1. Subsection (2) shall now read as follows:

(2) Permittees are required to complete a United States Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) Form DEA-41 "Registrants Inventory of Drugs Surrendered" (effective 8/21/2014), herein incorporated by reference, available at http://www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/21cfr_reports/surrend/.

This form, at the time of destruction, shall be witnessed and signed by the prescription department manager or the consultant pharmacist of record and D.E.A. agent, or a Department inspector. This method of destruction requires that a copy of the completed and witnessed Form DEA-41 be mailed to the D.E.A. office in his/her area within one (1) business day after the destruction.

2. For subsection (3), the form number will be changed to from "D.E.A. Form 41" to "Form DEA-41".

3. Subsection (5) shall now read as follows:

(5) For patient specific controlled substance prescriptions in a Modified Institutional Class II B pharmacy, the destruction method in subsection 64B16-28.301(2), F.A.C., must be followed.

FINAL ORDER

APPROVING LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2013-69

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat., approving Lake County Ordinance No. 2013-69 ("Ordinance") as it relates to the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is a statutorily designated area of critical state concern.

§ 380.0551, Fla. Stat. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the Lake County Board of County Commissioners on December 17, 2013, and was rendered to the Department on December 27, 2013.

3. The Ordinance amends the Lake County Land Development Regulations, Lake County Code Appendix E, to update resource protection standards within Chapter VI. The Ordinance amends definitions in Chapter II. The Ordinance further amends Chapter XIV by adding easement dedication in Section 14.00.08 which requires that specific legal criteria be met before dedication of real property right-of-way, and creating Section 14.15.04 to identify standards for granting a variance to the setback requirement from the ordinary high water line, mean high water line, or jurisdictional wetland line.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are enacted, amended or rescinded by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat.

5. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. § 380.0551, Fla. Stat., and Rule Chapter 28-26, Fla. Admin. Code.

6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building and other regulations controlling the

development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.; see Rathkamp v. Department of Community Affairs, 21 F.A.L.R. 1902 (Dec. 4, 1998), aff[°]d, 740 So. 2d 1209 (Fla. 3d DCA 1999). The principles for guiding development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003, Fla. Admin. Code. ("Principles").

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles in Rule 28-26.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code, as a whole and specifically furthers the following Principles:

(a) Minimize the adverse impacts of development on resources of the Floridan Aquifer, wetlands, and flood-detention areas.

(b) Protect the normal quantity, quality and flow of ground water and surface water which are necessary for the protection of resources of state and regional concern.

9. The Ordinance is consistent with Policies 1-4.3.1, 1-4.3.2, 1-4.3.8, 1-5.1.3, and 1-7.4.6 in the Lake County Comprehensive Plan.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the land development regulations in Ordinance No. 2013-69 are consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and are hereby APPROVED.

Stat., approving in part and rejecting in part the land development regulations adopted by Lake County Ordinance No. 2013-64 ("Ordinance") as it relates to the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is a statutorily designated area of critical state concern.

§ 380.0551, Fla. Stat. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the Lake County Board of County Commissioners on December 17, 2013, and was rendered to the Department on December 27, 2013.

3. The Ordinance amends the Lake County Land Development Regulations, Lake County Code Appendix E, Chapter II entitled "Definitions" to ad definitions of Annual Average Daily Traffic, Low Impact Development, Passive Recreation, Primitive Camping, Rural Character, and Small-Scale Sporting and Recreational Camp Activities (applicable in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern only). The Ordinance also repeals and replaces Chapter VIII entitled "Green Swamp."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are enacted, amended or rescinded by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat.

5. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. § 380.0551, Fla. Stat., and Rule Chapter 28-26, Fla. Admin. Code.

6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.; see Rathkamp v. Department of Community Affairs, 21 F.A.L.R. 1902 (Dec. 4, 1998), aff'd, 740 So. 2d 1209 (Fla. 3d DCA 1999). The principles for guiding

development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003, Fla. Admin. Code. ("Principles").

8. Except for Section 8.01.05 of the Land Development Regulations related to the Green Swamp, the Ordinance is consistent with the Principles in Rule 28-26.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code, as a whole and furthers the following Principles:

(a) Minimize the adverse impacts of development on resources of the Floridan Aquifer, wetlands, and flood-detention areas.

(b) Protect the normal quantity, quality and flow of ground water and surface water which are necessary for the protection of resources of state and regional concern.

(c) Protect the water available for aquifer recharge.

(d) Protect the functions of the Green Swamp Potentiometric High of the Floridan Aquifer.

(e) Protect the normal supply of ground and surface water.

(g) Protect or improve existing ground and surface-water quality.

(h) Protect the water-retention capabilities of wetlands.

(i) Protect the biological-filtering capabilities of wetlands.

