# DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

RULE NO.: RULE TITLE:

62-304.515 Kissimmee River Basin TMDLs

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the rule is to adopt Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs), and their allocations, for certain waters impaired for nutrients and/or dissolved oxygen (DO) in the Kissimmee River Basin. Furthermore, upon paragraph 62-302.531(2)(a), F.A.C., becoming effective, the nutrient TMDLs for Lake Holden, Lake Cypress, Lake Marian, Lake Jackson, and Lake Kissimmee, will constitute site specific numeric interpretations of the narrative nutrient criterion set forth in paragraph 62-302.530(47)(b), F.A.C., that will supersede the otherwise applicable numeric nutrient criteria in paragraph 62-302.531(2)(b), F.A.C., for these particular surface water segments.

SUMMARY: These TMDLs address certain nutrient and DO impairments in the Kissimmee River Basin. Specifically, the nutrient and/or DO TMDL rules being proposed for adoption are for Lake Jackson, Lake Cypress, Lake Holden, Lake Kissimmee, and Lake Marian. These waterbodies were verified for nutrient impairments due to elevated chlorophyll a concentrations and due to low DO for Lake Jackson, using the methodology established in Chapter 62-303, F.A.C., Identification of Impaired Surface Waters. The methodologies used to develop the TMDLs were model simulations using the Hydrological Simulation Program – Fortran (HSPF) model. This rulemaking has been given an OGC case number 11-0653.

## SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the agency.

One SERC was prepared for the Lake Holden system, an internally drained watershed, and a separate SERC was prepared for Lakes Cypress, Jackson, Marian, and Kissimmee, which are all part of the interconnected Upper Kissimmee River Chain of Lakes. Implementation costs associated with these TMDLs are estimated to be \$715,900 for Lake Holden and \$65,507,218 for Lakes Jackson, Marian, Cypress, and Kissimmee (per year).

Pursuant to paragraph 403.067(6)(c), Florida Statutes, the proposed rule does not require legislative ratification.

### THE FULL TEXT OF THE PROPOSED RULE IS:

### 62-304.515 Kissimmee River Basin TMDLs.

(1) Lake Holden: The nutrient total maximum daily load (TMDL) for Lake Holden is 148 lb/year of total phosphorus (TP), 10,526 lb/year of total nitrogen (TN), and long-term annual average (5-year average) in-lake TN and TP concentrations of 1.46 mg/L and 0.009 mg/L, respectively, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The wasteload allocation (WLA) for wastewater sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permitting Program is a 74.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 1996 through 2000.

(c) The load allocation (LA) for nonpoint sources is a 74.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 1996 through 2000, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the LA and WLA for TP and TN has been expressed as the percent reduction needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrient criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient conditions in the impaired waterbody. However, it is not the intent of this TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

(2) Lake Cypress: The nutrient TMDL for Lake Cypress is 1,374,801 lb/year of TN, 51,175 lb/year of TP, and longterm annual average (7-year average) in-lake TN and TP concentrations of 1.07 mg/L and 0.049 mg/L, respectively, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater point sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's <u>NPDES MS4 Permitting Program is a 5.0% reduction of TN</u> and 35.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006,

(c) The LA for nonpoint sources is a 5.0% reduction of TN and 35.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the LA and WLA for TP and TN nutrients have been expressed as the percent reductions needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrient criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient conditions in the impaired waterbody. However, it is not the intent of the TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

(3) Lake Marian: The nutrient TMDL for Lake Marian is 88,122 lb/year of TN, 6,013 lb/year of TP, and long-term annual average (7-year average) in-lake TN and TP concentrations of 1.14 mg/L and 0.049 mg/L, respectively, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater point sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's NPDES MS4 Permitting Program is a 55.0% reduction of TN and 53.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006,

(c) The LA for nonpoint sources is a 55.0% reduction of TN and 53.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the WLA and LA for TN and TP have been expressed as the percent reductions needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrients criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient conditions in the impaired waterbody. However, it is not the intent of the TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

(4) Lake Jackson: The nutrient and dissolved oxygen (DO) TMDL for Lake Jackson is 118,662 lb/year of TN, 5,553 lb/year of TP, and long-term annual average (7-year average) in-lake TN and TP concentrations of 1.20 mg/L and 0.06 mg/L, respectively, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater point sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's <u>NPDES MS4 Permitting Program is 20.0% reduction of TN</u> and 25.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006,

(c) The LA for nonpoint sources is 20.0% reduction of TN and 25.0% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the WLA and LA for TN and TP have been expressed as the percent reduction needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrient criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient condition in the impaired waterbody. However, it is not the intent of the TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

(5) Lake Kissimmee: The nutrient TMDL for Lake Kissimmee is 2,795,484 lb/year of TN, 126,517 lb/year of TP, and long-term annual average (7-year average) in-lake TN and TP concentrations of 1.10 mg/L and 0.044 mg/L, respectively, and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater point sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's NPDES MS4 Permitting Program is a 15.0% reduction of TN and 17% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006.

(c) The LAs for nonpoint sources are 15% reduction of TN and 17% reduction of TP based on the year 2000 landuse and a modeling period from 2000 through 2006, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the WLA and LA for TN and TP have been expressed as the percent reductions needed to attain the applicable Class III nutrients criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the restoration of nutrient conditions in the impaired waterbody. 64B8-6.001 Unlicensed Physician; Definition of.

