Project: UF-654, Gator Village (aka Honors Residential College), Gainesville, Florida

The intent of this project is to construct the new residential buildings, styled in a modern fashion but still in keeping with the traditional UF elegant style. The buildings will house a combination of single and double suites including ADA suits, making 1400 student beds. Facilities will also include music rooms, teaching kitchens and other academic spaces to support the social and academic engagement for the residents and non-residential students which includes an honor common for enhanced academic programming as well as staff and faculty offices. Blanket design professional liability insurance will be required from the architect, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, fire protection, structural, and civil engineering consultants for this project and will be provided as a part of Basic Services. The selected applicant will also be required to provide insurance coverage for General Liability, Automotive Liability, Workers' Compensation, and Builder's Risk.

Plans and specifications for University of Florida projects are subject to reuse in accordance with the provisions of Section 287.055, Florida Statutes.

Applicants will be evaluated on the basis of their understanding of the project, past performance, experience, personnel, design and construction ability, references, bonding capacity, workload, and responses to questions posed both in the shortlist and interview phases. The Selection Committee may reject all proposals and stop the selection process at any time.

At the time of application, the applicant must be licensed to practice as a general contractor in the State of Florida and the applicant or its architectural, landscape architectural, and engineering consultants must possess current design licenses from the appropriate governing board and be properly registered to practice its profession in the State of Florida. If the applicant is a corporation, it must be chartered by the Florida Department of State to operate in Florida.

The Department published a notice of rule development for Rule 15A-7.018 (the rule implementing this law) in Vol. 46, No. 214, of the Florida Administrative Register on November 2, 2020. However, the Department must obtain Cabinet approval before proceeding with the publication of a notice of proposed rule. Therefore, pursuant to subsection 120.74(5), Florida Statutes, the Department hereby extends the April 1 deadline to publish a notice of proposed rule for this rulemaking proceeding.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF KEY WEST ORDINANCE NO.

20-13

The Department of Economic Opportunity (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to subsection 380.05(6),

Florida Statutes, approving the requested changes to land development regulations (“LDRs”), adopted by the City of Key West, Florida (“City”) by Ordinance No. 20-13 (“Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Rule 28-36.002, Florida Administrative Code, designates the City as an area of critical state concern.
2. The City adopted the Ordinance on September 2, 2020.
3. The Ordinance amends Chapters 106 and 90 of the Land Development Regulations (“LDRs”) to transfer the administrative outdoor exceptions procedure from the planning board to the historic architectural review commission and to broaden the definition of the terms “merchandise” and “outdoor display”. The Ordinance also adds Section 106-55, which provides an appeal procedure for the final decisions of the historical architectural review commission. Sections following Section 106-55 are amended to accommodate to the addition of the Appeals section. Section 90-428 is amended to add that the historical architectural review commission decisions regarding outdoor displays are final in action.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The City may amend its LDRs, but the amendment becomes effective only upon approval by the Department. § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.
5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations amended by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City’s Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically, with Policies 1A-1.2.7 and 1A-1.2.8.
7. LDRs enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent and in compliance with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat. Rule 28-36.003, Florida Administrative Code sets forth the Principles for Guiding Development for the City.
8. The Ordinance is consistent and in compliance with the Principles for Guiding Development for the City as a whole, and specifically furthers the following principles:
 - (1)(a) Strengthen local government capabilities for managing land use and development; and
 - (e) Protection of the historical heritage of Key West and the Key West Historical Preservation District.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Ordinance No. 20-13 is consistent and in compliance with the City’s Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the City and is hereby **APPROVED**.

This Final Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below. DONE AND ORDERED in Tallahassee, Florida.
