40B-2.331 Modification of Permits.

A permittee may seek modification of an unexpired permit consistent with Rule 40B-1.709, F.A.C. Either the Executive Director, the Assistant Executive Director, or the Deputy Executive Director shall approve proposed modifications

without a hearing, in the following circumstances, except that any request for modification recommended for denial shall be presented to the Governing Board for final agency action:

- (1) A permittee may apply for modification by letter to the District if the proposed modification involves water use less than 100,000 gallons per day; and either:
- (a) A change in conditions has resulted in the water allowed under the permit becoming inadequate for the permittee's need; or
- (b) The proposed modification would result in a more efficient use of water than is possible under the existing permit; or
- (c) The proposed modification is to voluntarily implement the District's water use monitoring requirements as set forth in Section 3.4 of the Water Use Permitting Guide.
 - (2) through (5) No change.

THE FOLLOWING LANGUAGE IS PROPOSED TO BE ADDED TO THE WATER USE PERMITTING GUIDE:

3.4.3 Incentives for Voluntary Monitoring

Existing permittees who seek to voluntarily implement these monitoring requirements more than one year prior to the expiration date of their permits may seek a permit modification pursuant to 40B-2.331(1)(c), FAC. Upon such application and request from the applicant, the District will evaluate whether to modify the existing permit duration, provided the applicant demonstrates reasonable assurances that the use will continue to meet the initial conditions for issuance for the requested duration. No permit duration will be modified pursuant to this provision for a period of less than five years or longer than ten years.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rules establish numeric nutrient criteria for total nitrogen, total phosphorus, and chlorophyll a in individual estuary segments for the

following Panhandle estuaries: Perdido Bay, Pensacola Bay (including Escambia Bay), Choctawhatchee Bay, St. Andrew Bay, St. Joseph Bay, and Apalachicola Bay.

SUMMARY: The Department is amending Rule 62-302.532, F.A.C., to establish numeric nutrient criteria for total nitrogen, total phosphorus, and chlorophyll a in individual estuary segments for the following Panhandle estuaries: Perdido Bay, Pensacola Bay (including Escambia Bay), Choctawhatchee Bay, St. Andrew Bay, St. Joseph Bay, and Apalachicola Bay. Subsection 62-302.532(3), F.A.C., requires that the Department establish by rule or final order estuary specific numeric interpretations of the narrative nutrient criteria for TN and TP for Perdido Bay, Pensacola Bay (including Escambia Bay), St. Andrew Bay, Choctawhatchee Bay, and Apalachicola Bay by June 30, 2013.
