On March 30, 2023, the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for paragraph 61C-1.004(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code and Paragraph 5-202.11(A), 2017 FDA Food Code from ABC Wine Bar LLC located in Jacksonville. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that each establishment have an approved plumbing system installed to transport potable water and wastewater. They are requesting to utilize holding tanks to provide potable water and to collect wastewater at the handwash and 3-compartment sinks.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 49/63 on March 31, 2023. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on April 10, 2023. FINAL ORDER

APPROVING LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2023-09

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Lake County, Florida, Ordinance No. 2023-09 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Green Swamp Area is designated by section 380.0551, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by Lake County on January 24, 2023, and rendered to the Department on January 26, 2023.
- 3. The Ordinance makes the following amendments to the Lake County Code ("Code"):
 - a. Amends the Code to create Chapter XVII, entitled Rural Conservation Subdivision Design Standards, which establishes design standards for new subdivisions developed within the Rural Future Land Use Series, Wekiva River Protection

- Area, Wekia Study Area, and the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern Comprehensive Plan Categories;
- Amends Chapter II of the Code to modify the definitions for low impact development and open space;
- c. Amends Section 3.02.06 of the Code to allow lots developed as a rural conservation subdivision to be smaller than density requirements; and
- d. Amends 6.12.01 of the Code to update the water connection requirements and the central sewage system requirements for new and existing developments and single-family dwelling units that aren't within a subdivision.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. *See* section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.
- 5. "Land development regulations" include "local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land." Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically is consistent with Policy I-1.1.1, Policy I-1.1.3, and Policy I-7.4.2.
- 7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern as a whole, and specifically furthers the following Principles:
 - (b) Protect the normal quantity, quality and flow of ground water and surface water which are necessary for the protection of resources of state and regional concern.
 - (c) Protect the water available for aquifer recharge.
 - (e) Protect the normal supply of ground and surface water.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Lake County Ordinance No. 2023-09 is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan and the Principles

for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
