33-601.727 Visitor Conduct.

(1) Visitors must conduct themselves in accordance with the following requirements while on department property.

(a) through (b) No change.

(c) Visitors shall not possess, introduce, ~~or~~ attempt to introduce, conspire or otherwise agree to introduce contraband or illegal items into or onto the grounds of any department institution or facility nor shall they solicit, command, encourage, hire or request another person to engage in specific conduct which would constitute such offense or an attempt to commit such offense. Violations shall result in the suspension of visiting privileges by the warden or designee. Contraband items not of an illegal nature shall be seized by staff when found and shall be returned only on the approval of the duty warden.

RULE TITLE: Criminal Proceedings

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The revisions in the proposed amendment are intended to conform Rule 69B-231.150, F.A.C. relating to administrative license actions based on criminal proceedings to changes already made to Rule 69B-211.042, F.A.C. Subsections (1) and (2) are amended to clarify what is meant by the terms “felony” and “revocation”. Also, the word “immediate” is removed to better reflect the administrative process requirements which exist. Subsection (3) is deleted to

remove standards which are in conflict with statutory changes. A new Subsection (3) is added to conform the penalty scheme with Section 626.207, F.S., and Rule 69B-211.042, F.A.C. Subsection (4) incorporates definitions from Section 626.207, F.S. Subsection (5) adds qualifications for administrative actions based on criminal proceedings outside the United States.

SUBJECT AREA TO BE ADDRESSED: Administrative actions against Department of Financial Services licensees based on criminal proceedings.

69K-1.008	Criteria for Review of Criminal Records

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This rulemaking action would implement changes to Section 497.141(5)(a), Florida Statutes, regarding demonstration by license applicants who have a criminal record, that issuance of the license applied for would

not create a danger to the public. This proposed rule was approved by the Board of Funeral, Cemetery, and Consumer Services at its meeting on April 4, 2013.

SUMMARY: The rule specifies factors to be addressed and considered in evaluating whether a license applicant who has a criminal record, has demonstrated that issuance of the license applied for would not create a danger to the public.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the agency.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

69K-1.008 Criteria for Review of Criminal Records.

(1) This rule implements Section 497.141(5)(a), Florida Statutes, regarding evaluation of whether an applicant for license who has a criminal record has demonstrated that issuance of the license applied for would not create a danger to the public.

(2) An applicant for new or renewal license that has a criminal record required to be disclosed under Section 497.142(10), F.S., shall not be approved unless the applicant demonstrates that issuance of the license will not create a danger to the public. Such applicant shall complete and submit with the application a form DFS-N1-1716, "Criminal History Form." Applicant shall also make a written presentation to the Board, in the form of a letter to the Board, dated and signed by the applicant and attached to the application, addressing therein the factors listed below.

(a) A detailed explanation of the facts and circumstances of the criminal conduct.

(b) If applicant was not the sole perpetrator of the crime, a description in detail of applicant's role on the crime.

(c) If there are multiple crimes on different dates, applicant's explanation of why the multiple crimes should not be found to indicate inability or unwillingness to comply with applicable laws.

(d) The age of the applicant when the crime(s) was committed.

(e) Whether the crime involved physical violence, and the nature, amount and circumstances of the violence.

(f) A detailed description of the type and amount of personal or property harm, injury or damage suffered by any victim or innocent bystander as a result of the crime(s).

(g) Whether all legally required restitution has been made. If all legally required restitution has not been made, applicant shall provide an explanation of why it has not been made.

(h) If applicant initially denied or failed to disclose the criminal record on the application for license, an explanation for such denial or failure to disclose.

(i) Identification and description of any evidence that applicant is remorseful concerning the crime.

(j) Whether applicant believes they had a drug or alcohol abuse problem in the time frame the crime was committed and if so, identification and description of any evidence that applicant has been successfully treated, or has otherwise overcome or is in remission concerning such drug or alcohol abuse.

(k) Whether the applicant has successfully completed and complied with, or is completing or complying with, all requirements imposed by the court in the criminal proceedings, including but not limited to probation, and identification and description of any evidence in support of applicant's assertion in that regard.

(l) Whether applicant has, since the criminal court proceeding, engaged in any activity in the nature of community service, apart from and in addition to any criminal sentencing requirements, and if so, identification and description of any evidence in support of applicant's assertion in that regard.

