PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule will clarify definitions. Update and incorporate forms by rule. Update and clarify the requirements, exemptions and limitations for Intrastate Movement of Domestic Fowl. To protect against and prevent the spread of disease.

SUMMARY: To clarify definitions, update forms, requirements, exemptions and limitations to Intrastate Movement of Domestic Fowl.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: A SERC is not required, based on the fact that the division is not raising any fees, only updating the rule to clarify definitions and updating the requirements, exemptions and limitations of Intrastate Movement of Domestic Fowl.

### 5C-16.001 Purpose.

For the purpose of this rule chapter, the definitions in Sections 585.001 and 585.01, F.S., and the following shall apply:

- (1) Avian Influenza  $\underline{a}$ An infectious disease of wild birds and domestic  $\underline{P}$ poultry caused by  $\underline{a}$  viruses in the family Orthomyxoviridae, genus Influenza virus A.
- (2) Avian Influenza Approved Test antibody or antigen capture methodologies recognized by NPIP and conducted at a laboratory approved to conduct such tests by USDA, APHIS.
- (3) Control Area a limited movement area established by the Division of Animal Industry that is at least ten (10) km (~6.21 miles) beyond the perimeter of a Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza infected premises.
- (4) Domestic Fowl any member of the class Aves that is propagated or maintained under control of a person for commercial, exhibition, or breeding purposes, or as pets.
- (5) Emergency Management Response <u>System Services</u> (EMRS) <u>aA USDA</u>, APHIS, web-based application for authorized users in the reporting of routine investigations of foreign animal diseases (FADS), surveillance and control programs, state specific disease outbreaks, and national animal health emergency responses (all-hazards).
- (6) Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza an Aavian Iinfluenza virus of H5 or H7 subtype that has an intravenous pathogenicity index in six (6) week old chickens greater than or equal to one point two (1.2) or causes greater than seventy-five (75) percent mortality in four (4) to eight (8) week old chickens infected intravenously.
- (7) National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) a cooperative state-federal-industry program for prevention and control of certain hatchery-disseminated diseases and for improvement of <u>Pp</u>oultry and <u>Pp</u>oultry <u>Pp</u>roducts as provided in 9 CFR §§145-147 (<u>2018</u><del>2013</del>) as adopted in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.
- (8) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) a legible record of certificate made on an official form from the animal's state of origin, issued and signed by veterinarians licensed and accredited in the animal's state of origin for the purpose of certifying the official individual identifications, test requirements, and health status of specific animals for movement, exhibition, and other designated purposes.

- (9) Poultry chicken, turkeys, quail, pheasants, chukars, peafowl, guineas, ratites, and waterfowl. The term also includes other <u>D</u>elomestic <u>F</u>fowl used for commercial, exhibition, or breeding purposes, or as pets.
- (10) Poultry Products hatching eggs, breeder flocks for imported hatching eggs, chicks, or poults less than four (4) days old, chicks, poults, litter, and offal but does not include table eggs and processed P<del>p</del>oultry for human consumption.
- (11) Racing Pigeon racing pigeons are homing pigeons used to race. The homing pigeon is a variety of domestic pigeon (*Columba livia domestica*) derived from the rock pigeon, selectively bred to find its way home over extremely long distances
- (12) USDA, APHIS. The United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services. Rulemaking Authority 570.07(23), 585.002(4), 585.08(2) FS. Law Implemented 585.08, 585.11(1), 585.145, 585.16 FS. History–New 1-1-67, Formerly 5C-16.01, Amended 7-3-95, 9-21-16, \_\_\_\_\_\_.

