64D-3.051 Standards for the Appropriate Use of Facial Coverings for Infection Control.

(1) For the purposes of this rule, the words and phrases below are defined as follows:

(a) “Common area” refers to areas in a health care setting where patients are not treated, diagnosed, or examined.

(b) “Employee” refers to any person under employment or contract of a health care setting, including health care

practitioners, administrative staff, maintenance staff, aides, contractors, students, and volunteers.

(c) “Health care setting” refers to any place where health care practitioners and/or health care providers practice their profession or provide services.

(d) “Patient” refers to a person receiving services from a health care practitioner or health care provider.

(e) “Sterile areas” refers to locations where surgery is conducted or where procedures that require aseptic techniques are performed.

(f) “Sterile procedure” refers to aseptic procedures with the goal of minimizing the risk of microbial contamination to reduce the rate of invasive or surgical site infection.

(g) “Visitor” refers to any person in a health care setting who is not an employee or patient of the health care setting.

(2) Health care practitioners and health care providers may choose to require a patient to wear a facial covering only when the patient is in a common area of the health care setting and is exhibiting signs or symptoms of or has a diagnosed infectious disease that can be spread through droplet or airborne transmission.

(3) Health care practitioners and health care providers may choose to require a visitor to wear a facial covering only when the visitor is:

(a) Exhibiting signs or symptoms of or has a diagnosed infectious disease that can be spread through droplet or airborne transmission,

(b) In sterile areas of the health care setting or an area where sterile procedures are being performed,

(c) In an in-patient or clinical room with a patient who is exhibiting signs or symptoms of or has a diagnosed infectious disease that can be spread through droplet or airborne transmission, or

(d) Visiting a patient whose treating health care practitioner has diagnosed the patient with or confirmed a condition affecting the immune system in a manner which is known to increase risk of transmission of an infection from visitors without signs or symptoms of infection to a patient and whose treating practitioner has determined that the use of facial coverings is necessary for the patient’s safety.

(4) Opt-Out Requirements are as follows:

(a) Health care practitioners and health care providers who choose to require a facial covering for any patient pursuant to (2) must include in the policy a provision for the opting-out of wearing a facial covering. Such policy must be in accordance with the Florida Patient Bill of Rights and Responsibilities, section 381.026, F.S.

(b) Health care practitioners and health care providers who choose to require a facial covering for any visitor pursuant to (3) must include in the policy a provision for the opting-out of

wearing a facial covering if an alternative method of infection control or infectious disease prevention is available.

(5) Health care practitioners and health care providers must allow an employee to opt out of facial covering requirements unless an employee is:

(a) Conducting sterile procedures,

(b) Working in a sterile area,

(c) Working with a patient whose treating health care practitioner has diagnosed the patient with or confirmed a condition affecting the immune system in a manner which is known to increase risk of transmission of an infection from employees without signs or symptoms of infection to a patient and whose treating practitioner has determined that the use of facial coverings is necessary for the patient’s safety,

(d) With a patient on droplet or airborne isolation, or

(e) Engaging in non-clinical potentially hazardous activities that require facial coverings to prevent physical injury or harm in accordance with industry standards.

RULE NO.: 12D-9.025
 RULE TITLE: Procedures for Conducting a Hearing; Presentation of Evidence; Testimony of Witnesses

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed amendments to Rule 12D-9.025, F.A.C. (Procedures for Conducting a Hearing; Presentation of Evidence; Testimony of Witnesses), is to provide clarification that the current rule provides limitations for when the property appraiser seeks to present additional evidence that was unexpectedly discovered, and that would increase an assessment, regarding petitions to the value adjustment board requesting a decrease in the value of the property, and to provide the limitations regarding petitions requesting an increase in the value of the property. When in effect, the proposed amendments will differentiate between limitations for petitions requesting a decrease in the value of property and limitations for petitions requesting an increase in the value of property.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendments to Rule 12D-9.025, F.A.C. (Procedures for Conducting a Hearing; Presentation of Evidence; Testimony of Witnesses), specify the limitations currently provided in the rule apply to petitions to the value adjustment board requesting a decrease in the value of the property when the property appraiser seeks to present additional evidence that was unexpectedly discovered, and that would

increase an assessment, and includes limitations for when the petition requests an increase in the value of property. The proposed amendments differentiate between limitations on the property appraiser seeking to present such additional evidence regarding petitions to the value adjustment board requesting a decrease in the value of the property from petitions requesting an increase in the value of property.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

