PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The Board proposes an amendment to clarify the definitions.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendment clarifies the rule language for definitions.

**SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED
 REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE
 RATIFICATION:**

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: During discussion of the economic impact of this rule at its Board meeting, the Board concluded that this rule change will not have any impact on licensees and their businesses or the businesses that employ them. The rule will not increase any fees, business costs, personnel costs, will not decrease profit opportunities, and will not require any specialized knowledge to comply. This change will not increase any direct or indirect regulatory costs. Hence, the Board determined that a Statement of Estimated Regulatory Costs (SERC) was not necessary and that the rule will not require ratification by the Legislature. No person or interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact at that time.

Any person who wishes to provide information regarding a statement of estimated regulatory costs, or provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative must do so in writing within 21 days of this notice.

61H1-20.001 Definitions.

(1) “Certified public accountant,” or “CPA,” shall be deemed and construed to mean a person, who holds an active, inactive, delinquent, or temporary license issued under Chapter 473, F.S., or who is practicing public accounting in this state pursuant to the practice privilege granted in Section 473.3141, F.S.

(2) through (7) No Change.

(8) ~~An Except as to a certified public accountant employed by a Florida firm,~~ “office” shall be deemed and construed to mean a place in which public accounting is conducted or any place for which the physical address is identified in advertising. ~~For As to a certified public accountant employed by a Florida firm,~~ “office” shall also mean the licensee’s his/her designated address of record.

(9) “Proof of CPE completion” from a continuing professional education CPE provider shall be defined as the document identifying the licensee has completed a course. To be accepted by the Board, the document must contain the following elements: name of course taken, licensee name, the date the course was completed, number of hours, credit type or category, sponsor name, and signature of the CPE sponsor. Proof of CPE completion for a Florida ethics course, in addition to the aforementioned elements, must include the DBPR course approval number. For courses completed at accredited institutions of higher learning and credited for CPE, a transcript will be considered proof of CPE completion. Proof of CPE completion for instructor credit will include an Instructor CPE Credit Reporting Form (DBPR CPA 13, effective _____), which is incorporated by reference in Rule 61-35.003, F.A.C.

53ER22-29: MONOPOLY™ DOUBLER BONUS
 PLAY PROMOTION

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: This emergency rule sets forth the provisions for the MONOPOLY™ DOUBLER BONUS PLAY PROMOTION.

THE FULL TEXT OF THIS EMERGENCY IS:

53ER22-29 Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play Promotion.

(1) Beginning July 4, 2022 and ending July 31, 2022 (“Promotion Period”), the Florida Lottery will conduct the Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play Promotion (“Promotion”). Players who purchase Game Number 1509, \$1 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1510, \$2 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1511, \$5 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1512, \$10 Monopoly™ Doublor; and Game Number 1513, \$20 Monopoly™ Doublor Scratch-Off tickets during the Promotion Period can earn entries into a Promotion Drawing for a chance to win a cash prize of \$1,000; \$5,000; or \$25,000. Only non-winning Game Number 1509, \$1 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1510, \$2 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1511, \$5 Monopoly™ Doublor; Game Number 1512, \$10 Monopoly™ Doublor; and Game Number 1513, \$20 Monopoly™ Doublor Scratch-Off tickets [collectively “Eligible” ticket(s)] may be entered into a Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play promotional drawing. Winning tickets cannot be

entered into any Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play promotional drawing.

(2) How to Enter.

(a) To enter an Eligible ticket into a Promotion Drawing, a player may use the Florida Lottery's website at flalottery.com or use the Florida Lottery's Mobile Convenience App (“App”).

1. Website. On the home page of the Florida Lottery's website, players are to click on the PROMOTIONS tab, select the Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play Promotion and follow the directions. Players will be prompted to log-in or register. Players will manually enter the 24-digit ticket number on the ticket entry page to collect entries as described in subsection (3), below.

2. App. On the App, players navigate to the Promotions section of the app, select the Monopoly™ Doublor Bonus Play Promotion, and follow the directions. A Promotions button is located on the main menu and on the bottom navigation bar. Players will be prompted to log-in or register if the app does not recognize them as already logged into the Promotions section. Players may scan the barcode on the bottom of a ticket or may manually enter the 24-digit ticket number on the ticket entry page to collect entries as described in subsection (3), below.