#### 5C-16.021 Intrastate Movement of Domestic Fowl.

- (1) If state or federal animal health officials suspect or positively identify Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in <u>Delomestic Ffowl</u> within the states of Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, or Florida, then all <u>Delomestic Ffowl</u> moving within Florida must meet the following requirements:
- (a) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) required. All <u>Delomestic Ffowl</u>, <u>Ppoultry</u>, and eggs for hatching purposes moving within Florida, unless exempted by this rule, must be accompanied by an OCVI. Poultry and hatching eggs classified under provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) may substitute Report of Sales of Hatching Eggs, Chicks, and Poults, VS Form 9-3 (FEB 2016 OCT 2011), as adopted in Rule 5C-3.012, F.A.C., for the OCVI. To apply for participation in the NPIP program the applicant must submit a completed National Poultry Improvement Plan Agreement, Subpart E, FDACS-09166 form Rev. 02/19 to the department. National Poultry Improvement Plan Agreement, Subpart E, FDACS-09166 Rev. 02/19 is hereby incorporated by reference available online and http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-xxxx. If AI clean status is requested, then a Request and Agreement for Testing of Poultry for Avian Influenza and Exotic Newcastle Disease, FDACS 09176 Rev. 03/19. Must also be submitted to the Department. Request and Agreement for Testing of Poultry for Avian Influenza and Exotic Newcastle Disease, FDACS 09176 Rev. 03/19 is hereby incorporated by reference and available online  $http://www.flrules.org/\underline{Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-xxxx}.$

The following are exempt from the OCVI requirement:

- 1. Racing Pigeons that are transported out of Florida for racing purposes in a sealed crates(s) which and reenter Florida with unbroken seals.
- 2. Poultry consigned directly to a recognized slaughtering establishment.
  - (b) Avian Influenza Testing Requirements.
- 1. Poultry originating from a Non-Quarantine or Control Area:
- a. All <u>P</u>poultry and <u>P</u>poultry <u>P</u>products must be accompanied by proof of a negative <del>approved test for</del> Avian Influenza <u>Approved Test (AI)</u>; <del>and,</del>
- b. Poultry must be tested no more than seven (7) days prior to movement; and,
- c. If a flock with greater than thirty (30) birds is to be moved within Florida, then no less than thirty (30) samples per flock must be taken with at least ten (10) samples taken per house, or
- d. If a flock of less than thirty (30) birds is to be moved within Florida, then all birds must be tested.
- 2. Exemptions. No Avian Influenza test is required for the following:
- a. <u>P</u>poultry or <u>P</u>poultry <u>P</u>products originating from flocks classified as US Avian Influenza Clean, as provided in 9 CFR §§145.23(h), 145.33(i), 145.43(g), 145.53(e), and 145.63(b) (2018<del>2013</del>), as adopted in Rule 5C-3.001, F.A.C.;
  - b. Ratites;
  - c. Exotic birds;
  - d. Racing Ppigeons.
- 3. Proof of negative Avian Influenza (AI) testing must be documented on the Report of Sales of Hatching Eggs, Chicks, Poults, VS Form 9-3 (<u>FEB 2016 OCT 2011</u>), as adopted in Rule 5C-3.012, F.A.C., or the OCVI listing the description of birds, test date, test results, and the name of the laboratory.
  - 4. Poultry originating from a Quarantine or Control Area.
- a.—No Domestic Fowl, live Poultry, or Poultry Products originating from an Avian Influenza Quarantine or Control Area within—in Florida moving within the state may not move within or out of the Quarantine or Control Area except Domestic Fowl, Poultry or Poultry Products that have completed all USDA, APHIS requirements—listed in the USDA FAD Prep Manual for Highly Pathogenic Influenza Response Plan (05/17). The Department shall verify these requirements have been met through the Emergency Management Response System (EMRS) prior to permitting movement out of the Quarantine or Control Area. USDA FAD Prep Manual for Highly Pathogenic Influenza Response Plan (05/17) is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-xxxx.

- b. A movement permit number generated by the Emergency Management Response System (EMRS) must accompany the shipment and be recordered on either the OCVI or the Report of Sales of Hatching Eggs, Chicks, Poults, VS Form 9-3 (FEB 2016 OCT 2011).
- (2) The Department shall publish a notice in the *Florida Administrative Register* and shall notify industry associations of the immediate implementation of the requirements in subsection 5C-16.021(1) F.A.C.
- (3) Failure to comply with the requirements of subsection 5C-16.021(1) F.A.C. will result in the penalties as provided in Rule 5C-30.003, F.A.C.

