PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Workshop originally scheduled for June 22, 2022, 4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. EDT has been moved to the below date and time. During the 2022 legislative session, Senate Bill (SB) 7044 modified Section 1004.085, Florida Statutes (F.S.), to supplement current law requiring posting of textbooks and instructional materials. Additionally, SB 2524 created a requirement in Section 1006.73, F.S., regarding advertising courses that utilize open educational resources and have zero textbook costs. The purpose of this amendment is to align the rule with the new statutory requirements. Approval of the proposed amendment of this rule may require Florida College System (FCS) institutions to update current policies

and procedures to bring greater transparency to textbooks and instructional materials costs.

6A-6.0532 New Worlds Reading Initiative

(1) Administrator. The University of Florida (UF) Laster Center is designated as the administrator of the New Worlds Reading Initiative.

(2) District Responsibilities for Implementing the New Worlds Reading Initiative. Each school district must:

(a) Identify a point of contact to serve as the New Worlds Reading Initiative liaison between the school district and the administrator for the initiative, and between the school district and charter schools;

(b) Within thirty (30) days of identifying a student who is eligible for the initiative provide a parent or guardian with:

1. Information on the initiative using marketing materials developed by the administrator;

2. Information on parent training modules and other reading engagement resources available through the administrator of the initiative; and

3. The enrollment link to register for the initiative;

(c) Coordinate with the administrator to initiate book delivery on a monthly basis during the school year, which must begin no later than October and continue through at least June;

(d) Coordinate with each charter school it sponsors for purposes of identifying eligible students, notifying parents, and raising awareness of the initiative; and

(e) Partner with nonprofit organizations to raise awareness of the initiative through the following means:

1. The student handbook and the read-at-home plan under section 1008.25(5)(c), F.S.;

2. A parent or curriculum night or separate initiative awareness event at each elementary school; and

3. Partnering with the county library to host awareness events, which should coincide with other initiatives such as library card drives, family library nights, summer access events, and other family engagement programming.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The proposed rule amendment is not expected to have any adverse impact on economic growth, business competitiveness, increase regulatory cost or any other factor listed in s. 120.541, F.S. and will not require legislative ratification. This is based upon the nature of the amendments, which expands the mechanisms colleges can use to assess a student’s readiness for college.

The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice:

On May 23, 2022 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for Subparagraph 61C-1.004(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code and Paragraph 5-202.11(A), 2017 FDA Food Code from Nativus LLC located in Orlando. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that each establishment have an approved plumbing system installed to transport potable water and wastewater. They are requesting to utilize holding tanks to provide potable water and to collect wastewater at the handwash and 3-compartment sinks.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 48/105 on May 24, 2022. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on June 08, 2022. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring the wastewater holding tank for the handwash and 3-compartment sinks are emptied at a frequency as to not create a sanitary nuisance; and potable water provided must come from an approved source and be protected from contamination during handling. The Petitioner shall also ensure that the handwash sinks are provided with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap, an approved hand drying device and a handwashing sign.

The Florida Office of Financial Regulation hereby gives notice: On 6/7/2022, the Florida Office of Financial Regulation issued a Final Order Denying Petition for Waiver of Rule 69W-600.0024, Florida Administrative Code filed by Steven Carroll Wall. The Office finds that the Petition has not demonstrated that the purpose of the underlying statute, section 517.12, Florida Statutes, implemented by the rule requirement to have timely passed the Series 65 examination, has been satisfied as to Petitioner's qualifications and knowledge. The Office finds that the Petition did not demonstrate that application of paragraph 69W-600.0024(6)(b), Florida Administrative Code, as to Petitioner, would create a substantial hardship. The Office finds that the Petition fails to clearly identify or delineate the specific way(s) paragraph 69W-600.0024(6)(b), Florida Administrative Code, violates principles of fairness by affecting Petitioner in a manner significantly different from the way it affects other similarly situated persons who have to take or retake an examination.