3. Deleted Accounts. If a player deletes his/her account, whether through the App or on the Florida Lottery’s website, all account data, including ticket entries, associated with the email address used to register his/her account will also be deleted. Any entries earned, as described in subsection (3), below, will not be entered into a drawing. A player’s account cannot be reactivated using the email associated with the deactivated account. Should a player establish a new account utilizing a different email address, account data, including ticket entries, cannot be transferred to the newly established account. Tickets entered under the prior account cannot be re-entered utilizing the newly created account.

4. Regardless of whether a player chooses to participate in the Promotion by using the web browser or the App, the following provisions shall apply:

a. the player must use the same account login information to enter tickets;

b. the player will only be required to register one time; and

c. the player's entry history will be cumulative among the entry platforms.

(b) Any attempt by a player to use more than one account by using multiple or different email addresses, identities, registrations, logins, or any other methods will subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification. In the event a player wins a prize, the name a player uses to register must match the name shown on his/her identification used to make a claim, except for a person who has made a legal name change. A person who has made a legal name change must provide a copy of a marriage certificate/judgment/court order,

as applicable, as proof of a differing name. Fictitious names and business names will not be accepted and shall subject the player and any associated entries to disqualification.

(c) The odds of winning depend on the number of entries in a drawing. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and will be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

(d) Lottery tickets should not be mailed to the Lottery for entry into a drawing. Lottery tickets received in the mail by the Florida Lottery for entry into the Promotion will not be entered into a drawing and will not be returned.

(3) How to Earn Entries into the Promotion.

(a) To earn entries into a Promotion Drawing, a player may enter ticket numbers by scanning the barcode on the bottom of an Eligible ticket using his or her mobile device or by manually entering the 24-digit ticket number on the website or the App. A player may earn multiple entries during an entry period; however, a player can only win one promotion prize per entry. A player may enter a maximum of 200 tickets per day. Each ticket number can only be entered one time and cannot be entered again for either drawing. Training tickets will not be accepted, and tickets with invalid ticket numbers will be disqualified. The hours for ticket entry are between 6:00 a.m. ET and 12:00 midnight ET seven days a week during the Promotion Period.

(b) Number of Entries Received. For each Eligible ticket, a player will receive the number of entries as set forth in the table below:

(c) Promo Codes. Various promo codes providing additional entries will be available during the Promotion Period via GSTV L-Bar (gas station TV), In-Store L-Bars, High Impact Digital Units, CTV (Connected TV), social media platforms, and emails to players. Each Promo code earns a player five (5) additional entries into a drawing. An Eligible ticket must be entered to enable the promo code feature, and the ticket number and the promo code must be entered at the same time. Each promo code is only valid for the corresponding entry period for which it is designated and can only be entered one

time. However, more than one different promo code may be entered during the corresponding entry period for which it is designated, each with a different ticket number. Promo codes available for Entry Period 1 cannot be used, and will not be valid, for Entry Period 2. Promo codes designated for Entry Period 2 cannot be used, and will not be valid, for Entry Period 1.

(4) Drawings and Number of Prizes. The Florida Lottery will conduct two drawings in the Promotion to select prizewinners. Prizewinners for the first drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received during the first drawing entry period and before midnight (ET) on July 17, 2022. Prizewinners for the second drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received during the second drawing entry period and before midnight (ET) on July 31, 2022. Entries for the first drawing entry period are not carried over into the second drawing entry period; tickets shall be drawn only from the Eligible ticket entries submitted and received during each drawing entry period. Prizewinners will be randomly selected using a certified random number generation process. The drawing shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm. The drawing dates, entry periods, and winner announcement dates are as follows:

(a) The prizewinners in a Promotion Drawing will be announced and posted on flalottery.com on the “WINNERS ANNOUNCED” dates, set forth in the table above, or as soon thereafter as possible.

(b) In each Promotion Drawing, a total of 122 valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery. Prizes will be awarded in the quantities set forth in the table in subsection (5), below, and awarded to players in the order in which they were drawn during each drawing. Remaining entries will be alternates and used in the order in which they were drawn and in the order of need to select alternate top, second, and third prizewinners in the event a top, second, or third prizewinner cannot be notified or fails to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7), below, or in the event an entry is disqualified. A player can only win one prize per draw entry.