(c) In a petition to decrease the just value, the ~~The~~ following limitations shall apply if the property appraiser seeks to present additional evidence that was unexpectedly discovered and that would increase the assessment.

1. through 6. No change.

(d) In a petition to increase the just value, the property appraiser may provide an increased just value to the petitioner before the hearing or at the hearing. In such case, if the petitioner agrees with the property appraiser’s increased just value, the petitioner may settle or withdraw the petition. If the petitioner does not agree with the property appraiser’s increased just value, the hearing shall not be canceled on that ground. This provision applies only in petitions to increase the just value.

(7) through (9) No change.

(10) For purposes of reporting board action on decisions and on the notice of tax impact, the value as reflected on the initial roll shall mean the property appraiser’s determination as presented at the commencement of the hearing, or as reduced by the property appraiser during the hearing, or as increased by the property appraiser during the hearing as provided in subsection (6). but before a decision by the board or a recommended decision by the special magistrate. See Rule 12D-9.038, F.A.C.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed amendments to Rule 12D-16.002, F.A.C., is to incorporate, by reference amended forms related to the 2023 legislative

changes. When in effect, the forms will reflect amendments made by Chapter 2023-157, L.O.F.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendments to Rule 12D-16.002, F.A.C., amend two forms effective July 1, 2023.

Amend Form DR-465, Application for Catastrophic Event Tax Refund. Section 13, Chapter 2023-157, L.O.F., amends section 197.319, F.S., to add a field for the applicant to describe the catastrophic event and to clarify the instructions.

Amend Form DR-501, Original Application for Homestead and Related Tax Exemptions. Sections 6 and 8, Chapter 2023-157, L.O.F., amends section 196.081, F.S., to reflect clarifying changes in statute language and to implement the exemption for certain permanently and totally disabled veterans and surviving spouses of veterans.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed amendments to Rule 12D-16.002, F.A.C. (Index to Forms), is to incorporate by reference, changes to forms to provide additional statutory citations regarding the petitioner’s rights to file a lawsuit in circuit court to further contest a decision by a VAB and to provide consistency on all forms used by the VAB to issue its decisions.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendments to Rule 12D-16.002, F.A.C. (Index to Forms), incorporate, by reference, proposed amendments to Form DR-485C, Decision of the Value Adjustment Board - Catastrophic Event Tax Refund, which include statute citations regarding a petitioner’s right to file a lawsuit in circuit court to further contest the VAB decision. These citations are consistent on all VAB decision forms.

The proposed amendments to Form DR-485D, Decision of the Value Adjustment Board - Denial for Non-payment, the decision form used when the VAB denies a petition for non-payment of property taxes not made before they become delinquent, per s. 194.014, F.S., include an additional statute citation regarding a petitioner’s right to file a lawsuit in circuit court to further contest the VAB decision.

The proposed amendments to Forms DR-485M, Notice of Decision of the Value Adjustment Board; DR-485V, Decision of the Value Adjustment Board - Value Petition; and DR-485XC, Decision of the Value Adjustment Board Exemption, Classification, Assessment Difference Transfer, Change of Ownership or Control, or Qualifying Improvement Petition;

include an additional statute citation regarding a petitioner’s right to file a lawsuit in circuit court to further contest the VAB decision.

The proposed amendment to Form DR-486, Petition to the Value Adjustment Board, Request for Hearing, includes check boxes for a petitioner to identify whether the reason for the petition regarding real property value is to decrease the real property value or to increase the real property value. This proposed amendment differentiates between petitions to increase the value of real property and petitions to decrease the value of real property.

