6N-1.001 Definition of Terms.

Terms used in these rules are defined in section 1000.35, F.S.

(1) "Accredited" means holding institutional accreditation by name as a U.S.-based institution from an accreditor recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

(2) "Council" means the Postsecondary Reciprocal Distance Education Coordinating Council.

(3) "C-RAC guidelines" mean the Interregional Guidelines for the Evaluation of Distance Education adopted by the Council of

Regional Accrediting Commissions.

(4) "Distance Education" means instruction offered by any means where the student and faculty member are in separate physical locations, including, but not limited to, online, interactive video, or correspondence courses or programs.

(5) "In-State institution" means an institution of higher education that holds its legal domicile in the State.

(6) "Investigation" means any governmental action taken by an agency under the authority of the State of Florida.

~~(7)~~(6) "Member institution" means a postsecondary educational institution approved by the Council to participate in a reciprocity agreement.

~~(8)~~(7) "National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement" or "NC-SARA" means the national organization that administers the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement.

~~(9)~~(8) "State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement" or "SARA" means the agreement specifying procedures and conditions for reciprocal recognition of institutions approved to provide distance education by states that are members of NC-SARA.

(10)(9) “Student” means the recipient or intended recipient of postsecondary educational activities as provided under the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement.

6N-1.002 Approval of In-State Institutions to Participate in NC-SARA.

(1) An in-State institution seeking approval to participate in SARA shall submit an application to the Council on Form 1000,

Application and Approval Form for Institutional Participation in SARA (<http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref08707>), effective ~~August 2019~~ ~~October 2017~~ This form is incorporated by reference and may be obtained without cost from the Council’s website at [www.flrules.org](http://www.flrules.org) or by writing to the Commission for Independent Education at 325 West Gaines Street, Suite 1414, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0400.

(2) The Council shall, upon receipt of an in-State institution’s complete application to participate in NC-SARA, approve the application if:

- (a) The applicant is an in-State institution authorized to operate in Florida pursuant to law;
- (b) If a private institution, an audited financial statement showing the financial responsibility composite score;
- (c) The applicant is accredited;
- (d) The institution, if it participates in federal Title IV financial aid, and has a federal financial responsibility rating of at least

1.5; or has a federal financial responsibility composite score of 1.0 to 1.5, and the Council has determined, upon examination of additional financial information, that either the institution has sufficient financial strength for state authorization or that the score between 1.0 and 1.5 results from an accounting error or the misapplication of General Accepted Accounting Standards in calculating the score. This alternative shall only be available for two (2) consecutive years. An institution whose composite score remains below

1.5 for three (3) years or longer shall no longer be eligible for participation in SARA;

(e) The institution, if it does not participate in federal Title IV financial aid, would, in the determination of the Council, have a federal financial responsibility rating of at least 1.5, or, with justification deemed acceptable by the Council, at least 1.0; and,

(f) The institution makes its state authorization-related complaint policies and procedures readily available to students, and informs students that they may appeal state authorization-related complaints to the Council pursuant to rule 6N-1.006, F.A.C.

(g) For any course or program potentially leading to professional licensure: the institution notifies students and potential students that the course or program meets the licensing requirements of the state where the students or potential students reside; or the institution notifies students and potential students that it cannot confirm whether the course or program meets the licensing requirements of the state where the students or potential students reside, provides students and potential students with current contact information for applicable licensing boards, and advises students and potential students to determine whether the course or program meets state licensing requirements;

(h) The provisional approval criteria in rule 6N-1.003, F.A.C., do not apply; and,

(i) The applicant has paid the fee required in rule 6N-1.005, F.A.C.

6N-1.003 Provisional Approval.

