PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Article VII, section 6(f)(1), of the Florida Constitution, authorized the Legislature to provide ad valorem tax relief on homestead property to the surviving spouse of a veteran who died from service-connected causes while on active duty as a member of the United States Armed Forces. When enacted by the Legislature, section 196.081(4), Florida Statutes, provided such relief for veterans who were permanent Florida residents on January 1 of the year of the veteran's death. The Florida Second District Court of Appeal, in Dep't of Revenue v. Bell, 290 So.3d 1060 (Fla. 2d DCA Feb. 19, 2020), reviewed the statutory requirement for the veteran to be a Florida resident and held that the provision limited and

narrowed the class of property owners eligible for the ad valorem tax exemption, and thus the provision is invalid and unenforceable. The purpose of the amendments to paragraph (4)(c) of Rule 12D-7.004, F.A.C., is to remove the Florida residency requirement for this exemption from the rule. When in effect, the amended rule will reflect the findings of the court regarding this ad valorem tax exemption.

4. Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(1)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(1)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]:

Under current requirements, program operators may offer Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP) foods only in elementary schools. Due to continuing COVID-19, conditions, many program schools are not offering in-person instruction in their school facilities, but instead providing instruction remotely or in a hybrid in-person and remote manner. As a result, many program operators are not able to conduct the FFVP as specified in program regulations. Therefore, FDACS requests the program requirements under Section 19 of the National School Lunch Act (NSLA) [42 U.S.C. 1769a] be waived to allow approved SFAs to offer FFVP foods at alternates sites (without the nutrition education component) if the nutrition programs for the approved FFVP school are being offered in a noncongregate setting to accommodate hybrid, remote or other non-traditional learning methods. FDACS also requests that the regulations be waived to allow approved FFVP schools that are closed due to COVID-19 conditions to also offer FFVP foods at alternate sites, such as curbside or grab-n-go distributions (without the nutrition education component).

SFAs will only provide FFVP foods to students enrolled in approved FFVP elementary schools using their roster, mobile POS, or other student information system.
