(3) Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree. Every associate in arts graduate of a Florida College System institution shall be granted admission to the upper division of a public postsecondary institution consistent with Section 1007.23, F.S. Admission to the student's preferred public postsecondary institution or program is not guaranteed. The associate in arts degree is defined in subsection 6A-14.030(2), F.A.C.,(insert link) (effective March 25, 2013, and may be obtained from the

Office of Articulation, Florida Department of Education, 325 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399) which definition is incorporated by reference herein, and for purposes of this agreement, shall include:

(3)(a) Completion of sixty (60) semester hours of college credit courses in an established program of study that includes a general education curriculum of thirty-six (36) semester hours of college credit in communication, mathematics, social sciences, humanities, and natural sciences and foreign language competence as described in Rule 6A-10.02412, F.A.C., (insert link) (Effective June 25, 2014, and may be obtained from the Office of Articulation, Florida Department of Education, 325 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399) which is incorporated by reference herein. The sixty (60) semester hours that comprise a completed associate in arts degree shall be accepted in total upon transfer to an upper division program at another public postsecondary institution.

(5) Associate in Science (A.S.) Degree. The associate in science degree is defined in Rule 6A-14.030(3), F.A.C., (insert link) (effective March 25, 2013, and may be obtained from the Office of Articulation, Florida Department of Education, 325 West Gaines Street, Tallahassee, Florida 32399) which definition is incorporated by reference herein, and for purposes of this agreement shall include:

(5)(c) Completion of common prerequisites, pursuant to Section 1007.25(5), F.S., will be required for the baccalaureate degree or as otherwise outlined in program specific statewide agreements.

Subsequent paragrapghs are renumbered accordingly.

(6)(a) Students must have a high school diploma, a high school equivalency diploma, or a certificate of completion pursuant to Section 1003.433(2)(b), F.S.; to be admitted to an applied technology diploma program; home education students may be admitted pursuant to Section 1007.263, F.S. or in the case of a student who is home educated, a signed affidavit submitted by the student's parent or legal guardian attesting that the student has completed a home education program pursuant to the requirements of Section 1002.41, F.S., to be admitted to an applied technology diploma program. Within six (6) weeks of entry, students in applied technology diploma programs of 450 or more hours must be tested pursuant to Rule 6A-10.040, F.A.C., and, if below minimum standards for completion from

the program as defined in the program standards document adopted in Rule 6A-6.0571, F.A.C., must receive remedial instruction. The minimum standards must be at least the equivalent of a score of ten (10) on all sections of any basic skills test approved in Rule 6A-10.040, F.A.C. Students must successfully complete all remedial instruction before completing the A.T.D.

(7)(f) For all Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE), and College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) examinations, credit must be awarded at a minimum in accordance with the credit-by-examinations equivalencies determined by the Articulation Coordinating Committee, referenced in paragraph (7)(a) of this rule pursuant to Section 1007.27, F.S. The postsecondary institution shall determine the credit awarded for examinations completed prior to November 1, 2001, or examinations not included in the Articulation Coordinating Committee Credit-by-Examination Equivalencies.

(7)(g) All credit by examination that is initially awarded based on <u>Articulation Coordinating Committee</u> (ACC) recommended minimum scores and maximum amount of credit is guaranteed to transfer and must be accepted by all public postsecondary institutions.

(f) On or before the effective date of changes to the Florida Building Code, Florida Statutes or rule relating to the Florida Building Code, providers shall update existing accredited courses affected by the code, law or rule changes pursuant to paragraph subsection (3)(g) and submit for accreditation on the Building Code Information System at http://www.floridabuilding.org/ce/ce\_default.aspx. the If course is not updated, the course expires and cannot be updated. The code version, law or rule that initiated the update and reaccreditation process must be noted on the application. Accreditation of revisions to approved accredited courses shall be accomplished in the same manner as described in paragraphs (a) through (f) hereof, except only the revision submitted shall be subject to review. These courses shall be approved by the administrator of the education program subject to ratification by the Florida Building Commission.

(g) No change.