An unlicensed physician is a person holding a degree as a medical doctor or its equivalent, but not licensed by the Board of Medicine. For the purpose of administering this rule chapter, such unlicensed physicians shall embrace and include resident physicians, assistant resident physicians, house physicians, interns, or fellows in fellowship training which leads to subspecialty board certification or in fellowship training in a teaching hospital in this state as definined in Section 408.07(45) or Section 395.805(2), Florida Statutes, interns, resident physicians, assistant resident physicians, fellows in fellowship training which leads to subspecialty board certifications, as these terms are hereinafter defined.

The term "fellow," as used in Section 458.345, F.S., and this rule chapter, encompasses only persons in fellowship training which leads to subspecialty board certification by a specialty board of the American Board of Medical Specialties, or in fellowship training in a teaching hospital in this state as defined in Section 408.07(45) or Section 395.805(2), Florida Statutes.

(1) Every unlicensed physician engaged or employed in the practice of medicine in a hospital in the State of Florida, where such practice is authorized by law, shall apply to be registered by the Department. The Department shall register any applicant the Board certifies as eligible. (2) Registration automatically expires after 2 years without further action by the Board or the Department unless an application for renewal is approved by the Board. No person registered under Section 458.345, F.S., shall be employed or utilized <u>by a hospital</u> as a house physician or act as a resident physician, assistant resident physician, intern, or fellow in fellowship training which leads to a subspecialty board certification <u>or in fellowship training in a teaching hospital in this state as defined in Section 408.07(45) or Secttion 395.805(2), Florida Statutes, by a hospital for more than 2 years unless that person has a valid, active license or has renewed registration pursuant to Section 458.345, F.S.</u>

Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 39, No. 124, June 26, 2013 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

As a result of comments received from the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee in a letter dated July 12, 2013 and comments read into record at the July 18, 2013 Rule Hearing, the following changes have been made to the rule:

60L-34.0031 Regular Time and Overtime.

(1) through (3) No change.

(4) In lieu of overtime payment, an employee in an included position who is eligible for overtime, may, if <del>mutually</del> agreed by the employee and the agency, waive cash payment for overtime, and the agency shall <u>credit</u> <del>process the</del> FLSA <del>special</del> compensatory <u>time</u> leave as follows:

(a) At the end of the workweek or extended period, credit all overtime hours <u>designated</u> as FLSA <del>special</del> compensatory <u>time</u> <del>leave credits</del> at the rate of one and one-half hours credit for each hour of overtime worked.

(b) Allow the employee to accumulate up to a maximum of 80 hours of credits.

(b)(c) Allow the employee to use the credits in any increments mutually agreed by the employee and the supervisor. Absent mutual agreement, the supervisor may, with a minimum of five workdays notice, require the employee to use the credits at any time in increments of full workdays.

(c) The agency may allow the accrual and payment of FLSA compensatory leave credits on a biannual or annual basis. The agency shall report in writing to the Department the payment dates they have adopted.

<u>1.(d)</u> An employee accruing and receiving payment biannually shall be allowed to accumulate a maximum of 80 hours of credits. At the close of business on December 31 and June 30 of each year, or two other biannual dates approved by the Department, the agency shall pay the employee for all unused credits at the employee's <u>current</u> straight time regular hourly rate of pay, in accordance with the FLSA;

2. An employee accruing and receiving payment annually shall be allowed to accumulate a maximum of 160 hours of credits. At the close of business on December 31 of each year, or on another annual date approved by the Department, the agency shall pay the employee for all unused credits at the employee's current straight time regular hourly rate of pay, in accordance with the FLSA.  $(\underline{d})(\underline{e})$  If the employee separates from the agency or moves to an excluded position with accumulated credits, pay the employee for all unused credits at the employee's <u>current</u> straight time regular hourly rate of pay <u>or the rate in effect</u> when the leave was accrued, whichever is greater, in accordance with the FLSA.

(5)(f) Unless otherwise provided in through an applicable collective bargaining agreement, wWhen a Career Service an employee is on-call pursuant to Chapter 60L-32, F.A.C., and is called back to the assigned or other designated work location beyond the employee's scheduled hours of work for that day, the employee shall be credited with actual time worked or a minimum of two hours of work, whichever is greater. Only the actual time worked during the call back shall be Time not worked of the minimum of two hours is not counted as hours worked for the purposes of computing overtime compensation.

Upon the employee's transfer to another agency or pay plan, the agency shall pay the employee for unused special compensatory leave credits at the employee's current regular hourly rate of pay, unless otherwise provided in an applicable collective bargaining agreement.

(3) Upon prior notice, an agency may compel the use of all or part of an employee's accumulated holiday special compensatory leave credits or special compensatory leave credits, or both, based on agency needs, provided such usage requirement is in accordance with any collective bargaining agreement provisions. An agency may also require an employee to use accumulated special compensatory leave credits prior to approving an employee's request to use other types of approved leave, with the exception of sick leave, administrative leave, FLSA compensatory leave and the personal holiday.

(4) All Unused special compensatory leave credits for a <u>Career Service</u> an employee who is laid off shall be paid for in lump-sum, based on the employee's current regular hourly rate of pay<sub>7</sub> at the time of layoff, <u>unless otherwise provided in an</u> applicable collective bargaining agreement.

(5) At the time of entry into the DROP, an employee electing to participate in the program may request payment of any unused special compensatory leave that was earned within eleven months before entry into the DROP, <u>unless otherwise</u> provided in an applicable collective bargaining agreement.
