Other changes to this section include the incorporation of modifications to the licensure application and technical changes clarifying the submission process for required reports to the Agency. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.106, F.A.C., include providing a web address for obtaining transfer and discharge forms, deleting a reference to services provided by the Department of Children and Families, incorporating references to federal guidelines and providing a specific address to obtain copies of "Health Care Advance Directives." Amendments to Rule 59A-4.1075, F.A.C., include update of statutory references and technical changes. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.108, F.A.C., updates statutory references for facility staffing in accordance with state law, and establishes requirements for requesting the use of licensed nurses to perform licensed nursing and certified nursing assistant's duties. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.109, F.A.C., include update of statutory references and technical changes.

Amendments to Rule 59A-4.110, F.A.C., include a change to the position title of director of food service and replace the outdated references to the Dietary Managers training and certification process. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.112, F.A.C., include changes to meet the statutory requirements of the Emergency Drug Kit. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.118, F.A.C., include the removal of the requirement for nursing homes to contract with a medical records consultant and credentialing organizations. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.122, F.A.C., includes details for the placement of a resident's bed and further defines the requirement for a closet and comfortable room temperatures and physical plant

maintenance. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.123, F.A.C., eliminate the 1-day Adverse Incident Reporting and Form and provides for electronic submission of the 15-day Adverse Incident form.

Amendment to Rule 59A-4.126, F.A.C., provide language regarding the submission of the emergency management plan, testing of this plan, and procedures and notifications for evacuation, overcapacity and re-occupancy of the nursing home structure during a disaster. An amendment to Rule 59A-4.128, F.A.C., removes the measurement of deficiencies in terms of scope and severity for state licensure. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.1288, F.A.C., incorporate references to federal regulations established since 1991. Amendments to Rule 59A-4.130, F.A.C., provide revised language to conform to code edition changes and retain language not included in the Florida Building Code. (1) During each biennium, each licensee shall complete a minimum of one classroom hour of continuing education from a Board-approved provider for each month the license is active. Graduates of a Board-approved massage therapy school who are renewing their license for the first time shall complete a course of two classroom hours on prevention of medical errors that meets the requirements of Section 456.013(7), F.S. If the prevention of medical errors course completed during the course of study at the Board-approved massage school meets the requirements of Section 456.013(7), F.S., that course will satisfy the requirement of this rule.

(2) The continuing education shall include the following:

(a) At least one half of the classroom hours of instruction must be relevant to and focus on massage therapy techniques, must be in the presence of the instructor, must include handson participation by the licensee and/or demonstration by the instructor, and may include:

1. History of massage therapy,

2. Human anatomy,

3. Human physiology,

4. Human kinesiology, or

5. Human pathology

(b) Two classroom hours of instruction on prevention of medical errors that meet the requirements of Section 456.013(7), F.S.

(c) Two classroom hours of instruction in professional ethics.

(d) Two classroom hours of instruction on Chapters 456 and 480 of the Florida Statutes and the rules promulgated by the Board. This requirement may be satisfied by attending four continuous hours of a meeting of the Board, provided the licensee does not have a disciplinary or licensure matter on the agenda and the licensee signs in and out of the meeting to demonstrate compliance. (3) The remaining classroom hours may be satisfied by completing instruction in:

(a) Communications with clients and other professionals.

(b) Insurance relating to third party payment or reimbursement for services.

(c) Psychological dynamics of the client-therapist relationship.

(d) Risk management including charting, documentation and record keeping.

(e) Infection control.

(f) Practice management.

(g) Cardio-pulmonary resuscitation if the course is instructed by persons certified by the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association or the American Safety and Health Institute.

(2) Each continuing education program presented to meet the requirements of paragraph 64B7-28.009(2)(a), F.A.C., for license renewal credit or to satisfy initial licensure requirements shall:

(a) <u>Be taught via live classroom instruction including</u> <u>hands-on instruction and/or demonstration</u> <u>Meet the standards</u> of subsection 64B7 28.009(2), paragraph (3)(a), (b) or (c), F.A.C.;

(b) through (c) No change.

(d) Provided, however, that approved courses in areas other than massage theory, history, and techniques may be instructed by a person who meets at least one of the following criteria:

1. Holds a minimum of a bachelor's degree from a college or university which is accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or a substantially equivalent accrediting body of a foreign sovereign state, with a major in a subject directly related to the content of the program to be offered, or

2. Has, within the last five years of practical experience, had a minimum of two years teaching experience in the subject matter to be offered, or

3. Has taught the same courses on this approved subject a minimum of 3 times in the past 2 years before a professional convention, professional group, or at a massage therapy school, or

4. Has completed specialized training in the subject matter and has a minimum of two years of practical experience in the subject.

(3) Each continuing education program presented to meet the requirements of paragraph 64B7-28.009(2)(b), (c), (d) or (3), F.A.C., shall:

(a) Be taught via live classroom instruction or by correspondence, home study, video or digital media, or distance learning;

(b) Have stated learning objectives;

(c) Include a test graded by the provider if the course is not taught via live classroom instruction;

(d) Be instructed by a person who meets at least one of the following criteria:

<u>1. Holds a minimum of a bachelor's degree from a college</u> or university which is accredited by a regional accrediting body recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or a substantially equivalent accrediting body of a foreign sovereign state, with a major in a subject directly related to the content of the program to be offered, or

2. Has, within the last five years of practical experience, had a minimum of two years teaching experience in the subject matter to be offered, or

<u>3. Has taught the same courses on this approved subject a</u> minimum of 3 times in the past 2 years before a professional convention, professional group, or at a massage therapy school, or

<u>4. Has completed specialized training in the subject</u> matter and has a minimum of two years of practical experience in the subject.

(4)(3) The Board retains the right and authority to audit and/or monitor programs given by any provider. The Board will reject individual programs given by a provider if the provider has disseminated any false or misleading information in connection with the continuing education program, or if the program provider has failed to conform to and abide by the written agreement and rules of the Board.

(5)(4) One <u>classroom</u> hour of continuing education is defined as no less than 50 uninterrupted minutes of learning.

(6)(5) Presenters/moderators/instructors of courses shall not receive credit for courses they present.

(6) A provider of Board approved programs must submit a completed application for supplemental courses, form # BMT B and C, to the Board office prior to offering such courses for credit. The submitted information must also identify any new continuing education instructor and show that such instructor meets the criteria set forth in this rule. Whenever an instructor and his/her course have obtained approval by the Board, the instructor may teach the course at any time, in whole or in part, so long as the materials being taught do not deviate from the course materials originally approved, there is no change of instructor, and the documentation of attendance clearly indicates the original course approval number and the hours of credit given for this version of the course. Therefore, the number of continuing education hours awarded for the course may be the original number of hours approved, or less. An increase of the number of continuing education hours awarded will require submission of form # BMT B for approval of a course.

(7) No change.

(8) Provider registration numbers must be renewed biennially on or before August 31 of the biennial renewal year. The provider must return the renewal form provided by the department together with a renewal fee of 50.00 250.00. If the renewal form and renewal fee are not received by the department on or before August 31 of the biennial year, the provider must submit a new application for approval of any continuing education programs offered for license renewal or initial licensure requirements, and, if any programs are approved, receive a new provider registration number.
