61G20-1.001 Florida Building Code Adopted

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: Senate Bill 4-D (2022) was passed by the Legislature during a special session, and went into effect upon being signed by the Governor. The bill contains a provision which expands repair options for existing roofs which were built, repaired, or replaced to the standards of the 2007 Florida Building Code, or any later edition, and directs the Florida Building Commission to adopt this provision into the Code. The bill also contains provisions concerning mandatory structural inspections for condominium and cooperative buildings, and the Commission intends to incorporate these into the Code as well.

SUMMARY: The proposed amendments will update the Code to include statutorily-mandated provisions pertaining to the repair of existing roofs. They will also incorporate new requirements for periodic structural inspections of certain existing condominium and cooperative buildings.

**SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:**

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The proposed amendments will merely amend the Code to be consistent with new state statutory requirements.

Applications for any license described in this rule chapter shall be submitted initially and annually thereafter to the Department along with the required licensing fee. An application for renewal of a regular license must be submitted to the Department at least 90 calendar days prior to the expiration of the regular license. Applications for renewal submitted less than 90 calendar days, but at least 45 calendar days before the license expires, will be processed and late fees will be applied. If the application for renewal is not received by the Department prior to the expiration of the regular license, the application will be returned to the applicant, including any fees. The Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Hotels and Restaurants hereby gives notice:

On September 27, 2022 the Division of Hotels and Restaurants received a Petition for an Emergency Variance for paragraph 61C-1.004(1)(a), Florida Administrative Code and Paragraph 5-202.11(A), 2017 FDA Food Code from La Boulangerie Boul’Mich located in Boca Raton. The above referenced F.A.C. addresses the requirement that each establishment have an approved plumbing system installed to transport potable water and wastewater. They are requesting to utilize holding tanks to provide potable water and to collect wastewater at the handwash and 3-compartment sinks.

The Petition for this variance was published in Vol. 48/189 on September 28, 2022. The Order for this Petition was signed and approved on October 06, 2022. After a complete review of the variance request, the Division finds that the application of this Rule will create a financial hardship to the food service establishment. Furthermore, the Division finds that the Petitioner meets the burden of demonstrating that the underlying statute has been achieved by the Petitioner ensuring the wastewater holding tank for the handwash and 3-compartment sinks are emptied at a frequency as to not create a sanitary nuisance; and potable water provided must come from an approved source and be protected from contamination during handling. The Petitioner shall also ensure that the handwash sinks are provided with hot and cold running water under pressure, soap, an approved hand drying device and a handwashing sign.

WHEREAS, on September 23, 2022, by State of Florida Executive Order No. 22-218 (“Executive Order 22-218”), as amended by Executive Order No. 22-219 on September 24, 2022, the Governor of the State of Florida declared that a state of emergency exists throughout the State of Florida based upon the serious threat to the public health, safety, and welfare posed by Tropical Depression 9 (now known as Hurricane Ian); and WHEREAS, Section 4.B. of Executive Order 22-218 gives each state agency the authority to suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business or the orders or rules of that agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of any such statute, order, or

rule would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Economic Opportunity’s timely performance of emergency response functions related to Hurricane Ian as assigned by the State Coordinating Officer would be hindered by the application of certain procedures imposed by statute, rule, or order.

NOW THEREFORE, I, DANE EAGLE, Secretary of the Department of Economic Opportunity, pursuant to the authority granted by Section 4.B. of Executive Order 22-218, as amended by Executive Order 22-219, find that strict compliance with the following regulatory statutes and rules would prevent, hinder, or delay, any necessary action in coping with the emergency, and therefore, I hereby:

1. Suspend sections 287.056, 287.057, and 287.058, Florida Statutes, for the Department of Economic Opportunity’s emergency response functions as prescribed in the State Comprehensive Management Plan or as directed by the State Coordinating Officer.

2. Suspend Rules 60A-1.002, 60A-1.016, 60A-1.043, and 60A-1.045, Florida Administrative Code, for the Department of Economic Opportunity’s emergency response functions as prescribed in the State Comprehensive Management Plan or as directed by the State Coordinating Officer.

This Emergency Order is effective immediately upon execution by the Secretary and shall expire on November 22, 2022, unless modified or extended by further order.
