 RULE NO.: 69L-3.009 RULE TITLE: Injuries that Qualify as Grievous Bodily Harm of a Nature that Shocks the Conscience
 PURPOSE AND EFFECT: A new rule is being introduced due to the passage of CS/CS/SB 376, which added subsections (5) and (6) to section 112.1815, Florida Statutes (F.S.). Section 112.1815(5)(f), F.S., requires the Department of Financial Services to adopt rules specifying injuries qualifying as grievous bodily harm of a nature that shocks the conscience.
 SUMMARY: The proposed rule specifies injuries that qualify as grievous bodily harm of a nature that shocks the conscience for purposes of determining the compensability of employment-related posttraumatic stress disorder for first responders.
 SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:
 The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the Agency.
 The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein:

69L-3.009 Injuries that Qualify as Grievous Bodily Harm of a Nature that Shocks the Conscience.

Pursuant to section 112.1815(5), F.S., for purposes of determining the compensability of employment-related posttraumatic stress disorder for first responders, the following injuries qualify as grievous bodily harm of a nature that shocks the conscience:

- (1) Decapitation (full or partial),
- (2) Degloving,
- (3) Enucleation,
- (4) Evisceration,
- (5) Exposure of one or more of the following internal organs:
 - (a) Brain,
 - (b) Heart,
 - (c) Intestines,
 - (d) Kidneys,
 - (e) Liver, or
 - (f) Lungs
- (6) Impalement,
- (7) Severance (full or partial), and
- (8) Third degree burn on 9% or more of the body.

(1) Name of Game. Game Number 1399, “\$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS.”

(2) Game Number 1399, \$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS is a Scratch-Off lottery game (also known as an instant lottery game).

(3) Price. \$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS lottery tickets sell for \$1.00 per ticket.

(4) \$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning \$10,000

HOLIDAY BONUS lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER17-54, Florida Administrative Code.



(10) Determination of Prizewinners.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-64 \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance Promotion

(1) Beginning October 29, 2018, and continuing through December 31, 2018, (“Promotion Period”) the Florida Lottery will conduct the \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance Promotion (“Promotion”) in which players can enter non-winning Florida Lottery Scratch-Off tickets (also known as instant tickets) from the following HOLIDAY BONUS family of games into a \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance

Promotion second chance drawing for a chance to win a cash prize:

- (a) Game Number 1399, \$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS;
- (b) Game Number 1400, \$50,000 HOLIDAY BONUS;
- (c) Game Number 1401, \$1,000,000 HOLIDAY BONUS;

and

- (d) Game Number 1402, \$2,000,000 HOLIDAY BONUS.

Non-winning Scratch-Off lottery tickets from Game Number 1399 (\$10,000 HOLIDAY BONUS), Game Number 1400 (\$50,000 HOLIDAY BONUS); Game Number 1401 (\$1,000,000 HOLIDAY BONUS); and Game Number 1402 (\$2,000,000 HOLIDAY BONUS) may be entered during the Promotion Period for the next available drawing. Winning Scratch-Off tickets from the above-listed HOLIDAY BONUS family of games cannot be used for entry into a \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance Promotion second chance drawing.

(2) How to Enter.

(a) To enter a non-winning HOLIDAY BONUS Scratch-Off ticket into one of the second chance drawings, players must enter on the Florida Lottery’s website at flalottery.com. On the home page of the Florida Lottery’s website, players can click on the \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance Promotion banner and follow the directions. Players will be prompted to log-in or register. The 24-digit ticket serial number (4-digit game number and 20-digit ticket number) is located below the play area on the front of a HOLIDAY BONUS Scratch-Off ticket under the latex covering. Players are to scratch off the latex covering to reveal the number and enter the entire 24-digit ticket serial number in the designated ticket entry area on the website.

(b) Entry Determination. Each non-winning HOLIDAY BONUS Scratch-Off ticket is assigned a predetermined number of entries that corresponds to the price of the non-winning ticket, as shown in the table below.

Each valid ticket number may only be entered one time and only into one drawing. Tickets should not be mailed to the Florida Lottery unless players are contacted by the Florida Lottery and requested to do so. Non-winning tickets received in the mail by the Florida Lottery will not be entered in a drawing and will not be returned. The odds of winning depend on the number of

entries entered. All entries are subject to validation by the Florida Lottery and may be disqualified if eligibility requirements are not met.