(5) The prizes, prize amounts, and number of prizewinners are listed in the table, below:

(6) Prizewinner Notification. The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner’s registration data within one business day after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery’s website. The Florida Lottery deems the prizewinner’s registration data as the prizewinner’s official contact information. Issuing an email or leaving a telephone message on voicemail, if available, shall constitute notification. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if attempts to reach the prizewinner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within ten calendar days of the date the prizewinners are posted on the Lottery’s website, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsection (4), above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within ten calendar days of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will select the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternates due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a prizewinner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (7), below. The Florida Lottery is not responsible or liable for system failures of any sort or type, including, but not exclusively, computer failures, email service failures, telephone failures. If a prize cannot be awarded for any reason, the prize will not be awarded.

(7) How to Claim a Prize.

(a) To claim a prize won in a Promotion drawing, a prizewinner must submit to the Florida Lottery a completed Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2, Revised 3/21, or Spanish Winner Claim Form DOL-173-2S, Revised 3/21, and a copy of

acceptable identification as set forth in the Florida Lottery’s rule governing payment of prizes.

(b) A copy of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

(c) The required documents must be received by the Florida Lottery no later than ten calendar days after the Florida Lottery has first notified the prizewinner by telephone (notification by telephone is deemed complete by leaving a voicemail message, if available) or email (issuing an email constitutes notification). If the Florida Lottery does not receive the required documents from a prizewinner by the tenth calendar day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner as described in subsection (4), above. The same timeframe for a prizewinner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner.

(8) Award of Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery’s timely receipt of a prizewinner’s required documentation, the Florida Lottery will award the applicable prize for that prizewinner, subject to Federal tax withholding and analysis for State-Owed Debt and Child Support Debt.

(9) Analysis for State-Owed Debt and Child Support Debt. Prior to the award of all cash prizes, a prizewinner will be analyzed for Florida state-owed debt and child support debt. If more than one prize is awarded to the prizewinner, a separate analysis shall occur prior to payment of each prize. If the prizewinner is identified as owing outstanding debt to any state agency or owes child support collected through a court, the debt will be offset in accordance with section 24.115, F.S. If the debt is an amount less than the amount of the cash prize, the balance of the prize, less applicable income tax withholding on the full prize amount, and after the debt is offset shall be awarded. If the debt is an amount greater than any cash prize, the entire prize amount, after applicable income tax withholding on the full prize amount, will be applied to the outstanding debt.

(10) A player can only win one prize per entry.

(11) A prizewinner in this Promotion is not required to submit the Eligible ticket he or she entered to claim a prize.

(12) Taxes.

(a) Except as specifically defined herein, all Federal, state, and/or local taxes and/or other costs and fees on all prizes will be the responsibility of the prizewinner.

(b) For \$25,000 cash prizes won in the Promotion drawings, and pursuant to applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Service code, Federal income taxes will be withheld at a rate of twenty-four percent (24%) for a U. S. citizen or legal U. S. resident and at a rate of thirty percent (30%) for nonresident prizewinner/s. Regardless of prize amount, for all prizes won in a Promotion drawing, Federal income taxes will

be withheld at a rate of thirty percent (30%) for nonresident prizewinners. The reporting and subsequent payment of any additional Federal, state, and/or local taxes and any other fees and costs shall be the responsibility of the prizewinner.

(13) Other Restrictions and Provisions.

(a) A prizewinner must be at least 18 years of age.

(b) All prizes are subject to the provisions of chapter 24, F.S., and rules promulgated thereunder. Prizes will be paid in accordance with the Florida Lottery's rule governing payment of prizes. Copies of the current prize payment rule can be obtained from the Florida Lottery, Office of the General Counsel, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

(c) Persons prohibited by section 24.116, F.S., from purchasing a Florida Lottery ticket are not eligible to enter this Promotion.

(d) By entering the Monopoly™ Doubler Bonus Play Promotion, a player gives his or her permission for the Florida Lottery to photograph and/or videotape and record the prizewinner with or without prior notification and to use the name, photograph, videotape, and/or recording of the prizewinner for advertising or publicity purposes without additional compensation.

53ER22-30 Retailer Compensation

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: The rule sets forth the requirements for compensation of Florida Lottery retailers.
THE PERSON TO BE CONTACTED REGARDING THE EMERGENCY RULE IS: Minerva Simpson, Attorney, Department of the Lottery, 250 Marriott Drive, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-4011.

