- 3. The Ordinance amends the City of Marathon Code of Ordinances ("Code") by reserving Sections 3-45 through 3-49 within Chapter 3, Article III of the Code for future use.
- 4. The Ordinance amends the Code by creating a Section 3-50 and a Section 3-51 within Article IV, Chapter 3 of the Code.
- 5. Section 3-50, Article IV, Chapter 3 of the Code sets forth definitions for terms found in Article IV, Chapter 3 of the Code.
- 6. Section 3-51, Article IV, Chapter 3 of the Code establishes the Owner Occupied Building Permit Fee Grant Program

("Program") to increase the supply of affordable housing in the City of Marathon and assist in expanding the privilege of home ownership to individuals of low and moderate income levels by providing grant money to pay for building permit fees. The Ordinance further provides for funding, application, and administration requirements of the Program.