(1) The Council shall, upon receipt of an in-State institution’s complete application to participate in SARA, approve the institution to participate in SARA on a provisional status if the institution meets one of the following the requirements of this rule ~~chapter, but if:~~

(a) The Institution is on provisional or probationary status or the equivalent with its institutional Accrediting Agency; Is on probationary status or the equivalent with its institutional accrediting association;

(b) The Institution is currently required by the U.S. Department of Education to post a letter of credit or is under a cash management agreement with the U.S. Department of Education (Such institutions must still have a Federal Financial Responsibility Composite Score of 1.0 or above.); Uses a letter of credit or is under a cash management agreement with the U.S. Department of Education;

(c) The Institution has a Federal Financial Responsibility Composite Score between 1.0 and 1.5; Is the subject of a publicly announced investigation by a government agency, and the investigation is related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability, or student consumer protection, or

(d) The Institution is the subject of a publicly announced investigation by a government agency, and the investigation is related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability or student consumer protection; Is the subject of an investigation by the State related to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability, or student consumer protection.

(e) The Institution is the subject of a current investigation by its Home State relating to the institution’s academic quality, financial stability or student consumer protection;

(f) However, a third-party action such as a private lawsuit or news story does not by itself establish a government investigation. If such a third-party event results in an investigation by a government agency as set forth in subsections d and e above, these subsections become applicable. Lawsuits by government entities are considered to have resulted from a governmental investigation and can be the basis of a determination of Provisional Status.

(2) Terms and Length of Provisional Status.

(a) An in-State institution approved to participate in SARA on provisional status shall meet any requirements the Council deems necessary to ensure state authorization standards are met regarding program quality, financial stability, and consumer protection.

(b) The length of the provisional status of an in-State institution approved to participate in SARA shall be determined by the Council and may not exceed one (1) year.

(3) Provisional status of an institution between renewal periods. The Council may place an institution on provisional status at any time if the institution is subject to any conditions set forth in subsection (1) of this rule or if the institution's financial composite score falls between a 1.0 and 1.5.

(4) Application for Removal of Provisional Status.

(a) If an in-State institution approved to participate in SARA on provisional status no longer meets the provisional status criteria set forth in subsection (1), of this rule, it may submit a written request to the Council for removal of its provisional status designation and approval as a SARA member institution.

(b) The Council shall grant the request if the criteria justifying provisional status no longer apply, and if the institution meets the requirements of Rule 6N-1.002, F.A.C.

(c) If the Council determines that an in-State institution approved to participate in SARA on provisional status no longer meets the requirements of their provisional approval ~~or~~ and fails to gain full approval by the deadline established by the Council, the Council shall direct that the institution cease enrollments of students under the reciprocity agreement and:

1. Terminate the institution's reciprocity agreement, or
2. Allow the institution a grace period of twelve (12) months to come into compliance with the reciprocity agreement standards.

(5) In any 3-year period, the Council may grant an institution only one (1) grace period in which to correct non-compliance under this rule.

(1) An in-State institution shall apply to the Council annually on Form 1001, Renewal Application for Institutional Participation in SARA (<http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-08708>), effective ~~August 2019~~ ~~October 2017~~. This form is incorporated by reference and may be obtained without cost from the Council's website at [www.flrules.org](http://www.flrules.org) or by writing to the Commission for Independent Education at 325 West Gaines Street, Suite 1414, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0400.

(2) The Council shall approve the renewal application if the in-State institution continues to meet the requirements set forth in this rule chapter.

(3) If a private institution, audited financial statement shall accompany the renewal application. The financial statement must show the financial responsibility score in accordance with paragraph 6N-1.002(2)(b), F.A.C.

64B15-14.0081 Standards for Telemedicine Practice

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule repeal is intended to delete an unnecessary rule.

SUMMARY: The rule is being repealed. Recent statutory amendments have made this rule unnecessary.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: During discussion of the economic impact of this rule at its Board meeting, the Board concluded that this rule repeal will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. The rule repeal will not increase any fees, business costs, personnel costs, will not decrease profit opportunities, and will not require any specialized knowledge to comply. This change will not increase any direct or indirect regulatory costs. Hence, the Board determined that a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs (SERC) was not necessary and that the rule will not require ratification by the Legislature. No person or interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact at that time.

