When an applicant is certified for licensure, but said licensure is restricted in such a manner as to require a period of practice under supervision of another licensee approved by the Board, the applicant’s license shall not be issued until a supervisor is approved by the Board. However, unless provided otherwise in the Board’s Order, the person who is certified for licensure must have a supervisor approved within 12 months of the date the Board certifies the applicant for licensure. If the person certified for licensure does not obtain an approved supervisor within that 12 month period, the certification for licensure expires and the person must reapply for licensure.

underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring
the public bathrooms located on the second floor are
maintained in a clean and sanitary manner and are provided
with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap,
approved hand drying devices, handwash sign and are
available during all hours of operation. The Petitioner shall
also ensure that directional signage is installed in the main
restaurant area clearly stating the location of the bathrooms.
