(1) Each Child Protection Team will function under the oversight of a ~~CMS approved provider pediatrician whose title will be~~ Child Protection Team Medical Director. ~~The minimum qualification for this position are:~~

~~(a) Graduation from an accredited school of medicine with board certification in pediatrics and licensed to practice in Florida.~~

~~(b) An approved CMS physician provider.~~

~~(c) Demonstrated interest in the field of child abuse and neglect and satisfactory completion of training deemed necessary by the department for evaluating alleged abuse and neglect.~~

~~(d) Availability to provide oversight of team and client assessments.~~

(3) Each Child Protection Team staff shall consist of one or more case coordinators who complete assessment activities and referrals, and perform related duties. The minimum qualifications for this position are:

(5) Each Child Protection Team shall have Florida licensed Physicians team Pediatricians or Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners, who work ~~part time with the Team~~, under the supervision of the Team Medical Director, and respond to requests for medical consultation and medical diagnostic examination and evaluation of children suspected of being abused or neglected. ~~These evaluations may take place in a hospital space or in an out patient or private office setting. The qualifications for this position are:~~

~~(a) Physician.~~

~~1. Graduation from an accredited school of medicine with board certification/eligibility in pediatrics and licensed to practice in Florida.~~

~~2. An approved CMS physician medical provider.~~

~~3. Experience in the evaluation and treatment of child abuse and neglect or agreement to receive training deemed necessary by the department for evaluating alleged abuse and neglect.~~

~~(b) Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner.~~

~~1. Licensure in the state of Florida to practice professional nursing and certification in advanced or specialized pediatrics or family medicine nursing practice.~~

~~2. Experience in the evaluation and treatment of child abuse and neglect or agreement to receive training deemed necessary by the department for evaluating alleged abuse and neglect.~~

~~(6) The Child Protection Team may use Physician's Assistants under the direct supervision of a Child Protection Team physician.~~

~~(6)(7) Each Child Protection Team shall have a Team Attorney who is a member of the Florida Bar and works with the team on a part-time basis under the general oversight of the Team Medical Director to provide legal consultation to the team.~~

(1) A Child Protection Team physician or Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner and a case coordinator must be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week for consultation. ~~On-site services will be provided as deemed necessary for child safety.~~

(2) Child Protection Team services are provided in cases of suspected abuse or neglect without regard to income. All children, reported as being abused or neglected by an adult caretaker and accepted by the Florida Abuse Hotline for protective investigation, are eligible for Child Protection Team services. All eligible children are provided Team services.

(3) Medical diagnostic examinations ~~diagnosis and evaluation~~ can be conducted in person or through the use of telemedicine technology. Use of telemedicine requires the presence of a Children's Medical Services CMS approved Physician or Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner at the hub site and a Registered Nurse or Physician Assistant at the remote site to facilitate the evaluation.

(2) All requests for waiver ~~of a specific standard~~ shall be submitted in writing to the Division of Children's Medical Services Program Office, and shall specify the requirement for which the waiver is being requested. Additionally, the Child Protection Team may include any training, education, or experience the individual possesses which would be pertinent to the position being sought include documentation of the need for the waiver.

(3) Child Protection Team services shall not be provided by an individual requiring a waiver until such waiver is granted by the Division Director for Children's Medical Services or their designee. Final approval or disapproval of all requests for waiver shall be made by the Deputy Secretary for Children's Medical Services or their designee, who will make the decision to grant or deny a specific request for waiver of a standard upon

~~the documented rationale presented for the request. Waiver requests shall contain at least these sections:~~

- ~~(a) Identification of the standard for which the waiver is requested;~~
- ~~(b) Description of the attempts to meet the standard;~~
- ~~(c) A plan for remediating the need for the waiver;~~
- ~~(d) Assurance and an explanation in the request that the granting of such a waiver will not adversely affect the quality of care rendered by the provider; and,~~
- ~~(e) An assessment of need and lack of existence of alternative solutions.~~

(4) The decision to grant or deny a specific request for waiver of a requirement will be based upon the documented rationale for the request, including an assurance and explanantion in the request that the granting of such a waiver will not adversely affect the quality of care rendered by the provider.

~~(5)(4) The Division of Children’s Medical Services Program Office shall notify the Child Protection Team program in writing; that the request for waiver of a specific requirement standard has been granted or denied. 64C-9.005 Definitions.

(1) “Counseling” means – a therapeutic process that engages individuals and families in the reduction of behavioral, emotional, and cognitive symptoms related to trauma. Treatment is provided to enhance and expand individual and family coping skills, promote safety, and improve family cohesion and communication.

(2) “Non-Offending Caretaker” means – the parent or person taking care of a child who did not sexually abuse the child.

(3) “Offender” means – the person who sexually abused the child.

(4) “Sexual Abuse Treatment Program” means – a program funded in part or in whole through a contract with the Division of Children’s Medical Services which conforms to the contract, the statute, and the administrative rule.

