PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to adopt revised minimum and guidance levels for Big Fish Lake located in Pasco County. The effect of the rule is to support the District’s water supply planning, water use permitting, and environmental resource permitting programs.
SUMMARY: Section 373.042, F.S., requires the District to establish minimum flows and levels for lakes, wetlands, rivers and aquifers within the District’s boundaries. Section 373.0421(3), F.S., further requires the District to periodically reevaluate and revise adopted minimum flows and levels. This rulemaking is necessary to delete the previously adopted levels, and adopt new guidance and minimum levels for Big Fish Lake located in Pasco County. The establishment and periodic evaluation of minimum levels is required by statute to ensure that the minimum hydrologic requirements of the water resources and ecology of this lake are maintained. The revised minimum and guidance levels for Big Fish Lake are being developed using previously peer-reviewed, Governing Board adopted methods.

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

(a) The documents ~~plans~~ shall be clear, with a symbols legend, system riser diagram showing all initiation and notification components, and cabling requirements. The documents shall indicate locations where fire ratings are required as determined by the system’s survivability requirements, and shall identify the general occupancy of the protected property, and for each room and area unless it is clear from features shown.

(d) Identify the Class ~~and Style~~ of circuits as listed in the NFPA 72, which is contained within and incorporated into the Florida Fire Prevention Code.

(i) The documents ~~plans~~ shall include a site plan of the immediate area around the protected building, structure or equipment when alarm devices are required outside the structure.