(4) Drawings. A total of three second chance drawings will be held. Prizewinners for each drawing will be randomly selected from entries submitted and received before midnight ET on the last day of the entry period for that drawing. In each of the drawings, a total of 65 valid entries will be drawn by the Florida Lottery using a certified random number generation process. The first through third valid entries drawn will each win a top prize of \$10,000. The fourth through tenth valid entries drawn will each win a second prize of \$5,000. The eleventh through forty-fifth valid entries drawn will each win a third prize of \$1,000. The forty-sixth through sixty-fifth valid entries drawn will be used in the order in which they were

drawn and in the order of need to select an alternate top, second or third prize winner in the event a top, second or third prize cannot be awarded. Drawings shall be public, held in Tallahassee, Florida, and witnessed by an accountant employed by an independent certified public accounting firm.

(5) Notification.

(a) The prizewinners in each second chance drawing will be posted on flalottery.com after the drawing.

(b) The Florida Lottery will attempt to notify each prizewinner by telephone or email using the contact information provided in the prizewinner's registration data no later than one business day (Monday-Friday) after the prizewinners are posted on the Florida Lottery's website. The Florida Lottery deems the winner's registration data as the prizewinner's official contact information, including the physical mailing address. The Florida Lottery will not attempt to further locate a prizewinner if attempts to reach the winner by telephone or email are unsuccessful. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by telephone or email with a prizewinner within two weeks of the date the prizewinners are posted on the website, the winner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsection (4) above. If the Florida Lottery is unable to have contact by email or telephone with the alternate prizewinner within two weeks of the date of notification, the alternate prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to the next alternate prizewinner. This process will continue until an alternate prizewinner is contacted or the Florida Lottery has exhausted the list of alternate prizewinners due to unsuccessful notification attempts or due to failure by a prizewinner or an alternate prizewinner to timely provide required claim documentation as set forth in subsection (6) below. If the Florida Lottery exhausts the list of alternate prizewinners, the prize will not be awarded.

(6) How to Claim a Prize. If the Florida Lottery has not received the required documentation from a prizewinner by the fourteenth day after notification, the prizewinner will forfeit his or her right to claim the prize and the Florida Lottery will award the prize to an alternate prizewinner in accordance with subsections (4) and (5) above. The same timeframe for a prizewinner to return required documentation to the Florida Lottery shall apply to an alternate prizewinner.

(7) Award of Top Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a top prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$10,000, less applicable federal income tax withholding.

(8) Award of Second Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a second prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$5,000.

(9) Award of Third Prizes. Upon the Florida Lottery's timely receipt of a third prize winner's required documentation, the Lottery will award a prize of \$1,000.

(10) Taxes. Except as specifically described herein, all federal, state and/or local taxes or other fees on the prizes won in the \$10,000 Holiday Bonus Second Chance Promotion will be the responsibility of the prizewinner. Thirty percent federal income tax withholding will be withheld from any prize won by a nonresident alien prizewinner in the Promotion, regardless of the amount of the prize. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the State Board of Administration of Florida (the "Board") of the estimated borrowing capacity, estimated claims-paying capacity, and projected balance of the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund (the "Fund") as of December 31, 2018, in compliance with the requirements of subparagraph 215.555(4)(c)2., Florida Statutes. These estimates relate to the 2018-2019 Reimbursement Contract Year. For October 2018, based on an estimated borrowing capacity of \$8.0 billion, \$13.0 billion projected year-end cash balance, and \$1.0 billion of reinsurance, the Fund's total estimated claims-paying capacity over the next 12 months is \$22.0 billion, which amount exceeds the \$17 billion limit on the Fund's single-season obligations as specified by subparagraph 215.555(4)(c)1., Florida Statutes, for the contract year. The borrowing capacity estimate is dependent on many factors, such as the credit rating of the debt, the amount of emergency assessments available for funding the debt, the limitations or constraints of the financial markets to absorb potential debt issuances, the time necessary to access such markets, and the existing level of interest rates at the time of issuance. The projected year-end balance available for reimbursement of participating insurers on December 31, 2018, is estimated to be \$13.0 billion, which represents the amount of assets available to pay claims resulting from Covered Events which may occur during the June 1, 2018 through May 31, 2019 Contract Year, not including any bond proceeds. The estimated claims-paying capacity consists of the estimated borrowing capacity, the projected year-end cash balance, and reinsurance. Additional liquidity is provided by \$2.2 billion from Series 2013A and Series 2016A pre-event bonds. The projected year-end fund balance of \$13.0 billion reflects losses and loss reserves from Hurricane Irma (2017), which the FHCF's consulting actuary has estimated to be \$3.2 billion. The estimates above do not take into account any potential losses from Hurricane Michael, which made landfall in Florida on October 10, 2018. Greater detail may be obtained in the October 9, 2018 Claims-Paying Capacity Estimates Report, which can be found on the Fund's website at www.sbafla.com/fhcf/ under

"Bonding Program." The Board recognizes that its good faith estimates are being made while volatile global financial market conditions exist, and therefore, changing market conditions can dramatically impact the Fund's actual claims-paying capacity either positively or negatively.
