PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To incorporate by reference an updated (2021) version of the "Financial and Program Cost Accounting and Reporting for Florida Schools" (Red Book) publication. Changes in law, accounting principles and district practices require periodic revision of this publication, which includes a chart of accounts. The effect is that districts will have an updated chart of accounts to use.

The amendment allows for the 2021 version of the "Financial and Program Cost Accounting and Reporting for Florida Schools" (Red Book) to replace the 2020 version, currently incorporated by reference in Rule 6A-1.001, F.A.C.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Currently, Rule 6A-14.0303 outlines the general education core course options for students completing an associate in arts or baccalaureate degree at a Florida College System (FCS) or State University System (SUS) institution. The general education subject areas include Communication, Humanities, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, and Social Sciences. This proposed amendment will modify this rule to include students earning a technical education degree, defined in s. 1004.02(13) as an associate in science (AS) or associate in applied science (AAS) degree program. The effect of this amendment is to align the rule with the new requirement, which specifies students entering a technical education degree program in the 2022-2023 academic year, and thereafter, complete at least one identified core course in each subject area as part of the general education course requirements (15 credit hours total).

SUMMARY: Includes AA and AAS degrees into the General Education Core Course requirements.

64B18-14.002 Disciplinary Guidelines.

The Board sets forth below a range of disciplinary guidelines from which disciplinary penalties will be imposed upon a licensee whom it regulates under chapter 456 and 461, F.S. The purpose of the disciplinary guidelines is to give notice to licensees of the range of penalties which will normally be imposed upon violations of particular provisions of either chapters 456, or 461, F.S., and/or any laws and rules adopted pursuant thereto. The brief description of each violation is provided for quick reference and is not intended to convey all elements of any given statutory provision. The full language of each statutory provision cited must be consulted in order to determine the conduct involved. The disciplinary guidelines are based upon a single count violation of each provision listed. Multiple counts of violations of the same provision of chapters 456, or 461, F.S., and/or the laws and rules adopted pursuant thereto, or other unrelated violations contained in the same administrative complaint will be grounds for enhancement of penalties.
