(1) Canteens are to be operated primarily to provide ~~convenience items~~ ~~items of convenience~~ to inmates.

(2) Each inmate shall be allowed to purchase canteen merchandise on a weekly basis in an amount not to exceed ~~\$150~~ ~~\$100~~. A weekly limit will be recommended by the Canteen Review Team, based upon current canteen product mix and current resale prices, and approved by the Secretary. A ~~two-week~~ ~~two week~~ notice of any changes to the weekly limit will be posted on inmate bulletin boards and at each canteen.

(3) Current price lists will be posted ~~near each~~ ~~in the~~ ~~proximity of the~~ canteen for ~~inmates to view~~ ~~inmate viewing~~ ~~purposes~~.

(4) Items Authorized for Sale in Canteens.

Inmate is on disciplinary confinement or as a result of a disciplinary infraction~~ has been recommended for loss of order privileges for a specified cycle due to a disciplinary infraction, except that the inmate may purchase stamps, white paper, envelopes, and pens from the canteen for the sole purpose of preparing and sending legal mail pursuant to Rule 33-210.102, F.A.C.

~~5. 4-~~ Inmate is not permanently assigned.

(6) Provisions for the operation of alligator processing facilities:

(a) Alligator processing facility permittees and their designated employees as provided by permit may receive and possess legally acquired, unskinned alligator carcasses and alligator meat. The unskinned alligator carcasses must have attached the CITES tag and, if applicable, the harvest tag bearing the word letters “MERCURY MER” ~~as part of the tag number~~ for processing.

(b) For alligators taken pursuant to Rules 68A-25.003, 68A-25.032, ~~and~~ 68A-25.042, and 68A-25.049, F.A.C., the alligator harvest report form (FWC form 1001AT, as referenced in sub-subparagraph 68A-25.049(2)(a)5.c., F.A.C. effective April 30, 2000) shall be completed and signed immediately upon receipt, and shall be further completed upon processing to indicate the amount of alligator meat packaged. A copy of the harvest report form shall accompany the carcass until processing.

Enclosed, you will find the Notice of Availability for Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds for the October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025 (2024-2025) grant cycle. There, you will find eligibility information and application instructions. The purpose of this letter is to advise and prepare VOCA grant applicants and recipients for the significant decrease in funds being made available by the Federal government.

As Florida’s state administering agency of VOCA grants, the Office of the Attorney General is limited to awarding the funds allocated by the Federal government. In consecutive years, the Federal government reduced Florida’s VOCA fund allocation by 26% and 38%. While we have successfully managed the 26% reduction in VOCA funds, it is imperative that all VOCA grant applicants be aware that Florida’s 2024-2025 VOCA funds may be 25% lower than the previous grant cycle.

As many of you know from meetings with this office and public statements by the Attorney General, General Moody is working with our state and Federal partners to increase available funds. While we are optimistic that General Moody will find ways to minimize the damage being done by the Federal government’s failure to amend the VOCA Fix Act, it is imperative that VOCA grant recipients prepare for significant grant reductions. In preparation for this possibility, General Moody has also authorized the office to waive the “match requirement” for 2024-2025 VOCA grant recipients.

Please note that consideration for funding may be based on previous years’ application scores, the submitted application, percentage of funds spent from previous awards, and compliance with grant requirements to expedite the review and approval process.

VOCA Grant Funds

Announcement: The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is pleased to announce the availability of Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice. The purpose of the VOCA grant reimbursement program is to support the provision of services to victims of crime. Services are defined as those efforts that respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims, assist victims of crime to stabilize their lives after victimization, assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system, and provide victims of crime with a measure of safety and security. Eligibility to apply for VOCA funds is limited to victim assistance programs administered by state or local government agencies or not-for-profit corporations registered in Florida, or a combination thereof, that can demonstrate the following:

- 1) proof that the Internal Revenue Service recognizes the organization as being tax exempt under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;
- 2) a statement from a state taxing body or state secretary of state certifying that the organization is a nonprofit organization and that no part of the organization's net earnings may benefit any private shareholder or individual;
- 3) a certified copy of a certificate of incorporation or similar document establishing nonprofit status; or
- 4) any of the above, if it applies to a state or national parent organization, with a statement by the state or national parent organization that the applicant is a local nonprofit affiliate.

The funding cycle for the VOCA grant funds under this notice is October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025.

Application and Deadline: Organizations may participate in the annual competitive grant process which involves submission of an application followed by an application review. Under this notice, there are two different applications and 2 different application deadlines. Please see below for detailed instructions on how to apply and which application process is appropriate for each agency.

The purpose of this rule development is to implement Chapter 2020-150, Laws of Florida. Additionally, based on the public comments and recommendations of the Potable Reuse Commission's 2020 report, the Department is establishing the new Chapter 62-565, F.A.C., to address the permitting requirements of the Advanced Treatment Water Facility. An initial Notice of Rule Development for the new Chapter 62-565, F.A.C., was published in the Florida Administrative Register on Jan. 30, 2023, Vol. 49/19, and updated on June 9, 2023, Vol. 49/112. The Department is continuing rule development in order to obtain and consider public and industry comments.
