PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rules will update incorporated national standards and department forms; amendments will provide clarification, remove broken references, adopt standards in response to, and in anticipation of, changes within the industry and add courses/seminars to assist with continuing education credits. In addition, changes are being made for compliance with recent statutory changes.

SUMMARY: The purpose of this rulemaking is to implement changes to section 616.242, F.S., made during the 2023 Legislative Session. These changes include amending the fair rides forms, amend inspection standards, update signage requirements, update training requirements and modify accident reporting criteria. Additionally, the department proposes to update the latest ASTM standards, add accepted CEU course opportunities, update citations and remove duplications, revise reinspection fees and remove the requirement for maximum fines for default final orders.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE

RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase

directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or, if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The proposed changes will update and adopt materials incorporated by reference and will update material references. According to the department's economic analysis, the adverse impact or potential regulatory costs of the proposed rules do not exceed any of the criteria established in Section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. The department relied upon the Fair Rides database and the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) website to determine approximate costs of each standard identified. The department also determined that some regulated entities will not incur any costs due to the proposed rules because the national standards being adopted in Florida are already in use within the industry and have already been adopted in other jurisdictions where the regulated entities have operated. No interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact.

APPROVING LAKE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2023-67

The Florida Department of Commerce ("Commerce") hereby issues its Final Order, pursuant to section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes, approving land development regulations adopted by Lake County, Florida, Ordinance No. 2023-67 (the "Ordinance").

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Green Swamp Area is designated by section 380.0551, Florida Statutes, as an area of critical state concern. Lake County is a local government within the Green Swamp Area. 2. The Ordinance was adopted by Lake County on November 28, 2023, and rendered to Commerce on December 5, 2023.

3. The Ordinance amends Sections 3.06.00 and 1.08.03 of the Lake County Code (the "Code"), Appendix E, Land Development Regulations, to establish that tracts or parcels used for parking and storage of vessels and recreational vehicles in residential subdivisions platted before January 1, 2004, are declared as nonconforming uses for purposes of parking, storing, or keeping vessels and recreational vehicles.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4.Commerce is required to approve or reject land development regulations that are adopted by any local government in the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern. See section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes.

5. "Land development regulations" include "local zoning, subdivision, building, and other regulations controlling the development of land." Section 380.031(8), Florida Statutes. The regulations adopted by the Ordinance are land development regulations.

6. The Ordinance is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan generally, as required by section 163.3177(1), Florida Statutes, and specifically is consistent with Policy I-1.8.8, Objective I-7.1, Policy I-7.1.1, Policy I-7.2.1, and Policy I-7.2.2.

7.All land development regulations enacted, amended, or rescinded within an area of critical state concern must be consistent with the principles for guiding development for that area. See section 380.05(6), Florida Statutes. The Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern are set forth in Rule 28-26.003(1), Florida Administrative Code.

8. The Ordinance is consistent with the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern as a whole.

WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Commerce finds that Lake County Ordinance No. 2023-67 is consistent with the Lake County Comprehensive Plan and the Principles for Guiding Development for the Green Swamp Area of Critical State Concern and is hereby APPROVED.
