61M-1.002 Claims Procedures

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose and effect of the proposed rule amendment to Rule 61M-1.002, F.A.C. (Claims Procedures) will be to set forth a specific timeframe within which a mobile home owner must redeem a voucher received from the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation. Currently, there is no specific timeframe or deadline. The addition of a specific timeframe within which vouchers must be redeemed will allow the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation to better measure its future financial obligations.

The Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation will also address proposed amendments to FORM 1001, FORM 1002, FORM 1004, and FORM 1007. The purpose and effect of the proposed amendments to the forms is as follows: (1) to obtain additional contact information from applicants so that the Florida Mobile Home Relocation Corporation can contact applicants; (2) to correct an error on Form 1001 which conflicts with Rule 61M-1.002 (Claims Procedures) by giving applicants the option of submitting a signed contract with an installer with their application for relocation expenses; (3) to revise Form 1004 to give additional notice to mobile home owners that vouchers must be redeemed within a specific timeframe; and (4) to make minor grammatical changes and revisions for clarity.

# FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Freshwater Fish and Wildlife

RULE NO.: RULE TITLE:

68A-13.004 Open Season for Taking and Bag Limits for Non-Migratory Game, Issuance of Antlerless Deer Permits and Private Lands Deer Management Permits

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule amendment is to allow private land owners and individuals hunting wild turkey on private land and certain public lands greater flexibility in the harvest of wild turkey by changing the daily bag limit from one to the season limit of two; and to better align the zonal deer hunting seasons in south Florida with deer breeding chronology. The effect of the proposed rule amendment will be to allow the seasonal bag limit of two wild turkey to be taken in a single day on private lands and those public lands not otherwise managed under the Commission's wildlife management area system; and to move portions of Zone A into Zone C so that the zonal deer hunting seasons in those areas affected by the change would better align with deer breeding chronology.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment would change the daily bag limit for wild turkey from one to two and allow hunters on private land and public lands not otherwise managed under the Commission's wildlife management area system to harvest the seasonal bag limit of two in a single day. The daily bag limit would remain one turkey per hunter on wildlife management areas, wildlife and environmental areas and miscellaneous areas to aid in distributing harvest of the turkey resource among different hunters. The proposed rule amendment would also modify the zonal boundary between Zone A and Zone C to move portions of Zone A into Zone C so that the zonal deer hunting seasons in those areas affected by the change would better align with deer breeding chronology. Fall turkey seasons in the affected area would follow the new zonal seasons. Spring turkey seasons and all seasons for wildlife management areas and wildlife and environmental areas that lie in the proposed area of change would be unaffected by the proposed zonal line change.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

68A-13.004 Open Season for Taking and Bag Limits for Non-Migratory Game, Issuance of Antlerless Deer Permits and Private Lands Deer Management Permits.

The open season and bag limits for non-migratory game shall be as follows unless otherwise amended by the Commission, provided that regulations for hunting on wildlife management areas shall be as established by specific rule.

(1) Bag and possession limits:

(a) No change.

(b) Turkey: daily bag, 2 +; spring season bag, 2 (except in Holmes County where the bag shall be 1); all fall seasons combined bag, 2; possession limit, 2.

- (c) No change.
- (2) Open seasons:
- (a) Antlered deer:

1. Zone A comprised of the counties of Broward, Charlotte (east of the Peace River and east Charlotte Harbor), Collier (except that portion lying south of State Road 84, west of State Road 29, north of U.S. Highway 41 and east of the western boundary of the Fakahatchee Strand State Preserve where there will be no open season), Dade, DeSoto (south of State Road 70 and east of the Peace River), Glades, Hendry, Highlands (south of State Road 70), Lee, Martin (west of U.S. Highway 441), Manatee (south of State Road 70), Monroe (except in the Florida Keys where there will be no open season), Okeechobee (south of State Road 70 and west of U.S. Highway 441), and Palm Beach (except that portion lying east of U.S. Highway 441, east of State Road 80 north of County Road 880, north of County Road 880, and north of U.S. Highway 98/U.S. Highway 441/State Road 80/Southern Boulevard), St. Lucie (south of State Road 70) and Sarasota: Opening the third Saturday in September and closing 29 days thereafter and reopening the Saturday before the fourth Thursday in November and closing the first Sunday in January.