THE FULL TEXT OF THIS EMERGENCY RULE:

53ER22-30 Retailer Compensation.

(1) Sales Commission. Retailers shall be paid a sales commission of 5.75 percent on the purchase price of each Scratch-Off game (also known as an instant game) and each online terminal game ticket sold by them or issued as a prize or free ticket. The number of Scratch-Off tickets sold or issued as prizes will be determined by full or partial book settlements.

(2) Cashing Commissions. Cashing Commissions are eliminated.

(3) Sales commissions, including bonus commissions, paid to retailers for Scratch-Off ticket sales shall be subject to recoupment by the Florida Lottery if settled tickets are subsequently returned to the Lottery.

(4) The Lottery is authorized to conduct retailer incentive promotions in which additional compensation is provided to retailers as bonus commissions or promotional prizes.

(5) Sales commissions, as well as bonus commissions and promotional prizes awarded in a retailer promotion, will be considered compensation to a retailer and will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service by the Florida Lottery.

(6) No retailer or employee of a retailer shall request or accept compensation for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the retailer's contract, other than the compensation stated in these rules. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, the redemption of winning tickets. No charge or fee shall be imposed by a retailer on a player for paying a winning ticket by cash or check. Additionally, no charge or fee shall be imposed by a retailer on a player for payment of a prize by money order when that is the sole method of payment made available by the retailer.

(7) The effective date of this emergency rule is July 1, 2022.

(8) This emergency rule replaces Emergency Rule 53ER19-27, F.A.C. Rulemaking Authority 24.105(9)(i), 24.109(1) FS. Law Implemented 24.105(9)(i) FS. History—New 7-1-2022, Replaces 53ER19-27.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: This emergency rule describes Game Number 1509, "\$1 MONOPOLYTM DOUBLER," for which the Department of the Lottery will start selling tickets on a date to be determined by the Secretary of the Department. The rule sets forth the specifics of the game; determination of prizewinners; estimated odds of winning, value and number of prizes in the game.

THE FULL TEXT OF THIS EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER22-31 Game Number 1509, \$1 MONOPOLY™ DOUBLER.

(1) Name of Game. Game Number 1509, \$1 MONOPOLY DOUBLER.

(2) Game Number 1509, \$1 MONOPOLY DOUBLER is a Scratch-Off lottery game (also known as an instant lottery game).

(3) Price. \$1 MONOPOLY DOUBLER lottery tickets sell for \$1.00 per ticket.

(4) \$1 MONOPOLY DOUBLER lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning \$1 MONOPOLY DOUBLER lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER21-34, Payment of Prizes, F.A.C.

(5) The play symbols and play symbol captions that may appear in the YOUR NUMBERS play area are:



(6) The play symbols and play symbol captions that may appear in the WINNING NUMBER play area are:



(7) The play symbols and play symbol captions that may appear in the DOUBLER BOX play area are:



(8) The prize symbols and prize symbol captions that may appear in the YOUR NUMBERS play area are:





(9) The legends are:

WINNING NUMBER YOUR NUMBERS DOUBLER

(10) Determination of Prizewinners.

(a) A ticket having a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the YOUR NUMBERS play area that matches a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the WINNING NUMBER play area shall entitle the prizewinner to the corresponding prize shown for that symbol.

A ticket having a  symbol and corresponding symbol

caption in the YOUR NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to double the corresponding prize shown. A ticket having a  symbol and corresponding symbol caption in the YOUR NUMBERS play area shall entitle the prizewinner to all five (5) prizes shown.

(b) DOUBLER BOX. A ticket having a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the DOUBLER BOX play area that matches the play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the WINNING NUMBER play area shall entitle the prizewinner to double any prize won in the YOUR NUMBERS play area.

(c) A player may win up to five (5) times on a ticket.

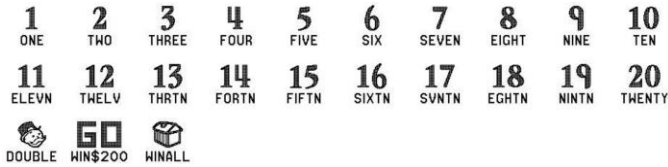

RULE TITLE: CMTL Fines, Suspension, and Revocation

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC, HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Pursuant to Chapter 2021-37, § 15, Laws of Florida, the Department is not required to make findings of an immediate danger to the public, health, safety, or welfare.

