PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To adopt the 6th Edition Florida Building Code (2017) to address the statutorily required triennial update.

SUMMARY: This rule amendment represents the Section 553.73(7)(a), F.S., triennial update process. The Florida Building Commission (Commission) has reviewed local amendments to the Code and proposals for modifying the Code and has approved for adoption the 6th Edition, Florida Building Code (2017), which incorporates those proposed modifications which received at least a 75% supermajority vote of the Commission, as well as amendments and modifications previously adopted and required by law to be carried forward into the next edition of the Code. The Commission intends to update the Florida Building Code by amending the language of Rule 61G20-1.001, F.A.C. to incorporate the 6th Edition, Florida Building Code (2017) by reference. The proposed Code is published and available for review via link on the Commission website. www.floridabuilding.org and at codes.iccsafe.org/public/collections/FL.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the Agency.