Child Nutrition Programs are expected to be administered according to all statutory and regulatory requirements; waivers to the requirements are exceptions. However, Section 12(1) of the Richard B. The waiver is for FDACS, who is in good standing.

Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(1)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(1)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]:

FDACS is requesting a state-wide waiver of the 3-year Administrative Review (AR) requirement and an extension of the review cycle that was proposed by the USDA Food and Nutrition Services (FNS) on February 22, 2019 through SP 12-2019 Flexibility for the Administrative Review Cycle Requirement. The impact and challenges of the 3-year review cycle on FDACS and sponsors are outlined below.

Prior to applying for the waiver, FDACS staff met to discuss the upcoming 3-year

review cycle and program workload. FDACS completed an analysis of the AR 3-year cycle for the past two cycles.

Increase in Program Sponsors and State Staffing

The number of sponsors in Florida's National School Lunch Program (NSLP) increases consistently every year, but the SA rarely increases the number of state program accountability specialists. Sponsors have grown from 310 in school year 2013-2014 to 394 in school year 2018-2019.

The chart below includes the forecasted growth rate of NSLP sponsors in Florida.

With the new sponsors planned for 2019-2020 and planning for the upcoming 3-year cycle, Florida has determined we will not be able to effectively sustain the workload. A 4-year review cycle would greatly help FDACS to accommodate the current and foreseen workload challenges of training and supporting new sponsors, new food service directors and new state office staff.

Below is a chart illustrating how FDACS has projected the review cycle workload.

The goal of the waiver is to ensure good customer service is maintained and to align reviews to support sponsors as they strive to run exceptional school meal programs. Approval of this waiver will ensure sponsors are reviewed at least once during a 4-year review cycle while streamlining monitoring operations, allow staff to support sponsors through training and technical assistance and decrease the administrative burden on sponsors and FDACS. This will also allow FDACS and

sponsors to focus efforts on important program areas, such as financial management,

procurement, program access and participation while still ensuring program integrity in all program areas.


Specific Program requirements to be waived (include statutory and regulatory citations). [Section 12(1)(2)(A)(i) of the NSLA]: FDACS is requesting the use of flexibility for the Administrative Review Cycle and for the following regulatory requirement to be waived:

Timing of reviews. State agencies must conduct administrative reviews of all school food authorities participating in the National School Lunch Program (including the Afterschool Snacks and the Seamless Summer Option) and School Breakfast Program at least once during a 3-year review cycle, provided that each school food authority is reviewed at least once every 4 years. For each State agency, the first 3-year review cycle started the school year that began on July 1, 2013 and ended on June 30, 2014. At a minimum, the on-site portion

of the administrative review must be completed during the school year in which the review was begun. 7 CFR 210.18(c) Detailed description of alternative procedures and anticipated impact on Program operations, including technology, State systems, and monitoring:


A 4-year review cycle will allow Florida to maintain the alignment of the AR and procurement reviews and provide the opportunity to support sponsors through additional training and technical assistance. All sponsors will receive an AR and procurement review in addition to a technical assistance visit within the 4-year cycle to ensure program integrity. The procurement review is currently on a 3-year cycle with the AR and will transition to the same 4-year cycle to ensure the sponsors receive the same reviews as on the 3-year cycle. FDACS will conduct follow-up reviews (Targeted Technical Assistance Reviews) for all sponsors where significant or repeated critical or general violations exist within 2 years of their AR. If the initial violation is still in practice, the sponsor will be deemed Seriously Deficient. The sponsor will be provided 30 days to submit corrective action. FDACS will conduct a follow-up visit to ensure the corrective action has been implemented within 60 days of receipt of the corrective action. If the violations have been resolved, the Seriously Deficient status will be rescinded, and the sponsor will remain on the AR cycle. If the violations are still occurring, the sponsor will be suspended, pursuant to Rule 5P-1.004, Florida Administrative Code.

