Stone Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32399, or the Division’s district office serving your area of interest whose contact information is provided on the Division website at <http://www.myfloridalicense.com/DBPR/alcoholic-beverages-and-tobacco/license-information/>, or at <https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10438>. The application shall be submitted to the district office in which the licensed place of business for which the permit is sought is located.

~~(4)(2)~~ The district office will prepare a permit showing the name of the licensee and the licensed storage premises the licensee ~~owns and~~ operates. The storage permit shall be conspicuously posted at the off-premises storage facility.

~~(5)(3)~~ The renewal of off-premises storage permits will be automatic and concurrent with the beverage license renewal. The permit shall remain in effect until cancelled by the licensee or Division. Upon a change in ownership of the beverage license which corresponds to the off-premises storage permit, the existing permit shall be cancelled by the Division, and the licensee shall file an application pursuant to this rule for issuance of a new off-premises storage permit.

~~(6)(4)~~ In the event a licensee discontinues the use of the off-premises storage permit, the permit shall be forwarded by the licensee to the district office for cancellation.

~~(7)(5)~~ By acceptance of such storage permit, the licensee shall agree that the storage premises shall be subject to search by authorized employees of the Division, sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, and police officers during the hours such premise is occupied by the permittee or other persons.

Also, a copy of the petition shall be mailed to the applicant at the address indicated above at the time of filing.

In accordance with subsection 62-110.106(3), F.A.C., petitions for an administrative hearing by the applicant must be filed within 14 days of receipt of this written notice. Petitions filed by any persons other than the applicant, and other than those entitled to written notice under subsection 120.60(3), F.S., must be filed within 14 days of publication of the notice or within 14 days of receipt of the written notice, whichever occurs first. Under subsection 120.60(3), F.S., however, any person who has asked the Department for notice of agency action may file a petition within 14 days of receipt of such notice, regardless of the date of publication. For purposes of calculating ERCs, the gallonage of potable water assumed are compared to the 125 GPD equating to a single ERC of potable water; and that number of potable water gallonage shall also be used for the wastewater ERC count as compared to the 113 GPD equating to a single ERC of wastewater. For example, a 7,500 square foot bank would calculate the ERCs as follows: 20.4 GPD x (7,500 square feet/1,000 square feet) = 153 GPD; 153 GPD/125 GPD = 1.22 ERCs of potable water and 20.4 GPD x (7,500 square feet/1,000 square feet) = 153 GPD; 153 GPD/113 GPD = 1.35 ERCs of wastewater ERCs should be calculated to the nearest hundredth.
