68B-49.001 Designation as a Restricted Species

68B-49.003 Size Limit; Landed in Whole Condition Requirement

68B-49.004 Bag and Vessel Limits; Bycatch Allowance

68B-49.006 Allowed and Prohibited Gear and Method of Harvest; Bycatch Exception

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule amendment is to provide for the further conservation of tripletail by modifying the regulations found in Rule Chapter 68B-49, Florida Administrative Code. The effect of this rule will be to increase the minimum size limit for tripletail from 15 inches total length to 18 inches total length. The rule will also extend the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (Commission) current and proposed tripletail regulations into federal waters off Florida.

SUMMARY: This rule will increase the tripletail minimum size limit to 18 inches total length to ensure the continued sustainability as interest in the tripletail fishery grows. This rule will also extend the Commission's tripletail regulations into federal waters off Florida.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

68B-49.001 Designation as a Restricted Species; Applicability of Rules to State and Federal Waters.

(1) Tripletail is hereby designated a restricted species pursuant to Section 379.101(32), F.S.

(2) The regulations in this chapter apply in all Florida Waters and in adjacent federal waters.

68B-49.003 Size Limit; Landed in Whole Condition Requirement.

(1) Size Limit – A person may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters, or land possess in or on Florida Waters a tripletail that is less than 18 ~~15~~ inches in total length.

(2) Landed in Whole Condition Requirement – A person harvesting tripletail shall land each tripletail in whole condition. A person may not possess within or without in or on Florida Waters a tripletail that has been beheaded, sliced, divided, filleted, ground, skinned, scaled, or deboned. This provision will not be construed to prohibit evisceration (gutting) of a tripletail, or removal of gills from a tripletail.

68B-49.004 Bag and Vessel Limits; Bycatch Allowance.

(1) Recreational Bag Limit – A recreational harvester may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters or land more than 2 tripletail per day ~~or possess in or on Florida Waters more than 2 tripletail.~~

(2) Commercial Limits –

(a) Commercial Bag Limit – A commercial harvester may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters or land more than 10 tripletail per day, ~~or possess in or on Florida Waters more than 10 tripletail.~~

(b) Commercial Vessel Limit – The commercial harvesters aboard a vessel within or without in or on Florida Waters may not collectively possess more than 10 tripletail, regardless of the number of ~~licensed or license exempt~~ persons onboard. This provision will not be construed to authorize harvest or possession of tripletail in excess of the applicable bag limits.

(2) Prohibited Gear and Method of Harvest –

(a) A person may not harvest a tripletail within or without from Florida Waters with gear or methods that are not expressly permitted in subsection (1).

(b) A person may not use a multiple hook in conjunction with live or dead natural bait to harvest or attempt to harvest tripletail within or without from Florida Waters.

(c) A person may not harvest within or without from Florida Waters a tripletail by spearing or snagging the tripletail.

(3) No change.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rule amendment is to provide for the further conservation of sheepshead by modifying the regulations found in Rule Chapter 68B-59, Florida Administrative Code. The effect of this rule will be to reduce the recreational daily bag limit from 15 to five (5) sheepshead per person and implement a recreational vessel limit of 50 sheepshead during the peak spawning months of March and April. The rule will also extend the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's (Commission) current and proposed sheepshead regulations into federal waters off Florida.

SUMMARY: In consideration of public concerns about the sustainability of sheepshead under the current regulatory framework, and the trend toward increasing fishing pressure on inshore stocks, this rule will reduce the recreational daily bag limit to five (5) sheepshead per person and implement a recreational vessel limit of 50 sheepshead in March and April.

This rule will also extend the Commission’s sheepshead regulations into federal waters off Florida.

68B-59.001 Designation as Restricted Species; Applicability of Rules to State and Federal Waters.

(1) Sheepshead are hereby designated as restricted species pursuant to Section 379.101(32), F.S.

(2) The regulations in this chapter apply in all Florida Waters and in adjacent federal waters.

68B-59.003 Size Limit; Landed in Whole Condition Requirement.

(1) Size Limit – A person may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters or land possess in or on Florida Waters, a sheepshead that is less than 12 inches in total length.

(2) Landed in Whole Condition Requirement – A person harvesting sheepshead shall land each sheepshead in whole condition. A person may not possess within or without in or on Florida Waters a sheepshead that has been beheaded, sliced, divided, filleted, ground, skinned, scaled, or deboned. 68B-59.004 Bag and Vessel Limits; Bycatch Allowance.

(1) Recreational Limits –

(a) Recreational Bag Limit – A recreational harvester may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters or land more than 5 15 sheepshead per day, or possess in or on Florida Waters more than 15 sheepshead.

(b) Seasonal Recreational Vessel Limit – During the months of March and April, no more than 50 sheepshead may be collectively possessed by recreational harvesters aboard a vessel within or without Florida Waters, regardless of the number of persons onboard. This provision will not be construed to authorize harvest or possession of sheepshead in excess of the applicable bag limits.

(2) Commercial Limits –

(a) No change.

(b) Sheepshead Bycatch Allowance – A commercial harvester may not harvest or possess within or without land from Florida Waters or land more than 50 pounds lbs of sheepshead per day or possess in or on Florida Waters more than 50 lbs of sheepshead, pursuant to subsection 68B-59.006(3), F.A.C., as incidental bycatch of gear that is being used to lawfully harvest another target species.

(2) Prohibited Gear and Method of Harvest –

(a) A person may not harvest or attempt to harvest a sheepshead within or without ~~from~~ Florida Waters with gear or methods that are not expressly permitted in subsection (1).

(b) A person may not use a multiple hook in conjunction with live or dead natural bait to harvest or attempt to harvest a sheepshead within or without ~~from~~ Florida Waters.

(c) A person may not harvest or attempt to harvest a sheepshead within or without ~~from~~ Florida Waters by snagging the sheepshead or land a sheepshead so harvested.

61C-5.007 Certificates of Competency and License Registrations, Initial, Renewal; General Liability Insurance Coverage:

A certificate of competency holder must register with and obtain a license from the division as a certified elevator technician before constructing, installing, maintaining or repairing an elevator or as a certified elevator inspector before constructing, installing, maintaining, repairing or inspecting an elevator.

(a) Initial. The following items are required for an initial certificate of competency and must be received by the division before a certificate of competency may be issued:

1. DBPR HR-7014, Application for Certificate of Competency and Certified Elevator Technician Registration, (http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-_____) incorporated herein by reference and effective 2018 January;

2. The \$50 fee; and

3. One of the following:

a. Proof of a mechanical engineer license in good standing; ~~or:~~

b. Proof of four (4) years experience constructing, maintaining, servicing and repairing elevators verified by letter from a registered elevator company on company letterhead that specifies the type of work performed, and one of the following:

(I) A copy of certificate of successful completion of the requirements specified in Section 399.01(16)(a), F.S. Applicants qualifying by examination must provide proof of passage of the certificate of competency exam administered by the division or its designee. The examination must, ~~mechanics examination, or elevator technician examination conducted by the division or an approved provider~~ covering the construction, installation, maintenance, and repair of elevators and their associated parts. The applicant must pass the examination within two years of the date of application with a minimum score of 75%;

(II) Copy of certificate of completion of a registered elevator mechanics apprenticeship program as required in Section 399.01(16)(a)2.b., F.S.; or

(III) Copy of a current license or certification issued by a state or local U.S. jurisdiction with standards equal to or more stringent than Florida’s standards as required in Section 399.01(16)(a)2.c., F.S.