5BER19-2        Exposed Citrus Nursery Stock Movement  
SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Section 581.1843(2), Florida Statutes, requires all citrus nursery stock to be produced in a protective structure approved by the Department. Rule Chapter 5B-62, Florida Administrative Code, adopts the Department's standards for those structures. Hurricane Dorian has created emergency conditions jeopardizing the movement of citrus nursery stock in structures that have been compromised and impacted industries ability to move nursery stock.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The provisions of this rule are narrowly tailored to assist in the movement of exposed citrus nursery stock during the emergency conditions created by Hurricane Dorian. Due to the emergency conditions, citrus nurseries may be forced to destroy valuable nursery stock that are needed by the industry to help replace trees damaged by the hurricane without the allowances provided by this emergency rule. The Department will immediately begin formal rulemaking to adopt the provisions of the emergency rule.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule allows for exposed citrus nursery stock to be moved into structures away from clean material and be sold to growers.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

#### 5BER19-2 – Exposed Citrus Nursery Stock

(1) Any citrus nursery stock within a greenhouse that was damaged due to the impact of Hurricane Dorian or otherwise exposed shall be moved from the certified greenhouse into a non-certified structure within the permitted nursery or voluntarily destroyed by the nursery by December 31, 2019. All citrus nursery stock moved into a non-certified structure must be tracked by the nursery and the tracking records shall be made available to the Department upon request.

(2) Any citrus nursery stock moved into a non-certified structure within the permitted nursery will be exempt from

compliance with Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C., until August 30, 2020, at which time full compliance will be required.

(3) All citrus nursery stock sold or provided to citrus growers shall be accompanied by a written notice that the citrus nursery stock may have been exposed to citrus diseases due to Hurricane Dorian.

(4) Repaired certified citrus nursery greenhouses that were damaged due to Hurricane Dorian shall be cleaned and sanitized as required by Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C. Upon inspection and approval by the Department, the citrus nursery may start new citrus nursery stock plantings within the greenhouse that will be subject to the full requirements of Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C.

(5) Scion houses that were compromised due to the hurricane are encouraged to be restarted from Foundation material as soon as possible. However, recognizing the shortage that destroying this material could cause, the Division will require testing quarterly and continuous inspection every 30 days of these trees for 1 year beginning September 30, 2019. SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Due to effects on the supply and distribution of fuel caused by Hurricane Dorian, extreme and unusual circumstances exist that will prevent the distribution of an adequate fuel supply to consumers throughout the state. Fuel is no longer being delivered to certain ports due to the approaching storm, and supplies are expected to remain affected even after the storm has passed. Waiving certain volatility standards statewide will allow for adequate and rapid distribution of available fuel, helping to stabilize the fuel market, thus protecting the welfare of Florida consumers.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: This emergency rule was initiated at the request of fuel suppliers to more adequately meet the fuel needs of Florida consumers as a result of projected fuel shortages created by Hurricane Dorian, which has disrupted the waterborne import of fuels from the affected areas of Florida's east coast. This emergency rule will help alleviate

present distribution difficulties and shortages of motor fuel resulting from this event to provide relief to Florida.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule allows for the retail distribution and sale of gasoline of a different volatility class than adopted in ASTM International designation D4814-13a, as adopted in Rule 5J-21.001, F.A.C., for the period beginning August 30, 2019, through September 15, 2019, statewide. The specific standards affected are below.

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: As a result of the effects on the supply and processing of Grade “A” milk caused by Hurricane Dorian, extreme and unusual circumstances exist that are expected to hinder the marketability and availability of Grade "A" milk post Hurricane Dorian to consumers throughout the State. Additionally, circumstances have arisen regarding the availability of trucks and trailers and have created an issue removing milk from dairy farms across the State and with the storage of raw milk in anticipation of normal demand post Hurricane Dorian. Following the adoption of this emergency rule, waiving certain cleaning frequency requirements for milk tankers and equipment statewide will allow for adequate and rapid distribution and processing of Grade “A” milk, helping increase production of Grade “A” milk to consumers and assisting the dairy industry through the hardship created by this storm. It is anticipated that stores will have a very limited

supply of Grade “A” products post Hurricane Dorian and dairy farms will be forced to dump milk if the processing of these products cannot be expedited by this emergency rule. The exclusion shall be for Section 12p as specified in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance adopted in Rule 5K-10.001.