(h) If an approved accredited course requires only one change to correct or update a reference, table, diagram, or quoted provision of code, law, or administrative rule, the training provider may self-affirm by completing Form FBCED 2003-03 FBC ED 002 (adopted above in paragraph (3)(b) subparagraph (3)(a)). The same change may be made in more than one place in the course. The code version, law or administrative rule must be noted on the application. The training provider must list the exact correction or update, the specific location of the correction or update, and reason for the change in the course. The code to the course shall be approved by the administrator of the education program subject to ratification by the Florida Building Commission.

(i) If an approved accredited course is not affected by the code, law, or administrative rule change, and no change is required, but a licensure or other board requires an updated version of the course, the training provider may self-affirm by completing Form <u>FBCED 2003-03</u> FBC ED 002 (adopted above in <u>paragraph (3)(b)</u> subparagraph (3)(a)). The code version must be noted on the application. The course shall be approved by the administrator of the education program subject to ratification by the Florida Building Commission.

(j) through (k) No change.

(4) Course Content and Accreditor Review. Accreditors shall review courses submitted by registered providers to determine if the course accurately presents the technical and administrative responsibilities reflected in the law, administrative rule, current edition of the Florida Building Code or future editions approved for adoption by the Florida Building Commission. If a course is impacted by any subsequent changes to the updates approved for adoption by the Florida Building Commission, the provider is responsible for revising the course to comply with the Florida Building Code in accordance with paragraphs (3)(f) through (j). Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 40, No. 183, September 19, 2014 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

Pursuant to written comments received from the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee in a letter dated March 5, 2014, the Department has changed certain statutory citations and rule references contained in proposed Rule 69L-7.501, Florida Administrative Code, and in the proposed 2014 Edition of the Florida Workers' Compensation Reimbursement Manual for Hospitals ("Manual"), which the proposed rule incorporates by reference. The statement, "A SERC has been prepared by the Agency," was included under the "Summary of Statement of Regulatory Costs and Legislative Ratification," section of the above-cited notice. That statement should have stated that "A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency." However, as stated in the Notice of Proposed Rule, an economic analysis was conducted, as required. Additional changes to the proposed rule and Manual, which is incorporated by reference, reflect the terms of a Settlement Agreement between the Petitioners in rule challenge litigation and the Department of Financial Services, as Respondent.

The proposed 2014 Edition of the Manual includes a fee schedule reimbursement methodology for hospital outpatient services based on Current Procedural Terminology ("CPT") line level charge data held by the Division of Workers' Compensation, which is then adjusted based on a modification factor specified for defined geographic areas in Florida. The aforementioned Settlement Agreement requires the Department to increase the threshold number of bills used to determine the "Base Rate" of the applicable CPT procedure codes from no less than twenty (20) bills, to no less than forty (40) bills. The proposed rule is changed to read as follows:

69L-7.501 Florida Workers' Compensation Reimbursement Manual for Hospitals.

(1) The Florida Workers' Compensation Reimbursement Manual for Hospitals ("Manual"), 2014 2006 Edition, effective January 1, 2015, is adopted by reference as part of this rule. The Hospital Manual contains the Maximum Reimbursement Allowances (MRAs) determined by the Three-Member Panel, pursuant to subsection 440.13(12), F.S., and establishes policy, procedures, principles and standards for implementing statutory provisions regarding reimbursement for medically necessary services and supplies provided to injured workers in a hospital setting. The policy, procedures, principles and standards in the Manual are in addition to the requirements established by the Florida Workers' Compensation Medical Services Billing, Filing and Reporting Rule, Rule 69L-7.710 602, F.A.C. (2) The Florida Workers' Compensation Health Care Provider Reimbursement Manual ("HCP RM") [HCP RM], 2006, incorporated by reference into Rule 69L-7.020, F.A.C.; and the Workers' Compensation Medical Services Billing, Filing and Reporting Rule, Rule 69L-7.710 602, F.A.C., are recognized for use in conjunction with the Florida Workers' Compensation Reimbursement Manual for Hospitals, 2014 Edition, effective January 1, 2015 also incorporated by reference into this rule.