9. Except for Section 8.01.05 of the Land Development Regulations, the Ordinance is consistent with Policies 1-4.1.2, 1-4.1.5, 1-4.2.1, Objective 1-4.3, and Policies 1-4.3.1, 1-4.3.2, 1-4.3.8, 1-4.4.4, 1-5.1.3, and 1-7.4.6 in the Lake County Comprehensive Plan.

10. Section 8.01.05 of the Land Development Regulations related to the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern, as adopted by the Ordinance, allows sand mining in all areas of the Green Swamp, including the Ridge Future Land Use Category. As it relates to the Ridge Future Land Use Category, section 8.01.05 is not consistent with the following Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern in Rule 28-26.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code:

(b) Protect the normal quantity, quality and flow of ground water and surface water which are necessary for the protection of resources of state and regional concern.

(j) Protect the natural flow regime of drainage basins.

11. The Department also notes that Section 8.01.05 of the Land Development Regulations, as adopted by the Ordinance, is not consistent with Policies 1-4.2.1 and 1-4.2.2 in the Lake County Comprehensive Plan that do not allow mining in the Ridge Future Land Use Category.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that, except for Section 8.01.05, the land development regulations in Ordinance No. 2013-64 are consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and are hereby APPROVED. Section 8.01.05 of the land development regulations as adopted by Ordinance No. 2013-64 is not consistent with the Principles for Guiding

Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby REJECTED.

FINAL ORDER APPROVING CITY OF KEY WEST ORDINANCE NO. 13-25

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat., approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West, Florida, Ordinance No. 13-25 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

The City of Key West is designated as an area of critical state concern pursuant to § 380.05(1), Fla. Stat., and Chapter 28-36, Fla. Admin. Code. Land development regulations adopted by the City of Key West do not become effective until approved by the Department by final order. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat.

The Ordinance was adopted by the City of Key West on December 3, 2013.

The Ordinance amends the City's Code of Ordinances, Chapter 122 of the Land Development Regulations, Sections 122-756 through 122-760, 122-966 through 122-970, 122-1111, and 122-1151 to amend the HRCC-4 and HPS-1 zoning districts and conditional use provisions related to development of the Truman Waterfront. In particular, the Ordinance provides that parks and recreational activities, community centers, cultural centers, and civic activities, and commercial and retail are permitted uses in the HRCC-4 and HPS-1 zoning districts applicable to Truman Waterfront; makes waterfront restaurants and food service uses conditional uses; removes references to the Harbor; deletes industrial and marine, boat, and sales activities as allowed uses; modifies height restrictions, lot coverage, floor area ratio, front setbacks, and rear setbacks; and deletes minimum lot size requirements.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat.

"Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat. The Principles for Guiding Development for the City of Key West Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-36.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code ("Principles").

The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles as a whole and specifically furthers the following Principles in Rule 28-36.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code:

(a) Strengthen local government capabilities for managing land use and development.

(h) Protection of the public health, safety, welfare, and economy of the City of Key West, and the maintenance of Key West as a unique Florida resource.

The Ordinance is consistent with the City of Key West Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Element Policy 1-1.1.8.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that City of Key West Ordinance No. 13-25 is found to be consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the City of Key West Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.

APPROVING LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2013-67

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat., approving Lake County Ordinance No. 2013-67 ("Ordinance") as it relates to the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is a statutorily designated area of critical state concern.

§ 380.0551, Fla. Stat. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area.

2. The Ordinance was adopted by the Lake County Board of County Commissioners on December 26, 2013, and was rendered to the Department on December 31, 2013.

3. The Ordinance amends the Lake County Land Development Regulations, Lake County Code, Appendix E, to add a definition for chicken coop, and to amend Chapter X entitled "Accessory and Temporary Structures and Uses," to create section 10.01.06 "Backyard Chickens." The Ordinance allows chickens and other roosters for personal use as an accessory use within the Estate Residential (R-2), Medium Residential (R-3), Medium Suburban Residential (R-4), Urban Residential (R-6), Mixed Residential (R-7), and Mixed Home Residential (RM) future land use districts; and provides criteria for such use including criteria for chicken coops or fenced enclosures to house chickens.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are enacted, amended or rescinded by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. §§ 380.05(6) and (11), Fla. Stat.

5. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. § 380.0551, Fla. Stat., and Rule Chapter 28-26, Fla. Admin. Code.

6. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building and other regulations controlling the development of land. § 380.031(8), Fla. Stat. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

7. All land development regulations enacted, amended or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. § 380.05(6), Fla. Stat.; see Rathkamp v. Department of Community Affairs, 21 F.A.L.R. 1902 (Dec. 4, 1998), aff'd, 740 So. 2d 1209 (Fla. 3d DCA 1999). The principles for guiding development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003, Fla. Admin. Code. ("Principles").

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles in Rule 28-26.003(1), Fla. Admin. Code, as a whole and is not inconsistent with any Principle.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the land development regulations in Ordinance No. 2013-67 are consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and are hereby APPROVED.