REASONS FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE USED IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Department of Health is directed by Chapter 2021-37, § 15, Laws of Florida, to adopt emergency rules to implement sections 381.986 and 381.988, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: Emergency rule 64ER22-5 repeals and replaces emergency rule 64ER20-5, "Suspension and Revocation of CMTL Certification." This emergency rule implements sections 381.986 and 381.988, Florida Statutes, by establishing guidelines related to fines, suspension, and revocation imposed upon a certified marijuana testing laboratory (CMTL) for violations of rule and statute. The effect is to establish comprehensive and consistent disciplinary penalties related to CMTLs.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

64ER22-5 CMTL Fines, Suspension, and Revocation.

(1) Pursuant to s. 381.988, F.S., the department provides within this rule disciplinary guidelines that will be imposed upon CMTLs. The purpose of these disciplinary guidelines is to outline penalties for violations; to deter future violations; and to offer opportunities for correction, when appropriate.

(2) Once certified by the department, a CMTL must at all times maintain compliance with the requirements set forth in s. 381.986, F.S., s. 381.988, F.S., CMTL rules, and the representations made in the CMTL's application for certification. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action in accordance this rule.

(3) The department may suspend or revoke a CMTL's certification, or refuse to renew a CMTL's certification, if the department finds that the CMTL committed a violation of s. 381.986, F.S., s. 381.988, F.S., or department rules, or that the CMTL failed to maintain compliance with the representations made in its initial application or renewal application. For any such violation, the department may revoke or suspend a CMTL's certification for a period of time based on the seriousness of the violation. The department will use the factors set forth in s. 381.988(8)(a)-(d), F.S., to determine whether to

suspend or revoke a CMTL license. In determining the severity of the violation, the department will consider the following:

- (a) Frequency or number of occurrences;
- (b) Potential for rehabilitation;
- (c) Impact on the department;
- (d) Impact on MMTCs;
- (e) Potential and/or actual harm to a qualified patient or a member of the public;
- (f) Willfulness and deliberateness of the violation;
- (g) Severity of noncompliance;
- (h) Length of noncompliance; and
- (i) Any good faith effort to prevent a violation.

(4) The department will provide a CMTL notice of the violation. A CMTL must provide a proposed corrective action plan to the department within seven calendar days of receipt of a notice of violation. The department may extend the timeframe for submittal of a corrective action plan for good cause shown. Upon review of the corrective action plan by the department, the CMTL may be required to take specific additional actions to cure the violation. The CMTL must comply with and perform all such additional curative actions as directed by the department. A CMTL is subject to discipline notwithstanding the implementation of a corrective action plan.

(5) A CMTL that loses or has its required accreditation suspended must report the loss or suspension within 24 hours of its occurrence to the department via email to OMMUlabs@flhealth.gov.

(a) Within seven calendar days of receiving notice that its required accreditation has been lost or suspended, a CMTL must provide the following to the department:

1. Documentation identifying the cause of the suspension or loss of accreditation; and
2. Documentation evidencing that notification of the loss or suspension has been provided to each MMTC for which the CMTL conducts testing.

(b) A CMTL is prohibited from testing marijuana product or providing results to an MMTC during the time that its accreditation is lost or suspended.

(c) A CMTL must reestablish accreditation within 180 days of the effective date of the loss or suspension of accreditation. If a CMTL fails to reestablish its accreditation within 180 days of the loss or suspension, the CMTL's certification will be subject to revocation.

(6) The department may, in addition to or in lieu of suspension or revocation, impose a fine of up to \$10,000 per violation, as set forth in the schedule provided in subsection (11). The schedule of fines is meant to serve as a guideline. The maximum fines listed in the schedule reflect the maximum fines that the department may impose per violation. Where there are multiple incidents resulting in more than one violation of the same provision, the department may impose a fine, up to the

maximum, for each violation. For violations that are ongoing and continuous in nature, each day a violation continues constitutes a distinct violation.

(7) The department will use the factors set forth in s. 381.988(8)(a)-(d), F.S., to determine what discipline will be imposed. The department will also consider the following in determining the amount of the fine to be imposed:

- (a) Frequency or number of occurrences;
- (b) Potential for rehabilitation;
- (c) Impact on the department;
- (d) Impact on the MMTCs;
- (e) Potential and/or actual harm to a qualified patient or a member of the public;
- (f) Willfulness and deliberateness of the violation;
- (g) Severity of noncompliance;
- (h) Length of noncompliance;
- (i) Any good faith effort to prevent a violation; and
- (j) Any corrective action taken by the CMTL related to the current violation or prior violations.

