A permittee may seek modification of an unexpired permit consistent with Rule 40B 1.703, F.A.C.

(1) <u>An application to modify a valid water use permit shall</u> <u>be approved by the Executive Director or their designee without</u> <u>a hearing if all the following are met:</u> <u>A permittee may apply</u> for modification by letter to the District if the proposed modification involves water use less than 100,000 gallons per day. Either the Executive Director or the Assistant Executive Director shall approve proposed modifications by letter without a hearing in the following circumstances, except that any request for modification recommended for denial shall be presented to the Governing Board for final agency action:

(a) <u>The application meets the conditions for issuance in</u> <u>Rule 40B-2.301, F.A.C., that apply to the modification request;</u> When a change in conditions has resulted in the water allowed under the permit becoming inadequate for the permittee's need;

(b) The application increases the permitted allocation less than 100,000 gallons per day, or the application increases the permitted allocation by 100,000 gallons or more per day and the applicant demonstrates that the provisions of Sections 373.239(2)(a) or (b) are met; and When the proposed modification would result in a more efficient use of water than is possible under the existing permit; or

(c) <u>The application does not receive an agency</u> recommendation for denial. When a public water supply permittee achieves demonstrable water savings attributable to implementation of a water conservation plan pursuant to subsection 2.3.2.3(b), Water Use Permit Applicant's Handbook.

(2) <u>The Governing Board shall determine final agency</u> <u>action on any modification that increases the permit duration.</u> A <u>permittee may apply to modify an existing permit to voluntarily</u> <u>implement the District's water use monitoring and reporting</u> <u>requirements as set forth in Section 4.1 of the Water Use Permit</u> <u>Applicant's Handbook. The Governing Board shall determine</u> <u>final agency action on modifications under this paragraph.</u>

(1) An applicant requesting to continue all or part of a permitted water use that has changed ownership shall submit a complete Water Use Permit Transfer Form 40B-2.351A, [insert link], (effective date), within 180 days of the acquisition of the property or properties on which the permitted water use is authorized. Water Use Permit Transfer Form: Form Number 40B 2.351A, effective January 6, 2010, is hereby incorporated by reference. This form is available at District headquarters and on the District's website at www.mysuwanneeriver.com.

(2) <u>Applicants shall provide reasonable assurances of the</u> <u>ability to operate and maintain the withdrawal and/or diversion</u> <u>facilities in accordance with the transferred permit's terms and</u> <u>conditions.</u> Persons who wish to continue a permitted water use and who have acquired the ability to operate and maintain the withdrawal and/or diversion facilities, shall apply to the District within 30 days of acquiring such ability. for the duration of the permit in accordance with the permit terms and conditions. Permit transfer requests shall be submitted on the District's Water Use Permit Transfer Form 40B 2.351A. The District shall transfer the permit provided the previously permitted use remains the same.

FINAL ORDER APPROVING ISLAMORADA, VILLAGE OF ISLANDS ORDINANCE NO. 19-04

The Department of Commerce ("Department") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by the Islamorada, Village of Islands, Florida ("Village"), by Ordinance No. 19-04 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Florida Keys Area is designated by Section 380.0552, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. The Village is a local government within the Florida Keys Area.

 The Ordinance was adopted by the Village on April 4, 2019.
The Ordinance was rendered to the Department on November 7, 2023.

4. The Ordinance amends the Village's Code to implement the Workforce-Affordable Housing Initiative within the Village by adding provisions to the Village's Building Permit Allocation System to allow for the allocation and distribution of building permits for up to 300 workforce-affordable housing units.

5. The Ordinance provides the requirement that individuals residing in the units are subject to evacuating prior to the mandatory 24-hour hurricane evacuation timeframe. The affordable housing units are referred to and defined as "Affordable – Early Evacuation Residential Units."

6. The Ordinance also establishes evaluation and award criteria for the units and specifies that certain first-response and emergency personnel are exempt from the early-evacuation requirement.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

7. The Department is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in an area of critical state concern. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.

8. "Land development regulations" include local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land. Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

9. The Ordinance is consistent with the Village's Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by Section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and is specifically consistent with Goal 1-1, Goal 1-3, Objective 1-3.1, Policy 1-3.1.1, Policy 2-1.2.9, Policy 2-1.6.3, Goal 3-1, Goal 3-2, Policies 3-2.1.1-3.2.1.5, Objective 5-1.10, and Policies 5.1.10.1 and 5-1.10.3.

10. All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. *See* Section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Village are set forth in Section 380.0552(7), Florida Statutes.

11. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Village as a whole, and specifically furthers the following Principles:

(a) Strengthening local government capabilities for managing land use and development so that local government is able to achieve these objectives without continuing the area of critical state concern designation.

(d) Ensuring the maximum well-being of the Florida Keys and its citizens through sound economic development.

(1) Making available adequate affordable housing for all sectors of the population of the Florida Keys.

(m) Providing adequate alternatives for the protection of public safety and welfare in the event of a natural or manmade disaster and for a postdisaster reconstruction plan.

(n) Protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Florida Keys and maintaining the Florida Keys as a unique Florida resource.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Department finds that Ordinance No. 19-04 is consistent with the Village's Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Village and is hereby <u>APPROVED</u>.

This Final Order becomes final 21 days after publication in the Florida Administrative Register unless a petition is timely filed as described in the Notice of Administrative Rights below.