3. Zone C comprised of the counties of Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Brevard, Citrus, Clay, <u>Charlotte (except east of the</u> <u>Peace River and east Charlotte Harbor)</u>, Columbia, DeSoto (north of State Road 70, and west of the Peace River south of <u>State Road 70</u>), Dixie, Duval, Flagler, Gadsden (east of U.S. Highway 27), Gilchrist, Hamilton, Hardee, Hernando (north of State Road 50), Highlands (north of State Road 70),

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Hillsborough (south of State Road 60), Indian River, Jefferson, Lafayette, Lake, Leon (east of U.S. Highway 27, east of State Road 61 and east of U.S. Highway 319), Levy, Madison, Manatee (north of State Road 70), Marion, Martin (east of U.S. Highway 441), Nassau, Okeechobee (except that portion lying south of State Road 70 and west of U.S. Highway 441 north of State Road 70), Orange (north of State Road 50 and east of U.S. Highway 17), Osceola (east of U.S. Highway 17, north and east of County Road 525, east of the western shoreline of Lake Tohopekaliga, east of C-35 canal, east of the western shoreline of Cypress Lake, east of C-36 canal and east of the eastern shoreline of Lake Hatchineha), Palm Beach (east of U.S. Highway 441, east of State Road 80 north of County Road 880, north of County Road 880, and north of U.S. Highway 98/U.S. Highway 441/State Road 80/Southern Boulevard), Pinellas (south of State Road 60), Polk (south of State Road 60), Putnam, St. Johns, St. Lucie (north of State Road 70), Sarasota, Seminole, Sumter (north of State Road 50), Suwannee, Taylor, Union, Volusia and Wakulla (east of U.S. Highway 319, north and east of U.S. Highway 98 and east of the Wakulla and St. Marks Rivers): Opening the first Saturday in November closing 78 days thereafter.

In addition to the season specified in sub-subparagraph a. above, a "Youth Turkey Hunt" shall open on the last Saturday of February and close 1 day thereafter <u>south of State</u> <u>Road 70</u> in Zone A and open the second Saturday of March and close 1 day thereafter <u>north of State Road 70</u> in Zones B, <u>C and D</u>. Only youth under 16 years of age may hunt and must be under the supervision and in the presence of an adult not younger than 18 years of age. Adults with required license and permits for taking wild turkeys or otherwise exempt from these requirements by Section 379.353, F.S., may participate in the hunt when in the presence of at least one youth under 16 years of age. Adults shall not take wildlife with a gun.

RULE NO.:RULE TITLE:68A-15.004General Regulations Relating to Wildlife<br/>Management Areas

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule amendment is to retain a daily bag limit of one per day for wild turkey on wildlife management areas to aid in distributing harvest of the resource among different individuals where the Commission regulates hunter access; and keep the season when bobcat may be harvested on wildlife management areas as December 1 through March 1. The effect of the proposed rule amendment would maintain a daily bag limit of one turkey per day and allow the harvest of bobcat from December 1 through March 1 on wildlife management areas.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment would maintain a daily limit of one turkey per day on wildlife management areas to aid in distributing the harvest among different individuals where the Commission regulates hunter access; and clarify that bobcat may only be harvested from December 1 through March 1.

Additionally, the proposed rule amendment would provide non-substantive technical changes, such as grammatical corrections, language standardization, or clarification of an existing rule.

(a) A wildlife management area permit as provided by Section <u>379.353</u> <del>379.354</del>, F.S., in addition to all regular license requirements, is required for persons, except those exempted in subsection (3) hereof, to take wildlife on a wildlife management area.

(b) through (d) No change.

(4) Legal to hunt:

(a) Turkeys may not be taken during any fall season in which firearms may be used unless otherwise provided for a specific area. Notwithstanding provisions in Rule 68A-13.004, F.A.C., turkeys of either sex may be taken during muzzleloading and general gun seasons as specifically provided by area rule. During periods in which the taking of turkey is allowed, the daily bag limit for turkey shall be one per day unless otherwise provided by specific area regulation. The hours in which the hunting of gobblers or bearded turkeys is permitted during the spring season shall be from one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.