(1) Except as otherwise specified in this rule, mobile food dispensing vehicles, temporary commercial kitchens and theme park food carts shall comply with applicable requirements of Rules 61C-4.010 and 61C-4.023, F.A.C.

(2) Mobile food dispensing vehicles and temporary commercial kitchens shall meet the following additional requirements:

(a) Food serving openings shall not be larger than necessary for the particular operation conducted and shall be kept closed at all times except when food is actually being served.

(b) Waste containers shall be provided for the deposit of food scraps, food wrappings, cups, napkins and discarded single-service articles.

(c) Mobile food dispensing vehicles and temporary commercial kitchens shall operate from an approved commissary that meets all applicable requirements of this rule. The commissary must be provided with potable water and adequate facilities for disposal of liquid and solid waste. Mobile The mobile food dispensing vehicles unit and temporary commercial kitchens must report to the commissary to store or replenish supplies, clean utensils and equipment, or dispose of liquid and solid waste. Mobile food dispensing vehicles and temporary commercial kitchens must report to their commissary at least ~~one~~ daily when in operation.

(d) When a service area is provided at ~~a~~ the commissary for the cleaning and servicing of mobile food dispensing vehicles units or temporary commercial kitchens, the service area shall be physically separated from other food operations; shall be equipped to furnish potable water in accordance with applicable provisions of Chapters 62-550 and 62-555, F.A.C.; and shall provide facilities for the drainage and disposal of liquid wastes in accordance with applicable provisions of Chapter ~~62-6 64E-6~~ or 62-6004, F.A.C., and the local building authority having jurisdiction. The surface of the servicing area shall be constructed of a smooth nonabsorbent material such as concrete

or machine laid asphalt and shall be maintained in good repair, kept clean and be graded to drain.

(e) The owner of each mobile food dispensing vehicle and temporary commercial kitchen shall notify the division of each commissary they intend to utilize for support services before using the commissary by submitting DBPR HR-7022, COMMISSARY SERVICES NOTIFICATION (<https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-1594612479>), incorporated herein by reference and effective ~~2023 August 2020 December~~.

(f) After submission of an initial application, the operator of a temporary commercial kitchen must notify the division within 48 hours after commencing operation in a new or different location by submitting DBPR HR-7034, NOTIFICATION OF TEMPORARY COMMERCIAL KITCHEN OPERATIONS (<https://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-15945>), incorporated herein by reference and effective ~~2023 August~~.

(g)(f) Mobile food dispensing vehicles and temporary commercial kitchens shall not obtain water from or dispose of wastewater at a private residence or prepare food; store food products, equipment or utensils; or conduct warewashing or any other activities related to the public food service in a private residence. The exterior of the vehicle or kitchen may be washed in any location, provided the wastewater does not create a sanitary nuisance.

(h)(g) Self-sufficient mobile food dispensing vehicles and self-sufficient temporary commercial kitchens are exempt from paragraphs (2)(c) and (2)(e) of this rule.

(3) No Change.

(4) Mobile food dispensing vehicles or temporary commercial kitchens which fail to provide water and waste systems or which otherwise fail to meet all applicable requirements of this chapter shall not engage in food preparation except as permitted in subsection (3) of this rule. Such mobile food dispensing vehicles or temporary commercial kitchens units shall handle only completely wrapped or packaged food which has been manufactured, processed, prepared, and packaged in individual servings at an approved public food service establishment or a food processing plant and transported and stored in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. Bulk beverages from approved sources may be dispensed from covered urns or other protected containers.

(5) Mobile food dispensing vehicles may temporarily connect to an approved utility system for no more than one day's operation, if the utility system provides water, wastewater, or electricity adequate to meet the needs of the unit; ~~bathroom facilities are available for employees in accordance with the local building authority having jurisdiction or, where no plumbing code has been adopted locally, with Chapter 64E-~~

40, F.A.C.; and the unit returns to its base commissary as described in paragraph (2)(c) of this rule.
