PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Department is proposing amendments to Chapter 62B-33, F.A.C., Rules and Procedures for Coastal Construction and Excavation (Permits for Construction Seaward of the Coastal Construction Control Line and Fifty-Foot Setback), authorized by Sections 161.053 and 161.052, F.S., respectively. The proposed amendments will clarify and update existing rule language, delete obsolete definitions, revise the definition for “armoring”, “coastal system”, “construction debris”, “Department”, add definitions for “native vegetation”, “registered professional”, and “reissued permit”. The revisions provide additional exemptions from permitting for certain minor activities, delete obsolete references to the Florida Building Code, establish criteria for fill material, provide more specific criteria for siting of both major and minor structures (including those where armoring exists), establish criteria for rebuilt pipelines and ocean outfalls crossing the beach, clarify requirements for geotechnical data and other information required in the application process, delete the requirement to submit multiple copies of certain documents to the Department, simplify fee calculations, eliminate the permit fee for exemption determinations and permit transfers, reduce the permit fee for reissued permits, provide for

electronic submission of applications and related documents, provide success criteria for site re-vegetation, eliminate a requirement for construction progress reports, and clarify the methodology used to establish the 30-year erosion projection line.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Board proposes the rule amendment to update the time for all registered, licensed, or certified appraisers to comply to the rule.

SUMMARY: Update time to comply to Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly

regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

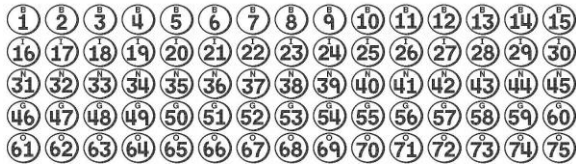

The provisions of the Order applies statewide in accordance with Governor Rick Scott’s Executive Order 17-235.

The Order is narrowly tailored to address those persons and entities which were adversely affected by Hurricane Irma. Further, the Order is of limited duration and directly addresses the emergency conditions declared by the Governor. The Order will facilitate the recovery from the emergency by allowing those adversely affected to have adequate time to recover from the emergency conditions.

The Order prohibits the cancellation or nonrenewal of personal residential and commercial residential property insurance policies that cover properties damaged by Hurricane Irma for a period of 90 days; suspends the time periods for any application, filing or document required to be filed with the Office; extends grace periods and provides a temporary postponement of issuing notices of cancellations and nonrenewals until October 15, 2017; provides procedures for policies subject to premium financing and provides procedures for the timely and efficient processing of claims.

The Order reads as follows:

EMERGENCY ORDER

TO: All Insurers, HMOS, Premium Finance Companies, Surplus Lines and other entities regulated by the Office of Insurance Regulation

THIS CAUSE having come before the Commissioner of the Office of Insurance Regulation as a result of the state of emergency created by Hurricane Irma, and being fully informed in the premises,

NOW THEREFORE, the Commissioner hereby FINDS as follows:

JURISDICTION AND FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Office of Insurance Regulation (the "Office") has the duty, pursuant to Section 624.307, Florida Statutes, to enforce the provisions of the Insurance Code (Chapters 624-632, 634,635, 636, 641, 642, 648, and 651, henceforth, the "Code"). The Office shall have the powers and authority expressly conferred upon it by, or reasonably implied from, the provisions of the Code, specifically Sections 624.307(2), Florida Statutes and as further authorized by Section 252.46, Florida Statutes.

2. On September 4, 2017, Florida Governor Rick Scott issued Executive Order Number 17-235, which immediately declared a state of emergency in every county in Florida due to the forecast models and track for Hurricane Irma, a major hurricane. Executive Order Number 17-235 is attached as Exhibit 1.

3. Section 252.63(1), Florida Statutes, provides that "When the Governor declares a state of emergency pursuant to s. 252.36, Florida Statutes, the commissioner may issue one or more general orders applicable to all insurance companies, entities, and persons, as defined in s. 624.04, that are subject to the Florida Insurance Code and that serve any portion of the area of the state under the state of emergency."

4. Pursuant to Section 627.7019, Florida Statutes, the Financial Services Commission adopted by Rule 69O-142.015, Florida Administrative Code, "standardized requirements that may be applied to insurers as a consequence of a hurricane." The rule addressed, among other things, claims reporting requirements; grace periods for payment of premiums and performance of other duties by insureds; and temporary postponement of cancellations and nonrenewals.

