53ER13-8	Retailer FLORIDA LOTTO™ Bonus Commission Program

SUMMARY: The rule describes the Retailer FLORIDA LOTTO™ Bonus Commission Program in which the Florida Lottery will award bonus commissions to retailers that sell a winning jackpot ticket for a Wednesday or Saturday FLORIDA LOTTO drawing. This rule replaces Rule 53ER9-70, F.A.C.

THE FULL TEXT OF THE EMERGENCY RULE IS:

53ER13-8 Retailer FLORIDA LOTTO™ Bonus Commission Program.

(1) The Florida Lottery will conduct, as a retailer sales incentive, a Retailer FLORIDA LOTTO™ Bonus Commission Program (“Program”) in which the Florida Lottery will award bonus commissions to retailers that sell a winning jackpot ticket for a Wednesday or Saturday FLORIDA LOTTO drawing.

(2) The bonus commission will start at \$10,000. In the event no winning jackpot ticket is sold for a FLORIDA LOTTO drawing, the bonus commission amount will increase by \$5,000 per draw until a winning jackpot ticket is sold, at which time the bonus commission will start over at \$10,000.

(3) If multiple winning jackpot tickets are sold for the same FLORIDA LOTTO drawing, the retailers selling such tickets will share the bonus commissions. Each retailer selling a winning jackpot ticket will receive a share of the bonus equal to the number of winning jackpot tickets sold by that particular retailer divided by the total number of winning jackpot tickets sold for that drawing.

(4) Award of a bonus commission is not dependent upon the winning jackpot ticket being claimed by the winner.

(5) Retailers whose Florida Lottery contracts are terminated or inactivated prior to the bonus commission award shall be paid the bonus commission earned provided said termination or inactivation was not due to noncompliance with Chapter 24, Florida Statutes, Chapter 53, Florida Administrative Code or contract terms.

(6) A bonus commission will be considered compensation to the retailer for Internal Revenue Service purposes. The Florida Lottery reserves the right to apply a bonus commission earned against a retailer’s outstanding debt to the Florida Lottery, and to award the remaining balance of the bonus commission, if any.

(7) FLORIDA LOTTO bonus commissions are subject to availability of funds appropriated for retailer incentives. This Program is subject to cancellation by future emergency rule if retailer incentive funding is not appropriated or if the Florida Lottery determines that it is no longer in the state’s best interest to use such funds for this purpose.

53ER13-9 Instant Game Number 1181, \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE.

(1) Name of Game. Instant Game Number 1181, “\$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE.”

(2) Price. \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE lottery tickets sell for \$1.00 per ticket.

(3) \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE lottery tickets shall have a series of numbers in machine readable code (or bar code) on the back of the ticket, along with a validation number under the latex area on the ticket. To be a valid winning \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE lottery ticket, the ticket must meet the applicable requirements of Rule 53ER12-80, F.A.C.

(4) The “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols and play symbol captions are as follows:

(8) Determination of Prizewinners.

(a) A ticket having a play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the "YOUR NUMBERS" play area that matches the play symbol and corresponding play symbol caption in the "WINNING NUMBER" play area shall entitle the claimant to the corresponding prize shown for that symbol.



A ticket having a "DOUBLE" symbol in the "YOUR NUMBERS" play area shall entitle the claimant to double the prize shown for that symbol.

(b) The prizes are: \$1.00, \$2.00, \$4.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00, \$40.00, \$100, \$1,000 and

(9) \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE Prize Payment Options.

(a) A winner of a \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE prize may choose one of three payment options for receiving his or her prize. Payment options are "cash option," "weekly payment" or "annual payment." At the time the \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE prize is claimed, the terminal will produce a top prize player claim instructions ticket. The winner has sixty (60) days from the date the player claim instructions ticket is produced to file a claim choosing the cash option. If a winner does not choose the cash option within such time, the winner will be required to choose between the weekly payment option and the annual payment option. Once the winner files a claim and exercises the winner's chosen option, the election of that option shall be final.

(b) Cash option prizes will be paid in a single cash payment equal to the amount of cash required to purchase U.S. Government Securities that would fund the applicable prize amount of \$500 a week for a twenty year period, less applicable federal withholding taxes. This figure will be determined during the week following the date on which the \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE prize is claimed by obtaining quotes from at least two investment sources. The quote costing the least to fund the twenty year payment stream will be the amount of the cash option prize.

(c) Weekly payment prizes claimed by an individual will be paid in equal weekly installments of \$500, less applicable federal withholding taxes, for the life of the winner, with a minimum of twenty years, which equals \$520,000. Weekly payment prizes claimed by a trust, corporation or other legal entity shall be paid in equal weekly installments of \$500 for a period not greater than twenty years, less applicable federal withholding taxes.

(d) Annual payment prizes claimed by an individual will be paid in annual installments of \$26,000, less applicable tax withholding taxes, for the life of the winner, with a minimum of twenty years, which equals \$520,000.

(e) Following the end of the guaranteed twenty year payment period, weekly payment prizes will be converted to annual payments.

(f) At the end of the guaranteed twenty year payment period, winners receiving weekly payments or annual payments will be required to provide evidence to the Lottery that they are still living. Thereafter, winners will be required to provide such evidence on an annual basis prior to receipt of their next scheduled payment.

(g) Any interest or earnings accruing on a \$500 A WEEK FOR LIFE prize prior to the prize payment or purchase of securities, under either the cash option or the weekly or annual payment option, shall accrue to the State of Florida and not to the winner.

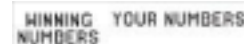
