(10) The speech-language pathologist shall directly observe the speech-language pathology assistant’s service as follows:

(a) During the first 12 months of continuous employment on at least one occasion, and if treatment is provided, a ~~minimum of one out of every five sessions~~ or a minimum of one session every 30 days two weeks per client or more frequently depending upon the individual client’s needs.

(b) Following the first 12 months of continuous employment on at least one occasion and, if treatment is provided, a minimum of one session every 60 days out of every fifteen sessions or more frequently depending upon the individual client’s needs.

(3) Assistants must be under the direct supervision of a licensee who has met all the requirements of Section 468.1185, F.S. Direct supervision requires the physical presence of the licensee in the same facility when the assistant is carrying out assigned responsibilities, unless acting pursuant to Board of Speech Language Pathology and Audiology approved protocols as established in rule 64B20-4.0045, in order for the licensee to be available for consultation and direction The supervising licensee shall make provisions for emergency situations including the designation of another licensee who has agreed to be available to provide direct supervision to the assistant when the supervising licensee is not available. In the event that a supervising licensee is not on the premises, the assistant may only perform duties not involving direct client contact unless acting pursuant to Board of Speech Language Pathology and Audiology approved protocols as established in rule 64B20-4.0045.

64B20-4.0045 Board Established and Approved Protocols for Speech-Language Pathology Assistants.

(1) The following are Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology established and approved protocols for consultation and supervision of speech-language pathology assistants prior to providing services in a location distant to the supervising licensee pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 468.1125(9), Part I, F.S., Rule Chapter 64B20-4.003 and Rule Chapter 64B20-4.004, F.A.C.:

(a) Competency of duties for which the assistant has been specifically trained and is authorized to perform under Chapter 468, Part I, F.S. and Rule Chapter 64B20, F.A.C. in the areas defined in Rule 64B20-4.003 (4).

(b) Once competency is achieved, Form DH5043-MQA entitled, “Written Protocol: Speech Language Pathology Agreement Collaborative Practice Agreement,” must be signed by supervising licensee and speech language pathology assistant affirming the mutual agreement between the licensee and the assistant are acting under established and approved Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology protocols.

(c) The written protocol Form DH5043-MQA signed by the licensed Speech Language Pathologist (SLP) and the Speech Language Pathology Assistant (SLPA) shall minimally include the following:

1. General Information
2. Description of Duties of the SLPA
3. Description of Duties of the SLP
4. Certification
5. Designated Licensee

(d) Supervising licensee shall require the availability of the supervising speech language pathologist for consultation with and direction of the supervised assistant must be available via synchronous telecommunication.

(2) The licensed supervising speech-language pathologist will maintain full ethical and legal responsibility for all actions of the assistant when services are provided.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING ISLAMORADA, VILLAGE OF ISLANDS

ORDINANCE NO. 19-19

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (“Department”) hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to subsection 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Islamorada, Village of Islands, Florida (“Village”) by Ordinance No. 19-19 (“Ordinance”).

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The Village is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the Village on September 19, 2019, and rendered to the Department on October 24, 2019.

3. The Ordinance amends Chapter 30, Article V of the Village Code to create Section 30-818 for the purpose of establishing standards for the proper use of fertilizer and to amend Section 30-812 to provide relevant definitions. The new fertilization standards include a requirement for the training of commercial and institutional fertilizer applicators and licensing procedures. The Ordinance also establishes allowable fertilizer application rates and methods, fertilizer-free zones, low maintenance zones, and exemptions.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.

5. “Land development regulations” include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations amended by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Village’s Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically, Policy 1-1.2.1 and Policy 1-4.2.1.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent and in compliance with the principles for guiding development for that area. See § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Village are set forth in subsection 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Village as a whole, and specifically furthers the following principles:

- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (b) Protecting shoreline and marine resources, including mangroves, coral reef formations, seagrass beds, wetlands, fish and wildlife, and their habitat
- (c) Limiting the adverse impacts of development on the quality of water throughout the Florida Keys.
- (d) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintaining the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Ordinance No. 19-19 is consistent with the Village’s Comprehensive Plan and Principles for Guiding Development for the Village and is hereby APPROVED.

This Final Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below. DONE AND ORDERED in Tallahassee, Florida.
