The rule will address issues related to the equitable treatment of young adults formerly in foster care and provide for increased fiscal oversight and accountability at all levels (Department, Community-Based Care Lead Agencies and agencies under contract with the Department operating pursuant to Section 409.1671, F.S.), so as to maximize the effective and efficient operation of the Pre-Independent and Independent Living Program.

62-304.645 Springs Coast Basin TMDLs

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the rule is to adopt Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs), and their allocations. for certain waters impaired for nutrients and dissolved oxygen in the Springs Coast Basin. Furthermore, upon paragraph 62-302.531(2)(a), F.A.C., becoming effective, these nutrient TMDLs will constitute site specific numeric interpretations of the narrative nutrient criterion set forth in paragraph 62-302.530(47)(b), F.A.C.

SUMMARY: These TMDLs address certain dissolved oxygen and nutrient impairments in the Springs Coast Basin. Specifically, the TMDL rules being proposed for adoption are for the Curlew Creek tidal segment and the McKay Creek tidal segment. These waterbodies were verified as impaired for dissolved oxygen and nutrients, due to elevated chlorophyll a concentrations, using the methodology established in Chapter 62-303, F.A.C., Identification of Impaired Surface Waters. This rulemaking has been given an OGC case number 12-1360.

SUMMARY OF **STATEMENT** OF **ESTIMATED** REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the agency.

The projected costs are primarily attributable to anticipated activities associated with the local MS4.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs.

(1) through (12) No change.

(13) Curlew Creek Tidal Segment. The TMDL to address the low dissolved oxygen and nutrient impairments is an annual average TN concentration of 0.95 mg/L and is allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for the Mid-County Wastewater Treatment Plant is 4,245 lb/year of TN,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's NPDES Municipal Stormwater Permitting Program is to address anthropogenic sources in the basin such that in-stream concentrations meet the Class III marine dissolved oxygen and nutrient criteria which, based on the measured concentrations in the year 2011, will require a 15 percent reduction of TN at sources contributing to exceedances of the criteria,

(c) The LA for nonpoint sources is to address anthropogenic sources in the basin such that in-stream concentrations meet the Class III marine dissolved oxygen and nutrient criteria which, based on the measured concentrations in the year 2011, will require a 15 percent reduction of TN at sources contributing to exceedances of the criteria, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the LA and WLA for TN have been expressed as the pounds allowed and the percent reductions needed to attain the applicable Class III criteria, it is the combined reductions

from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the required reduction of in-stream TN concentration. However, it is not the intent of the TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

(14) McKay Creek Tidal Segment. The TMDLs to address the low dissolved oxygen and nutrient impairments are an annual TN load of 15,563 lb/year and an annual 5-day BOD load of 32,505 lb/year and are allocated as follows:

(a) The WLA for wastewater sources is not applicable,

(b) The WLA for discharges subject to the Department's NPDES Municipal Stormwater Permitting Program is to address anthropogenic sources in the basin such that in-stream concentrations meet the dissolved oxygen criterion and nutrient criterion, expressed as a chlorophyll a target, which, based on the calculated loadings from the 2002-2011 period, will require a 45 percent reduction of TN and 45 percent reduction of 5-day BOD at sources contributing to exceedances of the criteria,

(c) The LAs for nonpoint sources are to address anthropogenic sources in the basin such that in-stream concentrations meet the dissolved oxygen criterion and nutrient criterion, expressed as a chlorophyll a target, which, based on the calculated loadings from the 2002–2011 period, will require a 45 percent reduction of TN and 45 percent reduction of 5-day BOD at sources contributing to exceedances of the criteria, and

(d) The Margin of Safety is implicit.

(e) While the LAs for TN and 5-day BOD have been expressed as the percent reductions needed to attain the applicable Class III criteria, it is the combined reductions from both anthropogenic point and nonpoint sources that will result in the required reduction of in-stream TN and 5-day BOD concentrations. However, it is not the intent of the TMDL to abate natural background conditions.

64C-2.004 Sliding Fee Scale.

(1) Subject to funding, Children's Medical Services (CMS) may pay for certain medical services to children with serious health care needs who do not qualify for Medicaid or Title XXI of the Social Security Act.

- (2) Semi-annually, families must participate in the cost of care based on the following sliding fee scale:
- (a) Families at or under 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$0 towards the cost of care:
- (b) Families between 201 and 250 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$25 towards the cost of care;
- (c) Families between 251 and 300 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$50 towards the cost of
- (d) Families between 301 and 400 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$150 towards the cost of care;
- (e) Families between 401 and 450 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$200 towards the cost of care; and
- (f) Families at or over 451 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines pay \$250 towards the cost of care.
- (3) CMS will calculate the family's percentage for (2) based on the annual taxable family income and family size. For purposes of this calculation, CMS will utilize the 2013 Federal Poverty Guidelines for the 48 Contiguous States and the District of Columbia, effective January 24, 2013, which is hereby incorporated by reference, and may be obtained at: http://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty/13poverty.shtlm or can be found at
- (4) Prior to receiving services covered through CMS, the family must produce documentation that the family has spent the amount indicated above in subsection (2), the sliding fee, towards the cost of care.
- (a) The family may submit proof of the amount spent by submitting a receipt, canceled check, credit card statement, provider invoice, or similar documentation, documenting payment has been received.
- (b) Proof of expenditure will only be accepted for any primary care or specialized services that are medically necessary or essential family support services for the enrolled child.
- (c) Proof of expenditure of the amount above in subsection (2), the sliding fee, must be submitted every six months to CMS.

Specifications shall incorporate the specific standards as approved by the State Board prior to and including the following years: 1965, 1966, 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, 1993, 1995, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2006, and 2008 revised. Copies of the Florida School Bus Specifications and the National School Transportation Specifications and Procedures May 2010 of the National Congress on School Transportation may be obtained by contacting above specifications are on file and available from the School Transportation Management Section, Florida Department of Education, 325 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399. Specifications may vary for different sizes and types of buses to meet specific needs and conditions. Bid forms prepared under the direction of the Commissioner shall incorporate basic specifications and equipment.
- (2) Any school district may, at its option, upgrade any school bus or buses with equipment meeting specifications which are current at the time of the upgrade.