5. Section 627.4133(2), Florida Statutes, provides that With respect to any personal lines or commercial residential property insurance policy, including, but not limited to, any homeowner, mobile home owner, farmowner, condominium association, condominium unit owner, apartment building, or other policy covering a residential structure or its contents ... Upon a

declaration of an emergency pursuant to s. 252.36 and the filing of an order by the Commissioner of Insurance Regulation, an insurer may not cancel or nonrenew a personal residential or commercial residential property insurance policy covering a dwelling or residential property located in this state which has been damaged as a result of a hurricane or wind loss that is the subject of the declaration of emergency for a period of 90 days after the dwelling or residential property has been repaired. A structure is deemed to be repaired when substantially completed and restored to the extent that it is insurable by another authorized insurer that is writing policies in this state.

WHEREFORE, the Commissioner of the Office of Insurance Regulation finds that as a result of the direct effects of Hurricane Irma, the issuance of an Emergency Order pursuant to Sections 252.63, 624.307, Florida Statutes, and the Florida Administrative Code, is required in order to protect the public health, safety and welfare of Florida's policyholders.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

SECTION 627.4133(2), FLORIDA STATUTES
PROTECTIONS

(1) No insurer or other entity regulated under the Florida Insurance Code shall cancel or nonrenew a personal residential or commercial residential property insurance policy covering a dwelling or residential property located in this state, subject to this Emergency Order, which has been damaged as a result of Hurricane Irma. Such policy or contract of insurance may be cancelled or nonrenewed 90 days after the dwelling or residential property has been repaired.

DEEMERS: PRIOR APPROVAL OF RATE CHANGES:
SUSPENSION OF USE AND FILE RATE FILINGS

(2) The time period in which any application, filing, or document, required to be filed with the Office of Insurance Regulation, pursuant to the Florida Insurance Code or Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, which by statute would be deemed approved if not approved or denied within a specific time period, shall be tolled for a period commencing on September 4, 2017, the date the Governor declared the State of Emergency, and ending 90 days thereafter. Further, any time period within the Florida Insurance Code or Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, in which the Office is required to take action is also tolled for a period commencing on September 4, 2017, the date the Governor declared the State of Emergency, and ending 90 days thereafter.

(3) The Office will continue to accept "file and use filings", but in the interest of the public welfare, the acceptance of "use and file filings" are suspended for 90 days.

(4) Notwithstanding the "use and file" provisions contained in sections 627.0651 and 627.062, Florida Statutes, all use and file

rate changes filed with the Office, and not yet approved, having an effective date for new business or renewal business on or after September 4, 2017 through December 3, 2017, shall be filed and subject to the approval of the Office prior to implementation.

(5) Any "use and file" rate change implementing new rates without an official filing to the Office shall be withdrawn from use and the previous rate shall be reinstated immediately.

EXTENSION OF GRACE PERIODS AND TEMPORARY
POSTPONEMENTS OF CANCELLATIONS OR
NONRENEWALS

(6) The provisions of Rule 69O-142.015(2), Florida Administrative Code are hereby activated. Rule 69O-142.015, F.A.C is attached as Exhibit 2. If a provision is not listed in this Emergency Order, it is activated as written. Specific dates and amendments made to the rule are as follows:

Rule 69O-142.015(2)(d) As to any policy provision, notice, correspondence, or law which imposes a time limit upon an insured to perform any act or transmit information [...] with respect to a contract of insurance, which act was to have been performed on or after September 4, 2017, the time limit shall be extended to December 3, 2017. This extension of time shall not relieve a policyholder who has a claim resulting from Hurricane Irma from compliance with their obligations to provide information and to cooperate in the claim adjustment process relative to the property damage claim. This extension of time shall also not apply to new policies issued on or after September 10, 2017. No interest, penalties, or other charges, shall accrue or be assessed, as the result of the extensions required herein. Interest that is owed pursuant to premium financing plans with premium finance companies or insurers or their affiliates may be assessed. *Intentionally omitted.* This extension does not apply to premium due in the normal course of business.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (e) Between September 4, 2017 and October 15, 2017, no insurer or other entity regulated under the insurance code shall cancel or nonrenew a policy or contract of insurance or issue a notice of cancellation or nonrenewal, covering a person, property or risk in Florida, except at the written request or written concurrence of the policyholder. This provision may be extended should the Commissioner determine it is in the interests of the policyholders and issues an amended emergency order on or before October 12, 2017.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (f) All notices of cancellation issued or mailed on or after August 25, 2017 through and including September 3, 2017, covering a person, property or risk in Florida, shall be withdrawn and reissued to insureds on or after October 15, 2017.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (g) A cancellation or nonrenewal may occur prior to October 15, 2017, at the written request or written concurrence of the policyholder.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (h) Except as provided in paragraphs (e) and (f) with respect to a notice of cancellation or nonrenewal which, but for this rule, would have taken effect between September 4, 2017 and October 15, 2017, such notice is not made invalid by this rule; however,