The Grade “A” milk plants have taken in milk with the intent to process after the storm has passed, due to the severity of this storm, the shutdown time may be extended leaving them with milk that is exceeding the 72-hour holding time requirement in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance for cleaning storage silos. This milk would have to be disposed of to create room for new milk produced under current regulations. Additionally, it is still uncertain if milk will be able to make it to the plants after the storm in time to meet the demand that will soon follow. Allowing them to process on hand inventory will create an immediate supply ready to be distributed as needed and create tank space to receive more milk from the farms. No dairy farm will be able to stop milking lactating cows due to the storm. Lactating dairy cows have to be milked or will suffer serious health implications, such as mastitis, that will cause them to be removed from the milking herd. This will create massive issues with herd health and milk supply in the future, well beyond the affects from Hurricane Dorian. Extending the wash times on tankers will decrease the turn-around time at plants so hauling companies can immediately return to pick more milk up from the farm and get it to where it is needed. This emergency rule will also open receiving bays which can act as wash bays, to unload more milk for processing. Additionally, the flexibility provided by relief to these regulations will allow Grade “A” plants to process and bottle potable water to aid in disaster relief post Hurricane Dorian.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: This emergency rule was initiated at the request of milk plants to more adequately meet the anticipated needs of Florida consumers as a result of anticipated milk demand created by Hurricane Dorian and the loss of production caused by the shutdown of plants in the State. The storm has disrupted the production and processing of milk in this state. This emergency rule will help alleviate distribution difficulties and shortages of milk anticipated from this event to provide relief to Florida.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule allows for the increased storage time of raw milk at Grade “A” plants by extending the time required between cleanings so long as specific requirements are met. Under Section 12p in the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance, it states that storage tanks shall be cleaned once a day or not to exceed seventy-two (72) hours. This increases that time to ninety-six (96) to allow processing of Grade “A” milk directly after the storm passes. Additionally, Appendix B, VI. Milk Tank Truck Permitting and Inspection states that under continuous use, milk tank trucks can pick up

multiple loads within a 24-hour period, provided the milk tank truck is washed after each day's use. The provisions of this emergency rule would allow an additional 6 hours to account for logistical issues with transport; shortage of water for washes; and fuel availability issues. This should reduce or eliminate the need to dump milk for tankers that struggle to meet that these requirements. Both of these are changes to the adopted requirements of the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance (PMO), 2005 Revision adopted in Rule 5K-10.001, F.A.C. would be in effect for the period beginning August 30, 2019, through September 6, 2019. The specific standards affected are below.

5KER19-1 - Cleaning and Sanitizing of Containers and Equipment

(1) Raw milk for pasteurization can be stored for up to 96 hours as long as the storage vessel is an approved raw milk silo in a permitted FDACS Grade "A" milk plant, has 7-day temperature recording charts or electronic records that comply with Appendix H., IV. and V. of the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance (PMO) and maintains constant temperature not to exceed 45 °F. The milk received must comply with all parts of the PMO with the exception as noted above. This shall be allowed for the time period of August 30, 2019, through September 6, 2019, and that product is to be used for pasteurization as a Grade "A" product.

(2) Bulk milk tankers used for the transportation of Grade "A" raw milk are allowed to pick up multiple loads continuously within a thirty (30) hour period without a wash between loads unless the previous load was deemed violative for inhibitor. If the previous load was deemed violative for inhibitor, the tanker must go back through a full dairy wash at a permitted wash station before picking up additional milk. This shall be allowed from August 30, 2019, through September 6, 2019, and that product used for pasteurization as a Grade "A" product.
