PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Each license-exempt school readiness provider is statutorily required to complete and post

a health and safety checklist that is adopted by the Office of Early Learning. This rule adopts and incorporates by reference health and safety checklists for each type of license-exempt school readiness provider.

SUMMARY: This new proposed rule is required to incorporate by reference new forms - OEL-SR-HSC-62NPS (April 2014) entitled "Health and Safety Checklist for Non-Public Schools"; form OEL-SR-HSC-62FB (April 2014) entitled: Health and Safety Checklist for Faith-Based Child Care Providers (Religious-Exempt)" and form OEL-SR-HSC-62IF (April 2014) entitled "Health and Safety Checklist for Informal Child Care Providers" that the Office of Early Learning is required to adopt pursuant to Chapter 2013-252, Laws of Florida. All school readiness providers must provide basic health and safety of its premises and facilities. The following school readiness providers: non-public schools, faith-based (religious-exempt) providers, and informal providers, are exempt from licensure and as such cannot satisfy this requirement through compliance with Department of Children and Families' statutory requirements. In place of this, a new requirement was placed in law requiring non-public schools, faith-based (religiousexempt) providers, and informal providers to annually complete a Health and Safety Checklist that is adopted by the Office of Early Learning. The checklist must be posted in a prominent location on the provider's premises and submitted to the appropriate early learning coalition.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has been prepared by the Agency.

Regarding Rule 6M-4.620, F.A.C., it is estimated that, over the course of five years, this rule will have a total cost impact of approximately \$24,750. This estimate is based on calculation (\$10.00\$ staff salary x .5 hour x 825 providers + <math>\$1.00\$ per provider for mail and processing = <math>\$4,950\$ total cost per year. The cost impact to affected providers would be approximately \$6.00\$ per provider per year.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: is the statement of estimated regulatory costs.

The proposed rule is being developed because: 7 CFR Parts 210 and 220, The National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program provide regulations to establish nutrition standards for all foods sold in schools, other than food sold under the lunch and breakfast programs. Amendments made by Section 208 of Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 (HHFKA) require the USDA to establish nutrition standards for such foods, consistent with the most recent Dietary Guidelines

for Americans, and directs the USDA to implement an authoritative scientific recommendations for nutrition standards for: existing school nutrition standards, including voluntary standards for beverages and snack foods; current State and local standards; the practical application of the nutrition standards; and special exemptions for infrequent school-sponsored fundraisers (other than fundraising through vending machines, school stores, snack bars, a 'la carte sales and any other exclusions determined by USDA). When the Florida rule was adopted the federal rules did not regulate all foods on campus during the school day and therefore it was important for Florida to create guidance on the allowance of competitive foods. The federal rule gives specific nutritional standards for competitive foods on campus and specific guidance on when those foods can be sold and takes into account the most recent dietary guidelines and is more comprehensive and concise than the Florida rule. This rule is expected to improve the health and well-being of the Nation's children, increase consumption of healthful foods during the school day, and create an environment that reinforces the development of healthy eating habits.
