DH8019-PDMP, 07/2016 Rule 64K-1.003, F.A.C.

Authority for Access to the E-FORCSE Database Information

- Section 893.0551, FS authorizes direct access by a pharmacy, prescriber, dispenser licensed by the Department of Health or their designee
- Enrollment and use of the database is not mandatory prior to prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance
- Florida Statutes provide penalties for inappropriate use and handling of the database information



Penalty for Violating the Public Records Exemption Law

- Section 893.0551, F.S., any person who willfully and knowingly violates this section of law by sharing confidential protected health information commits a **felony** of the third degree
- Felony convictions related to Chapter 893,
 F.S., can result in non-renewal of health care license, see s. 456.0635(3), F.S.
- Board sanctions have included fines, mandatory continuing education and licensure restrictions

Dispensers submit records to the database

- Each time a controlled substance is dispensed to a person, the pharmacy or dispensing practitioner is required to report it to E-FORCSE.
- The prescription drug information is to be reported as soon as possible, but not more than 7 days after dispensing.
- Failure to report dispensing is first degree misdemeanor.



Information collected

- Prescriber & dispenser information
 - Full name
 - Address
 - Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registration number
 - National Provider Identification (NPI) number
- Patient Information
 - Full name
 - Address
 - Gender
 - Date of birth

- Prescription Information
 - Date dispensed
 - Date prescribed
 - Drug Name
 - Strength
 - National Drug Code (NDC) number
 - Quantity
 - Days Supply
 - New prescription/refill
 - Payment Method





How is the information used?

- Prescribers, pharmacies and pharmacists use the information from E-FORCSE to improve health care outcomes.
- Reports can supplement a patient evaluation, confirm the patient's prescription history, document compliance with a therapeutic regimen, and identify potentially hazardous or fatal interactions.

This section displays cumulative MED values by unique recipient. The "MED Max" value is the maximum occurrence of cumulative MED sustained for any 3 consecutive days. This value is calculated based on prescriptions dispensed during the date range requested.

Retrieving Information from the database

- What types of queries can I submit?
 - Recipient query request information about a patient's usage of controlled substances
 - Search history query request information about previous queries you have submitted
- E-FORCSE protects the confidentiality of the prescription information of all Floridians through strict standards that are more strict than those set by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).
- E-FORCSE staff closely monitors requests to ensure they meet statutorily mandated requirements to protect against unauthorized release from the database.

What queries are considered "Unauthorized Use?"

- Personal Use (requests not related to a current or prospective patient)
- Requests on behalf of another person (other than the supervising prescriber or dispenser)
- Disseminating, sharing, or passing of this confidential information to an unauthorized person.

Questions about using E-FORCSE?

- Prior to registering for E-FORCSE, you are required to review the *Training Guide for Florida Practitioners and Pharmacists*, which provides detailed instructions on requesting and receiving queries, monitoring their status, and understanding patient advisory reports.

Protect confidentiality

- The E-FORCSE program takes seriously its responsibility to protect sensitive information from unauthorized access and use.
- The servers that house the data are physically protected from intrusion. The data is digitally protected against cyber attacks through advanced hardware and software.

Handling Confidential and Exempt Information

- You will request information from the E-FORCSE database only when the information regards a current or prospective patient.
- The information you receive is confidential and will be communicated only by you, the person who requested it, and only with the supervising prescriber or dispenser who authorized the request.

Guarding digital data from unauthorized access

- If you must store the information, it must be in a place that is physically secure so that unauthorized persons cannot access it.
- You will NOT, under any circumstances, give unauthorized persons access to the E-FORCSE database by sharing your login information with them.
- You will prevent persons from using a computer that holds E-FORCSE information so that no unauthorized person can review, transfer, or copy this confidential information.

Accountability

- Each click made within the E-FORCSE database is recorded and retrievable. The database also records the location from which the request was made.
- The supervising prescriber or dispenser who authorized a designee to make requests on their behalf has the ability to monitor all queries performed by their designee.

Consequences

- Any person who knowingly, willingly, and unlawfully discloses confidential E-FORCSE information commits a FELONY of the third degree.
- A person who is convicted of a felony of the third degree may be punished by a term of imprisonment for up to 5 years. If the person has a history of felonies, this imprisonment can be event greater.
- In addition, a person who has been convicted of a felony of the third degree may be fined up to \$5,000.
- Felony convictions related to Chapter 893, F.S., can result in non-renewal of health care license, see s. 456.0635(3), F.S.

With a felony conviction, you may find it very difficult to keep your current job or find a new one.
