Exceptional Student Education

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To adopt course requirements for each course contained in the “Course Code Directory and Instructional Personnel Assignments” for Grades PK-12 Exceptional Student Education. The effect will be the proposed adoption of the exceptional education course descriptions as appropriate for each grade level and content area.

SUMMARY: This amendment will incorporate the Access English 1-4 course descriptions and delete the fundamental course descriptions.

Access English 1/2 (course #7910111) and Access English 3/4 (course #7910112) are daggered for the 2017-18 school year to be deleted in the 2018-19 school year, and Access English 1-4 courses have been added.

Fundamental courses were allowed for students to earn credit toward a special diploma, in accordance with the district’s student progression plan. Legislation passed in Florida during the 2014 Legislative Session repealed the special diploma law, section 1003.438, F.S., effective July 1, 2015. Students with disabilities who entered Grade 9 in the 2014-15 school year or thereafter may not earn a special diploma.

RULE NO.: 5BER17-4 RULE TITLE: Exposed Citrus Nursery Stock Movement
SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR

WELFARE: Section 581.1843(2), Florida Statutes, requires all citrus nursery stock to be produced in a protective structure approved by the Department. Rule Chapter 5B-62, Florida Administrative Code, adopts the Departments standards for those structures. Hurricane Irma has created emergency conditions jeopardizing the movement of citrus nursery stock in structures that have been compromised and impacted industries ability to move nursery stock.

REASON FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE IS FAIR UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The provisions of this rule are narrowly tailored to assist in the movement of exposed citrus nursery stock during the emergency conditions created by Hurricane Irma. Due to the emergency conditions, citrus nurseries may be forced to destroy valuable nursery stock that are needed by the industry to help replace trees damaged by the hurricane without the allowances provided by this emergency rule. The Department will immediately begin formal rulemaking to adopt the provisions of the emergency rule.

SUMMARY: This emergency rule allows for exposed citrus nursery stock to be moved into structures away from clean material and be sold to growers.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

5BER17-4 – Exposed Citrus Nursery Stock

(1) Any citrus nursery stock within a greenhouse that was damaged due to the impact of Hurricane Irma or otherwise exposed shall be moved from the certified greenhouse into a non-certified structure within the permitted nursery or voluntarily destroyed by the nursery by December 31, 2017. All citrus nursery stock moved into a non-certified structure must be tracked by the nursery and the tracking records shall be made available to the Department upon request.

(2) Any citrus nursery stock moved into a non-certified structure within the permitted nursery will be exempt from compliance with Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C., until September 30, 2018, at which time full compliance will be required.

(3) All citrus nursery stock sold or provided to citrus growers shall be accompanied by a written notice that the citrus nursery stock may have been exposed to citrus diseases due to Hurricane Irma.

(4) Repaired certified citrus nursery greenhouses that were damaged due to Hurricane Irma shall be cleaned and sanitized as required by Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C. Upon inspection and approval by the Department, the citrus nursery may start new citrus nursery stock plantings within the greenhouse that

will be subject to the full requirements of Rule Chapter 5B-62, F.A.C.

(5) Scion houses that were compromised due to the hurricane are encouraged to be restarted from Foundation material as soon as possible. However, recognizing the shortage that destroying this material could cause, the Division will require testing quarterly and continuous inspection every 30 days of these trees for 1 year beginning September 30, 2017. The Florida Department of Law Enforcement hereby gives notice:

On February 8, 2017, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (CJSTC) issued a Final Order granting a waiver of paragraph 11B-35.006(1)(b), F.A.C., to Paul Kiley, Chairman of the Training Center Directors Association, on behalf of the officers named in the Petition. Paragraph 11B-35.006(1)(b), F.A.C., lists active Advanced Training Program Courses; the waiver permits Petitioners to receive credit for the Advanced Training Program courses they completed even though these courses were technically retired at the time of their completion. The Petition was filed on December 21, 2016, and notice of the petition was published on January 6, 2017, in Vol. 43, No. 4, of the Florida Administrative Register. No public comments were received. In rendering its decision, the CJSTC determined that Petitioners would suffer a substantial hardship were the waiver not granted as they would be ineligible to receive credit for completed course work or to submit such coursework for consideration for salary incentives, job assignments, and career advancement opportunities. The CJSTC also determined that the waiver would satisfy the purpose of the underlying statutes as the advanced coursework completed by Petitioners enhanced their knowledge, skills, and abilities.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement hereby gives notice:

On February 8, 2017, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (CJSTC) issued an Order denying a temporary waiver of Rule 11B-27.00213, F.A.C., to Janeen Patterson. Rule 11B-27.00213, F.A.C., permits agencies to employ individuals under a Temporary Employment Authorization (TEA) who have previously held a TEA only if the individual separated from service or discontinued training while in good standing and has had at least a four year break in service; Petitioner desired the right to accept employment under a second TEA without a four year break in service. The Petition was filed on November 23, 2016, and notice of the petition was published on December 22, 2016, in Vol. 42, No. 247, of the Florida Administrative Register. No public comments were received. In rendering its decision, the CJSTC determined that a waiver in this matter would not serve the purpose of the underlying statutes as Petitioner presented no evidence that an agency with a demonstrated critical need intended to hire Petitioner under a TEA at the time of the Petition.