(8) The issuance of a suspension under this part does not relieve the CMTL of the obligation to timely comply with all license renewal requirements. A license suspension does not toll the CMTL's license renewal deadline.

(9) No CMTL whose license has been revoked may apply for licensure under section 381.988, F.S., and chapter 64-4, F.A.C., for at least five years from the date of such revocation. However, if a CMTL's violation of statute or rule is a substantial contributing factor to the death of a patient, the CMTL will be permanently barred from applying for licensure.

(10) If a CMTL's license is suspended or revoked, no part of any application fee or renewal fee will be returned.

(11) For the purposes of the following schedule of fines, the descriptions of the violations are abbreviated, and the full statute or rule may be found by referring to the statutory or rule provision cited.

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC, HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: Pursuant to Chapter 2021-37, § 15, Laws of Florida, the Department is not required to make findings of an immediate danger to the public, health, safety, or welfare.

REASONS FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE USED IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Department of Health is directed by Chapter 2021-37, § 15, Laws of Florida, to adopt emergency rules to implement sections 381.986 and 381.988, Florida Statutes.

SUMMARY OF THE RULE: This emergency rule establishes the requirements and process for the renewal of CMTL certifications and the renewal application form incorporated therein.

64ER22-6 Renewal Application Requirements for CMTLs.

(1) Each CMTL seeking renewal of its certification for a Testing Facility must submit a renewal application to the

department in compliance with Form DH8040-OMMU-02/2022, “Certified Marijuana Testing Laboratory Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms,” herein incorporated by reference and available at <https://knowthefactsmmj.com/rules-and-regulations/>. A CMTL must also submit a non-refundable renewal fee of \$78,000 by cashier’s check made payable to the “Florida Department of Health.”

(2) Renewal certification will be on a per-Testing Facility basis. A separate renewal application and renewal fee must be submitted for each Testing Facility.

(3) The following are grounds for denial of a renewal application:

- (a) Failure to submit the \$78,000 renewal fee;
- (b) Failure to provide the information and documentation required by the “Certified Marijuana Testing Laboratory Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms;”
- (c) Failure to timely correct errors or omissions in the renewal application or supply other required renewal application information to the department upon request;
- (d) Failure to meet the requirements of section 381.988, F.S., or any rules adopted thereunder; and
- (e) Any deficiencies or violations that are grounds for revocation, suspension, or denial of certification pursuant to sections 381.986 or 381.988, F.S., or department rules.

(4) The renewal application must be received by the department at least 90 days, but not more than 120 days, before the end of the effective certification period. The effective certification period is a two-year period measured from the date the CMTL certification was initially issued; after the initial effective certification period, the two-year period is measured from the effective date of CMTL certification renewal as indicated on the renewal certificate.

(5) A CMTL’s renewal application, renewal fee, and supporting documentation must be delivered to the department’s Agency Clerk, at the address provided in the “Certified Marijuana Testing Laboratory Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms,” no later than 5:00 p.m. EST on the deadline established in subsection (4). If the deadline falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, then the deadline shall roll to the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.

(6) Renewal applications that are not received by the department’s Agency Clerk, at the address provided in the “Certified Marijuana Testing Laboratory Renewal Application Instructions, Requirements, and Forms” on or before the date and time set forth in this rule will not be considered.

(7) Notwithstanding the foregoing, a CMTL with an effective certification period that ends on or before July 31, 2022, shall have sixty days from the effective date of this rule

to submit the CMTL’s renewal application, renewal fee, and supporting documentation to the department.

Under Program statute and regulations, State agencies and local operators are required to conduct monitoring of the Child Nutrition Programs. As a result of FDACS' state-mandated travel restriction being lifted, the department is transitioning back to normal operations. FDACS intends to complete the program monitoring requirements, however, due to current staffing shortages and an increase in COVID-related cases in the state, FDACS is requesting the option to conduct desk reviews when the state agency is unable to physically be on site and waive the requirement to review every sponsor at least once every three years.

There are 63 operators of the NSLP Seamless Summer Option (SSO), and 100 operators of the Summer Food Service Program currently in Florida.


