Kitchen stoves, refrigerators, and freezers, unless contained in mobile campers, and Lumber, sheet metal or other building materials and the erection of any permanent structure are prohibited.

#### THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER18-9 February Scratch-Off Games Retailer Book Activation Promotion.

- (1) Beginning Monday, February 26, 2018, through Tuesday, February 27, 2018, the Florida Lottery will conduct the February Scratch-Off Games Retailer Book Activation Promotion ("Promotion") in which Florida Lottery retailers will have a chance to win \$2,000.
- (2) Florida Lottery retailers who activate at least one book of tickets of each of the four February Scratch-Off games (also known as instant games) set forth below by midnight ET on Tuesday, February 27, 2018, will receive one entry into one of eighteen drawings to be held on Friday, March 16, 2018. A retailer's entry will be entered into the applicable drawing in their district as further described in subsection (3) below. A retailer may only earn one entry per retailer location. The four February Scratch-Off games are:
  - (a) TRIPLE PAYOUT Game Number 1376;
  - (b) \$30,000 LUCKY WIN Game Number 1377;
  - (c) MONEY MACHINE Game Number 1378; and
  - (d) FLORIDA 100X THE CASH Game Number 1379.
- (3) Drawings and Prizes. The eighteen retailer drawings consist of two drawings per district (one corporate drawing and one independent drawing) in each of nine districts. Drawings

A retailer may only win one prize. Alternate entries will be drawn in each drawing. The number of alternate entries drawn will be twice the number of prizes to be awarded in that drawing. Alternate entries will be used as needed in the order in which they are drawn to award a prize in the event a retailer's entry is disqualified. Retailers will be subject to disqualification if the Florida Lottery determines that:

- (a) the retailer has requested that one or more of the qualifying books of tickets be deactivated;

- (a) the retailer submits a written request for inclusion in the drawing for receipt by the Florida Lottery by 5:00 p.m. ET on March 7, 2018; and
- (b) the retailer's request demonstrates to the Florida Lottery's satisfaction that failure of the retailer to timely activate the required book(s) was due to untimely delivery of inventory, through no fault of the retailer.

The Florida Lottery's determination regarding the retailer's request shall be final.

- (6) A retailer whose Florida Lottery contract is terminated or inactivated prior to prize payment will not be paid the prize if the termination or inactivation was due to non-compliance with Florida Lottery laws, rules or terms of the retailer contract.
- (7) A promotional prize is considered compensation to a retailer and will be reported to the Internal Revenue Service by the Florida Lottery.

(10) \$15,000,000 Top Prize and \$1,000,000 Prize Payment Options.

(a) A winner of a \$15,000,000 top prize or a \$1,000,000 prize may choose one of two payment options for receiving his or her prize. Payment options are "Cash Option" or "Annual Payment." At the time the \$15,000,000 top prize or \$1,000,0000 prize is claimed, the terminal will produce a player claim instructions ticket. The winner has sixty (60) days from the date the player claim instructions ticket is produced to file a claim choosing the Cash Option. If a winner does not choose the Cash Option within the sixty (60) day timeframe, the Annual Payment option will be applied. Once the winner files a claim and exercises the winner's chosen option, the election of that option shall be final. The Annual Payment method of payment will also be final when it is applied due to a top prize winner not making his or her payment election within sixty (60) days after the player claim instructions ticket is produced.

- (b) Cash Option prizes will be paid in a single cash payment.
- 1. A winner of a \$15,000,000 prize who elects the Cash Option shall receive a cash payment of \$11,175,000, less applicable federal withholding taxes.
- 2. A winner of a \$1,000,000 prize who elects the Cash Option shall receive a cash payment of \$770,000, less applicable federal withholding taxes.
- (c) Annual Payment prizes will be paid in twenty-five (25) equal annual installments.
- 1. A winner of a \$15,000,000 prize who elects the Annual Payment option shall receive annual installments of \$600,000 per year, less applicable federal withholding taxes.
- 2. A winner of a \$1,000,000 prize who elects the Annual Payment option shall receive annual installments of \$40,000 per year, less applicable federal withholding taxes.

#### FINAL ORDER

APPROVING CITY OF MARATHON ORDINANCE NO. 2017-07

The Department of Economic Opportunity ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to sections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the City of Marathon, Florida, Ordinance No. 2017-07 (the "Ordinance").

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The City of Marathon is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.
- 2. The Ordinance was adopted by the City of Marathon on November 14, 2017, and rendered to the Department on January 10, 2018.

3. The Ordinance amends the City of Marathon Code of Ordinances to add Medical Marijuana Dispensing Facilities as a conditional use under Mixed-Use and Mixed-Use Maritime on Table 103.15.1 – Uses by Zoning District. The Ordinance creates Section 104.33.1, which creates conditions under which the conditional use shall not be permitted. Specifically, Section 104.33.1 sets forth that medical marijuana dispensing facilities may not be located within five hundred (500) feet of school facilities.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 4. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. Sections 380.05(6), and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes.
- 5. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.
- 6. The Ordinance is consistent with the City of Marathon Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically Objective 1-3.1, Policy 1-3.1.4, and the City's Mixed Use land use designation.
- 7. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. Sections 380.05(6) and 380.0552(9), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.
- 8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development in section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes, as a whole, and is specifically consistent with the following principles:
- (a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.
- (n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintaining the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that the City of Marathon Ordinance No. 2017-07 is consistent with the City of Marathon Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Florida Keys Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.

This Order becomes effective 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
