PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The rule amendments to Rule 19-11.001, F.A.C. serve to indicate that a “member” of the Investment Plan includes an individual who is deemed to be a renewed member pursuant to Section 121.122, Florida Statutes, which has been amended by Chapter 2017-88, Laws of Florida, to provide that certain retirees who are reemployed on or after July 1, 2017, may be renewed members of the Investment Plan. Rule 19-11.002 is being amended to indicate that an Investment Plan member who is killed in the line of duty shall have certain survivorship benefits paid; to indicate the dates that certain enrollment forms and second election enrollment forms have been amended; and update the name of the investment fund used to hold account funds where the beneficiary cannot be located. The amendments to Rule 19-11.003, F.A.C. adopt the latest version of the Employment Termination Form and to make a few minor editorial revisions. Rule 19-11.004, F.A.C. is being amended to adopt the revised Transfer Request Form-Excessive Fund Trading Violators. Rule 19-11.006 is being amended to adopt the latest versions of the applicable enrollment forms; and to update and clarify information concerning specific enrollment procedures. Rule 19-11.007, F.A.C. is being amended to adopt the latest versions of the Second Election enrollment forms; and to indicate that an Investment Plan member that is eligible to be a renewed Investment Plan member on or after July 1, 2017 is not eligible to use the second election to transfer to the Pension Plan. Rule 19-11.008, F.A.C. is being amended to indicate the any unvested account balances will be transferred to a suspense account which is invested in the FRS Intermediate Bond Fund. Rule 19-11.009, F.A.C. is being amended to indicate that, as

provided by amendments to Section 121.122, Florida Statutes, a retiree of the Investment Plan, Senior Management Service Optional Annuity Program (SMSOAP), State University System Optional Retirement Program (SUSORP) and State Community College System Optional Retirement Program (SCCSORP) who is reemployed with a FRS-participating employer in a covered position on or after July 1, 2017 will be a mandatory renewed member of the Investment Plan, unless employed in a position eligible for participation in the SUSORP or SCCSORP. Such renewed member will be enrolled in the Regular Class, unless the position meets the requirements to enroll in the Special Risk Class, Elected Officers' Class or Senior Management Service Class. Rule 19-11.012, F.A.C. is amended to adopt the latest version of the rollover forms. Rule 19-11.013, F.A.C. is amended to set forth how the Self-Directed Brokerage Account enrollment form can be obtained and to make a few clarifications. Rule 19-11.014, F.A.C. is being updated to indicate that the survivorship benefits paid to the surviving children of an Investment Plan member killed in the line-of-duty shall be paid as provided in Section 121.091(7)(d) and (i), Florida Statutes. The proposed rule amendments do not impose any burdens on businesses; do not restrict entry into a profession; do not have an impact on the availability of services to the public; do not have an impact on job retention; do not impose any restrictions on employment seekers; and do not impose any costs. No legislative ratification is required.

The total number of funds may continue to vary over time. Rule 19-13.002, F.A.C. is being amended to recognize that Chapter 2017-88, Laws of Florida, amended Section 121.591(4), Florida Statutes, to provide for special in line-of-duty death benefits for the spouse and child(ren) of any investment plan member, and not just special risk class members. Thus, the Division of Retirement will now administer in-line-of-duty death benefits for all members. The proposed rule amendments do not impose any burdens on businesses; do not restrict entry into a profession; do not have an impact on the availability of services to the public; do not have an impact on job retention; do not impose any restrictions on employment seekers; and do not impose any costs. No legislative ratification is required.

SUMMARY: Rule 62-305.100, F.A.C., provides the scope of Chapter 62-305, F.A.C., which sets forth procedures for distributing funding for the TMDL Water Quality Restoration Grant program. Rule 62-305.200, F.A.C., provides definitions for words that are used throughout Chapter 62-305, F.A.C. Rule 62-305.300, F.A.C., provides the general procedures and eligibility criteria for the distribution of the grant funds. Rule 62-305.400, F.A.C., provides the selection criteria for evaluating projects that are submitted for funding.

These rules are being repealed because they are unnecessary to administer the grant program and the statute, 403.890(2) F.S., authorizing the rule has been repealed.

The State Surgeon General determined that this summary procedure was fair under the circumstances, in that there was no other method available to adequately protect the public.

Substance Abuse Program

Determination of Need for Methadone Medication-Assisted Treatment Programs for Opioid Disorders in Response to the Emergency Rule, 65DER 17-1, F.A.C.

Introduction

The Office of Substance Abuse and Mental Health within the Department of Children and Families (Department) is the single state agency responsible for a statewide system of prevention, treatment, and recovery support services for individuals with or at risk of developing substance use disorders. This includes regulating substance abuse treatment services. In accordance with s. 397.427, F.S., the Department shall not license any new medication-assisted treatment programs for opioid addiction until it conducts a needs assessment to determine whether additional providers are needed in Florida. The determination of need only applies to methadone medication-assisted treatment programs for opioid addiction.

In determining need for additional methadone medication-assisted treatment programs, the following data was examined:

- Population estimates by age and by county;
- Number of opioid-caused deaths;
- Estimated number of past-year nonmedical pain reliever users; and
- Estimated number of life-time heroin users.

Determination of Need

The Department conducted a needs assessment which indicates a need for an additional 49 methadone medication-assisted treatment providers. The chart indicates the number of providers needed for each county. Applications will be considered for applicants interested in opening an opioid treatment program in one of the counties with an established need. For additional information on how to apply, refer to the Notice of Emergency Rule 65DER 17-1, F.A.C.