FDACS will schedule all new sponsors for their first administrative review within 12 months of program operation. Florida will also conduct Technical Assistance Visits for new sponsors within 30 days of their first claim for reimbursement. If program deficiencies are present at the Technical Assistance Visit, the sponsor will receive a Targeted Technical Assistance Review within the next 6 months. If significant or repeated critical or general violations exist, the sponsor will be deemed Seriously Deficient. The sponsor will be provided 30 days to submit corrective action. FDACS will conduct a follow-up to ensure the corrective action has been implemented within 60 days of receipt of the corrective action. If the violations have been resolved, the Seriously Deficient status will be rescinded, and the sponsor will remain on the AR cycle. If the violations are still occurring, the sponsor will be suspended, pursuant to Rule 5P-1.004, Florida Administrative Code.

## 1. Description of any steps the State has taken to address regulatory barriers at the State level. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(ii) of the NSLA]:

FDACS would like to expand the current 3-year AR cycle process and tracking to a 4-year review cycle. Increasing the AR cycle by one year will continue to build program integrity by better training sponsors. Florida implemented the 3-year cycle requirement when the AR was released in 2011. Due to the burden of overloaded review schedules, technical assistance is often done in conjunction with the review, while local staff

are already overwhelmed with documentation that must be completed. There is not enough time to provide thorough training during the review. Changing to a 4-year review cycle will allow our staff to provide effective and quality customer service and training for our sponsors. To address these barriers, FDACS is submitting this waiver.

### 2. Anticipated challenges State or eligible service providers may face with the waiver implementation:

FDACS does not anticipate any challenges with waiver implementation.

3. Description of how the waiver will not increase the overall cost of the Program to the Federal Government. If there are anticipated increases, confirm that the costs will be paid from non-Federal funds. [Section 12(l)(1)(A)(iii) of the NSLA]:

The waiver will not increase the overall cost of the Program to the Federal Government because it is an administrative flexibility

### 4. Anticipated waiver implementation date and time period:

The anticipated time period is July 1, 2019 through the end of the school year, and remaining in effect for a period of four school years until June 30, 2023.

### 5. Proposed monitoring and review procedures:

FDACS will continue to monitor sponsors on all AR requirements outlined in 7 CFR 210.18 - Administrative Reviews, using a 4-year cycle in place of the required 3-year cycle. FDACS will continue to seek approval for 1-year extensions to the 4-year review cycle for special circumstances that may conflict with efficient FDACS management of the program, such as natural disasters. FDACS will conduct followup reviews (Targeted Technical Assistance Reviews) for all sponsors where significant or repeated critical or general violations exist within 2 years of their AR. If the initial violation is still in practice, the sponsor will be deemed Seriously Deficient. The sponsor will be provided 30 days to submit corrective action. FDACS will conduct a follow-up visit to ensure the corrective action has been implemented within 60 days of receipt of the corrective action. If the violations have been resolved, the Seriously Deficient status will be rescinded, and the sponsor will remain on the AR cycle. If the violations are still occurring, the sponsor will be suspended, pursuant to Rule 5P-1.004, Florida Administrative Code. FDACS will schedule all new sponsors for their first administrative review within 12 months of program operation.

FDACS will also conduct Technical Assistance Visits for new sponsors within 30 days of their first claim for reimbursement. If findings are present at the Technical Assistance Visit, the sponsor will receive a Targeted Technical Assistance Review within the next 6 months. If significant or repeated critical or general violations exist, the sponsor will be deemed Seriously

Deficient. The sponsor will be provided 30 days to submit corrective action. FDACS will conduct a follow-up to ensure the corrective action has been implemented within 60 days of receipt of the corrective action. If the violations have been resolved, the Seriously Deficient status will be rescinded, and the sponsor will remain on the AR cycle. If the violations are still occurring, the sponsor will be suspended, pursuant to Rule 5P-1.004, Florida Administrative Code.

### 6. Proposed reporting requirements (include type of data and due date(s) to FNS):

FDACS will provide FNS with required reports, including the FNS 640, program deficiencies, and recommendations provided during reviews. This information will be available annually and upon request.
