Purpose: The purpose of this registration is the identification of the Career and Professional Academies operating in 2011-2012 (s. 1003.4935, F.S.). School districts are eligible for bonus full-time equivalent (FTE) membership for students who complete an industry-certified career and professional academy program and who are issued an industry certificate, according to guidelines established by s. 1011.62(1)(o), F.S. Districts may be eligible for additional funding in 2012-2013 based on students enrolled in 2011-2012. Only students from eligible career and professional academies will be eligible to generate additional FTE.

Guidelines: By registering, your district is certifying that these academies meet the statutory requirements of the Florida Career and Professional Education Act. Districts must submit all information for each academy that had students in 2011-2012; District must submit information for any academy that meets ALL of the statutory requirements of s. 1003.4935, F.S. Note: this system is designed to reject any registration attempt that does not meet ALL of the criteria found in Section II of the registration application.