(m) Any other argument by applicant as to why applicant would not be a danger to the public if the licensed applied for is granted, and identification and description of any evidence in support of such argument and not previously identified and described in applicant's presentation to the Board.

(3) Letters of References. An applicant subject to this rule should submit with their application any letters of reference they can obtain in support of their assertion that if licensed they would not be a danger to the public. Letters of reference may be from current or past employers, clergy, business associates, persons the applicant does or has done business with, law enforcement personnel, or any other persons. Letters of reference shall be given weight by the Board in accordance with the following factors:

(a) Letters of reference that are not signed shall be given no weight.

(b) A letter of reference that is not dated, or does not provide the writer's full mailing address and phone number, will be given reduced weight.

(c) A letter of reference that does not indicate how well, how long, and in what capacity the writer has known the applicant, will be given reduced weight.

(d) A letter of reference that indicates that the writer is aware of applicant's criminal conduct shall be given substantially more weight than a letter of reference that does not so indicate.

The change is in response to written comments submitted by the staff of the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee. The changes are as follows:

1. The rule shall now read as follows:

64B16-29.005 Storage.

All controlled substances, medicinal drugs or legend drugs Sodium pentobarbital and sodium pentobarbital with lidocaine shall be stored in a safe place. At a minimum, this shall require that the drugs be kept in a securely locked cabinet within a locked storage room. Schedule II order forms are to be stored under the same conditions. Records of purchases of all controlled substances, medicinal drugs or legend drugs sodium pentobarbital and sodium pentobarbital with lidocaine shall be maintained in a separate file from the records of administration. The records of purchases and administration shall be maintained at the location.

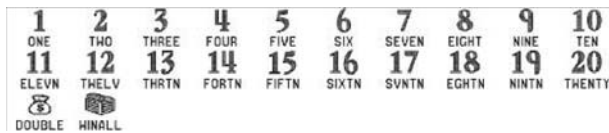

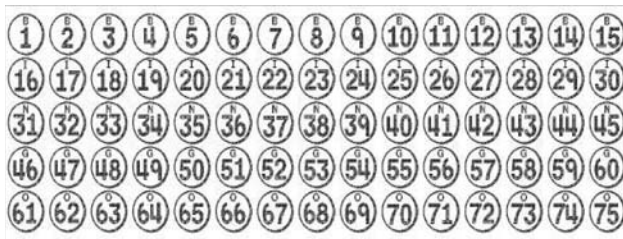

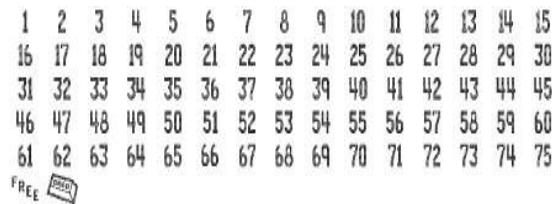

FINAL ORDER

The Department of Economic Opportunity (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat. (2012), approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West, Florida, Ordinance No. 13-01 (the “Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The City of Key West is designated pursuant to § 380.05(1), Fla. Stat. (2012), and Chapter 28-36, Florida Administrative Code, as an area of critical state concern. Land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West do not become effective until approved by the Department by final order. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat. (2012).

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City of Key West on January 8, 2013, and rendered to the Department on January 14, 2013.

3. By Ordinance No. 12-15, the City amended Chapter 108 of the City Code, entitled “Planning and Development,” to add Section 108-999 “Zoning in Progress” to defer for 365 days the acceptance and processing of building permit applications dated after November 16, 2011, while the City formulated and adopted amendments to its building permit allocation system. Ordinance No. 13-01 extends the period of deferment from November 16, 2012, an additional 365 days or until new land development regulations are adopted, whichever occurs first. The deferment may be extended by resolution of the City Commission for an additional period of 180 days to complete the adoption of the new regulations.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat. (2012).

5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. (2012). The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat. (2012). The Principles for Guiding Development for the City of Key West Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-36.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.

7. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole, and specifically furthers the following Principle:

(a) To strengthen local government capabilities for managing land use and development.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the City of Key West Comprehensive Plan and facilitates Comprehensive Plan Policy 1-3.12.1.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that City of Key West Ordinance No. 13-01 is found to be consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the City of Key West Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.
