Notice is hereby given that the following changes have been made to the proposed rule in accordance with subparagraph 120.54(3)(d)1., F.S., published in Vol. 48 No. 132, July 8, 2022 issue of the Florida Administrative Register.

The changes are in response to written comments submitted by the staff of the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee and discussion and subsequent vote by the board at a public meeting held August 12, 2022. The changes are as follows:

64B15-14.0076 Requirement for Osteopathic Physician Office Surgery Registration; Inspection or Accreditation.

(1) through (3) No change.

(4) This rule shall be reviewed, and if necessary, repealed, modified, or renewed through the rulemaking process five years from the effective date. No later than 90 days prior to December 31, 2027, the Board shall review and amend, modify, or sunset this rule if it determines the rule creates barriers to entry for private business competition, is duplicative, outdated, obsolete, overly burdensome, or imposes excessive costs. Failure by the Board to act in accordance with his provision will result in the expiration of this rule on December 31, 2027.
