GENERAL SUBJECT MATTER TO BE CONSIDERED: Fidelity National Property & Casualty Insurance Company has requested an average statewide rate change of 28.1% for its homeowners program. The proposed rate would be effective August 1, 2013 for new business and September 25, 2013 for renewal business. The requested rate change is not uniform. Some areas are subject to higher rates.

#### FINAL ORDER

## APPROVING ISLAMORADA ORDINANCE NO. 12-13

Department The of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla. Stat. (2012), approving land development regulations adopted by Islamorada, Village of Islands, Florida, Ordinance No. 13-09 (the "Ordinance").

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by § 380.0552, Fla. Stat., as an area of critical state concern. Islamorada. Village of Islands, is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by Islamorada, Village of Islands, on February 14, 2013, and rendered to the Department on March 18, 2013.
- 3. The Ordinance amends the Village Code, Chapter 30, Land Development Regulations, Article II, Rules of Construction and Definitions, Section 30-32, Specific Definitions, and Article VII, Environmental Regulations, Division 3, Sea Turtle Nesting Protection. The Ordinance updates terminology and specific lighting standards to recognize advances in lighting technology and lighting fixtures that have occurred since the adoption of the initial environmental regulations.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11) and § 380.0552(9), Fla. Stat.
- 5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Fla. Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in § 380.0552(7), Fla. Stat.

- 7. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development as a whole and specifically furthers the following Principles:
- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (b) Protecting shoreline and marine resources, including mangroves, coral reef formations, seagrass beds, wetlands, fish and wildlife, and their habitat.
- (c) Protecting upland resources, tropical biological communities, freshwater wetlands, native tropical vegetation (for example, hardwood hammocks and pinelands), dune ridges and beaches, wildlife, and their habitat.
- (h) Protecting the value, efficiency, cost-effectiveness, and amortized life of existing and proposed major public investments, including:
  - 6. Federal parks, wildlife refuges, and marine sanctuaries;
- 7. State parks, recreation facilities, aquatic preserves, and other publicly owned properties.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with Goal 5-1 and Objective 5-1.1 and implementing policies of the Islamorada, Village of Islands, Comprehensive Plan.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Islamorada, Village of Islands, Ordinance No. 13-09 is found to be consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Order becomes effective twenty-one (21) calendar days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