1. The insurer shall extend the coverage to and including October 15, 2017, or a later date specified by the insurer;
2. The premium for the extended term of coverage shall be the appropriate pro rata portion of the premium for the entire term of the policy.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (n) This rule shall not apply to new policies effective on or after September 4, 2017.

Rule 69O-142.015(2) (o) If the contract of insurance was financed by a premium finance company for risks located in Florida, the following provisions apply:

1. Premium finance companies may issue advisory 10-day notices of intent to cancel and cancellation notices in accordance with the terms of the premium finance agreement signed by the insured. In addition, each such advisory notice shall prominently contain the following statement:

“If you have been displaced through the loss of your home or damage to your home which has caused you to reside elsewhere on a temporary basis, or if you have temporarily become unemployed due to the destruction caused by Hurricane Irma, please contact this office at once.

Victims of Hurricane Irma will receive an automatic extension of time to and including October 15, 2017, to bring their accounts up to date and no late charges will be applied to any late payments received which were due on their accounts between September 4, 2017 and October 15, 2017.

Therefore, if you are a victim of Hurricane Irma, please contact us at once at the number provided at the bottom of this notice so that we may advise you of the status of your account.

If you decide that you no longer need or desire to keep the coverage provided by the insurance policy financed by your contract with us, please contact us at once so that we may instruct you on how to effect cancellation with your insurer.”

2. If a premium finance loan is in default at the end of the grace period, a premium finance company shall give proper notice by:
 - a. Issuing a 10 day notice of intent to cancel to the insured by the means provided under Section 627.848(1)(a)1., F.S., and applicable regulations, and
 - b. If the insured does not bring their loan current within the time provided in the notice of intent, a premium finance company may mail the insurer a request for cancellation as provided in Section 627.848(1)(a)2., F.S.

3. Upon receipt of a request for cancellation from a premium finance company after October 15, 2017, the insurer will process the cancellation in accordance with paragraph Rule 69O-142.015(2)(i), F.A.C.

4. Any insurer who is unable to cancel because it has received a claim under a policy for which it receives a notice of cancellation from a premium finance company will offset the balance owed the premium finance company, as disclosed in the notice of cancellation, from the first claim payments made under the policy.

5. No late charges shall be assessed for any insured who qualifies for protection under this order.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

(7) Given the strength and size of Hurricane Irma, its catastrophic effect on Florida, stretching from coast to coast, and its potential impact on hundreds of thousands of policyholders, the Office expects all insurers and regulated entities to implement processes and procedures to facilitate the efficient payment of claims. This includes critically analyzing current procedures and streamlining claim payment processes as well as using the latest technological advances to provide prompt and efficient claims service to policyholders.

(8) Section 627.4035(3)(b), Florida Statutes, permits insurers to pay claims by debit card or any other form of electronic transfer upon written authorization of the recipient or the recipient’s representative. Due to the severe and catastrophic impacts from Hurricane Irma, many insureds will be unable to receive or send mail. For the duration of this State of Emergency, the requirement of written authorization is waived provided the insurer verifies the identity of the insured or the insured’s recipient and does not charge a fee for the transaction. If the funds are misdirected, the insurer remains liable for the payment of the claim.

(9) The Commissioner of the Office of Insurance Regulation may, by written Order, amend the scope of this order, based upon a determination that it is necessary.

(10) The provisions of this Emergency Order shall be liberally construed to effectuate the intent and purposes expressed therein and to afford maximum consumer protection.