(b) through (f) No change.

(g) <u>Notwithstanding the provisions in Rule 68A-24.002</u>, the take of bobcat with a gun is prohibited from March 2 through March 31. Fox squirrels may not be taken.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule amendment is to revise specific area regulations on miscellaneous areas and conform to calendar year date changes. The effect of the proposed rule amendment will be to enable the agency to better manage fish and wildlife resources and public use on WMAs.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment would adjust season dates to conform to calendar year changes and revise specific area regulations on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) in the Southwest Region as follows:

Avon Park Air Force Range WMA – allow wild hog hunts to be established by the Installation Commander.

Chassahowitzka WMA – prohibit the harvest of antlerless deer during archery season, except by antlerless deer permit.

Green Swamp WMA – open the check station and campground at the Rock Ridge Road entrance during wild hog-dog season (the Highway 471 entrance, check station and campground will remain open).

Green Swamp WMA, West Unit – prohibit the use of generators powered by internal combustion engines in the campground from 10 p.m. until 4 a.m.; move wild hog-still season from December to October and wild hog-dog season from January to October; move special-opportunity archery hunts from November to December to better coincide with the rut; and allow the harvest of bobcat and otter during special-opportunity archery, special-opportunity general gun and small game seasons.

Hickory Hammock – allow persons with authorization from the South Florida Water Management District vehicle access; and limit vehicle use to named roads and parking areas.

Upper Hillsborough WMA – allow the use of air guns for hunting gray squirrel and rabbit during small game season; allow the use of crossbows for hunting turkey during spring turkey season; and allow vehicle access for scouting from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. one day prior to each archery, muzzleloading gun and spring turkey hunt.

Walk-in-the-Water WMA – remove the quota permit requirement for wild hog-still season.

Weekiwachee WMA – prohibit the harvest of any wildlife with shotguns during the archery season.

Additionally, the proposed rule amendment would provide non-substantive technical changes, such as grammatical corrections, language standardization, or clarification of an existing rule.

Specific Regulations for Wildlife Management Areas – North Central Region

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule amendment is to revise specific area regulations on wildlife management areas (WMAs) in the North Central Region and conform to calendar year date changes. The effect of the proposed rule amendment will be to enable the agency to better manage fish and wildlife resources and public use on WMAs.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendments would adjust season dates to conform to calendar year changes and revise specific area regulations on wildlife management areas (WMAs) in the North Central Region as follows:

Andrews WMA – increase the quota for family hunts from 20 to 30 (no exemptions).

Big Bend WMA, Jena Unit – prohibit the use of vehicles on Road 2 from May 1 until two days before the opening of archery season.

Big Bend WMA, Snipe Island Unit – allow the use of horses year round.

Big Bend WMA, Tide Swamp Unit – remove the requirement for persons to enter and exit the area through a designated check station.

Cypress Creek WMA – expand small game season from 16 to 55 days.

Flying Eagle WMA – allow the harvest of otter.

Goethe WMA – establish a 2-day family hunt (quota of 75, no exemptions); allow the harvest of all legal game, wild hog, fish, frogs and furbearers during the family hunt; allow a bag limit for deer of one antlered and one antlerless deer per quota permit during the family hunt; prohibit the use of dogs for

hunting during the family hunt; expand small game season from 23 to 30 days; and allow the harvest of raccoon and opossum at night during small game season by persons possessing a Special Use Authorization for access from the Florida Forest Service.

Gulf Hammock WMA – change muzzleloading gun season to archery/muzzleloading gun season; establish a 30-day small game season; and prohibit the use of dogs for hunting wild hog during small game season.

Jennings Forest WMA - allow the harvest of bobcat and otter.

Little River WMA – establish a 2-day youth spring turkey hunt (quota of 5, no exemptions) and two 3-day spring turkey hunts (quota of 5, no exemptions); and allow a bag limit during spring turkey season of one gobbler or bearded turkey per person, but no more than two per quota permit.

Mallory Swamp WMA – expand wild hog-dog season from 3 to 16 days; and prohibit the use of dogs for hunting wild hog in the still hunt area.

Potts WMA – allow the harvest of bobcat and otter.