(5) “Victim” means – for the purposes of the Sexual Abuse Treatment Program, a child who has disclosed sexual abuse or who has exhibited indicators of sexual abuse, regardless of investigative findings by either the Department of Children and Families or Sheriff’s Office.

64C-9.006 Sexual Abuse Treatment Program Organization, Roles and Responsibilities.

(1) Each Sexual Abuse Treatment Program shall function under the direction of a program coordinator who is licensed by the State of Florida under Chapter 490 or 491, F.S.; has at least one year of clinical experience in the field of child sexual abuse; and maintains at least eight hours of continuing education annually in child abuse, at least two hours of which must be specific to child sexual abuse.

(2) Sexual Abuse Treatment Program counseling staff must have at least a Master’s degree in Psychology, Social Work, or other behavioral science; and a minimum of one year of clinical counseling experience, six months of which must have been in providing treatment to sexually abused children and their families; and maintain at least eight hours of continuing education annually in child abuse, at least two hours of which must be specific to child sexual abuse.

(3) Students actively seeking a Masters or higher degree in Psychology, Social Work, or other behavioral science may provide Sexual Abuse Treatment Program services under the direct supervision of an individual meeting the requirements of a Sexual Abuse Treatment Program program coordinator; and maintain at least eight hours of continuing education annually in child abuse, at least two hours of which must be specific to child sexual abuse.

The Sexual Abuse Treatment Program contractor shall ensure that counseling services are provided to victims, non-offending caretakers, and siblings of the victim, and that federal, state, local and private revenue sources are billed for treatment services.

Additionally, the Sexual Abuse Treatment Program may include any training, education, or experience the individual possesses which would be pertinent to the position being sought.

(3) Sexual Abuse Treatment Program services shall not be provided by an individual requiring a waiver until such waiver is granted by the Division Director for Children’s Medical Services or their designee.

(4) The decision to grant or deny a specific request for waiver of a requirement will be based upon the documented rationale for the request, including an assurance and explanation in the request that the granting of such a waiver will not adversely affect the quality of care rendered by the provider.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on April 06, 2018, the Department of Environmental Protection, received a petition for waiving out-of-service requirements for 4300 Ravenswood, LLC. The petition requested a waiver from paragraph 62-761.800(1)(e), F.A.C., which states that storage tank systems with secondary containment shall only be designated as out-of-service for a maximum of 10 continuous years. Upon expiration of this time period, the storage tank system must be closed in accordance with paragraph 62-761.800(2)(b), F.A.C. The 12,000-gallon secondarily contained underground storage tank

has been out-of-service greater than 14 continuous years, and is requesting a waiver of the rule to be placed back into service. The proposed storage tank facility is located at 4300 Ravenswood Road, Dania Beach, Florida 33312, in Broward County. The petition has been assigned File No. DWM FACID 06/8622379 and OGC File No. 18-0192.

Funding at the time was insufficient to fully accommodate the space needs for these essential operations dedicated to the safety and security of FIU students, faculty, staff and visitors, and the need for space is even greater today with the expanded importance of public safety and emergency management in today's environment and the additional investments in officers and safety personnel made by FIU since 2010. FIU's Police Department must be prepared to respond to spontaneous critical incidents such as bomb threats and active shooters as well as drawn out critical incidents such as hurricanes and special events. These incidents require appropriate space for planning and operations as well as for storage of the highly sensitive specialized equipment necessary to carry out these assignments. The sensitive nature of the required planning and equipment necessitates a secured facility to address this. Additionally, as reported in the Public Safety Officers Implementation Plan that was approved by the FIU Board of Trustees in September 7, 2017, FIU has increased police staffing from 47 in 2009-10 to 63 in 2017-18 and the goal is to add two additional officers per year over the next few years. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated \$117,937,000 in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds to the state for recovery in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) declared counties impacted by Disaster Declaration 4280 (Hurricane Hermine) and Declaration 4283 (Hurricane Matthew). The Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) is the lead agency and responsible entity for administering the funds.

Notices providing guidance on applying for these additional funds were published in 82 Fed. Reg. 36812-02 (Aug. 7, 2017), 82 Fed. Reg. 5591-01 (Jan. 18, 2017), and 81 Fed. Reg. 83254-01 (Nov. 21, 2016). As required by the published notices, a substantial amendment to the approved Action Plan that primarily addresses unmet housing needs must be submitted by DEO to HUD for approval.

DEO amends the Action Plan to revise the ranking criteria into an updated scoring criteria, remove the \$3 million subrecipient allocation limit and remove the standalone planning activity from infrastructure eligible projects listed in the plan. DEO amends the Action Plan to include per unit caps for single family repair/elevation/reconstruction, HOME Program affordability terms for rental housing and added clarification regarding the definition of shelters into two eligible activities.