Ralph E. Simmons Memorial WMA – prohibit public access from 1.5 hours after sunset until 1.5 hours before sunrise; and remove the requirement to park vehicles at designated parking areas.

Steinhatchee Springs WMA – expand small game season from 30 to 37 days; begin small game season 21 days earlier; and expand wild hog-dog season from two to three 3-day quota hunts (quota of 55, no exemptions).

Twin Rivers WMA – establish a 2-day family hunt (quota of 15, no exemptions) with a bag limit of one antlered and one antlerless deer per quota permit; expand general gun season from one 4-day hunt and one 7-day hunt to two 7-day hunts; and begin general gun season two days later.

Additionally, the proposed rule amendments would provide non-substantive technical changes, such as grammatical corrections, language standardization, or clarification of an existing rule.

#### SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

68A-15.063 Specific Regulations for Wildlife

Management Areas - Northwest Region

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of the proposed rule amendment is to revise specific area regulations on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) in the Northwest Region and conform to calendar year date changes. The effect of the proposed rule amendment will be to enable the agency to better manage fish and wildlife resources and public use on WMAs.

SUMMARY: The proposed rule amendment would adjust season dates to conform to calendar year changes and revise specific area regulations on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) in the Northwest Region as follows:

Apalachicola WMA – allow the harvest of bearded turkey or gobbler during the muzzleloading gun season.

Apalachicola WMA, Bradwell Unit – begin the July wild hogdog hunt 7 days later.

Aucilla WMA – establish five 3-day wild hog-dog hunts (no quota permit required).

Blackwater WMA – establish ten 3-day wild hog-dog hunts (two per month from May through September, no quota permit required); change the bag limit for deer during the archery/muzzleloading gun season in the Field Trial Area from one deer per day to one antlered and one antlerless deer per day; and expand dove season in the Field Trial Area to include the entire statewide dove season on posted dove fields. Blackwater WMA, Carr Unit – remove the requirement for hunters to sign in and out of the area and record all harvested game.

Blackwater WMA, Hutton Unit – establish two 2-day dove hunts (quota of 40, issued first come, first served at the check station each day, no exemptions); and allow one person under the age of 16 to accompany an adult dove permit holder and hunt under the supervision and in the presence of the permit holder, provided they may each take one bag limit of dove.

Box-R WMA – increase the quota during wild hog-dog hunts from 10 to 20 (no exemptions); extend legal hunting hours during the wild hog-dog season from sunset until sunrise to sunset until 10 a.m.; and remove the requirement for hunters to check in and out at a check station and check harvested game during wild hog-dog, spring turkey, and dove seasons.

Point Washington WMA – change the quota during general gun season from one quota hunt (first 13 days and last 17 days, quota of 150, no exemptions), to two quota hunts (first 13 days and last 17 days, quota of 150 per hunt, no exemptions).

Additionally, the proposed rule amendment would provide non-substantive technical changes, such as grammatical corrections, language standardization, or clarification of an existing rule.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Florida Department of Environmental Protection is considering the option of retaining legal counsel from a private law firm or firms to co-counsel with or represent the Department in pending negotiations, mediations, and potential lawsuits relating to recovery of overpayment of "reimbursement" claims submitted to the Department for clean-up of petroleum contamination from leaking underground storage tanks. The Department is now soliciting information regarding these services.

### BACKGROUND

In 1986, the Florida Legislature adopted a program, the Early Detection Incentive Program, to encourage the clean-up of sites contaminated by leaks of petroleum from underground storage tanks. Additional petroleum cleanup programs were subsequently enacted by the legislature. Until 1995, the primary means of paying for the cleanup of eligible sites was the "reimbursement program." Responsible parties for site rehabilitation would perform site assessment and remediation tasks, and would apply to the Department to be reimbursed for reasonable costs incurred in the process.

The Department has been made aware that a number of large site owners that participated in the reimbursement program may have been significantly overpaid for the costs of site rehabilitation at numerous contaminated sites. The Department is in the process of negotiating with these site owners for recovery of funds that may have been inappropriately paid and is seeking a law firm with the expertise and the resources to expeditiously move these claims forward to resolution.

• Knowledge of, and experience with, Florida's environmental regulations and clean-up programs
