PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To update Forms VSP-02, Virtual Instruction Program Application for Provider Approval and VSP-02R, Virtual Instruction Program Application for Provider Renewal, incorporated by reference. Having received stakeholder input, the provider approval and renewal applications will be revised for clarity and efficiency. Changes to these form include: Elimination of a reference to a repealed

statute, section 1006.281, pertaining to Learning Management Systems; clarification regarding required documentation necessary to demonstrate compliance with statutory requirements outlined in section 1002.45, Florida Statutes; and reorganizing existing items for clarity.

SUMMARY: This rule outlines the process by which organizations and individuals become approved to offer Florida approved virtual programs.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: Approximately ten private businesses apply to be a virtual instruction program provider. There will be no out-of-pocket expenses for compliance with the rule, except staff time to gather the documentation requested. The proposed revisions to this rule seek to streamline the process, provide clear instructions regarding the documentation applicants must submit, and eliminate submission of unnecessary documentation; therefore, any economic impact on the regulated entities will be cost savings. This aligns performance standards to be consistent with the state’s plan under the federally funded Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006.

(1) Each Florida College System institution board of trustees, each district school board with a career center authorized under Section 1001.44, F.S. and each board of directors for a charter technical career center authorized under Section 1002.34, F.S., shall waive out-of-state fees for:

(a) Honorably discharged veterans of the United States Armed and Reserve Forces (Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, and Navy) and the National Guard (Army and Air) or any other student who is entitled to and uses educational assistance provided by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs who physically resides in Florida while enrolled as a degree or certificate seeking student. Tuition and fees charged to a student who qualifies for the out-of-state fee waiver under this subsection may not exceed the tuition and fees charged a resident student enrolled in the same program.

(b) Active duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States residing or stationed outside of Florida who are enrolled as a degree or certificate seeking student. Tuition and fees charged to a student who qualifies for the out-of-state fee waiver under this subsection may not exceed the tuition and fees charged to a resident student enrolled in the same program.

 RULE TITLE: Fee Generated Adult and Vocational Student Financial Aid

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To update the reporting requirements for school districts on the collection of the optional student financial aid fee for non-exempt students enrolled in clock hour certificate programs and to remove obsolete language.

SUMMARY: Districts may assess financial aid fees for students enrolled in career certificate and applied technology diploma programs. This fee is collected locally and the funds are distributed in financial aid awards. The current rule prescribes the accounting and reporting procedures for this revenue collection and provides student eligibility requirements. The amendment to the rule removes all references to the obsolete term "vocational" and updates the reporting requirements for information on student awarded financial aid from this funding source and revenue collection.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: Districts may assess financial aid fees for students enrolled in career certificate and applied technology diploma programs. This fee is collected locally and the funds are distributed in financial aid awards to students with financial need. Districts report financial and student level information on these awards to the Department of Education. None of these amendments will require districts to change their current practices nor will there be any costs or additional fees associated with the rule amendment. Based upon past experiences with this rule and the nature of the amendments, there is not expected to be any economic impact, adverse impact on business competitiveness or increase in regulatory costs as a result of the changes and is not expected to require legislative ratification.

~~Districts shall assess each fee non exempt vocational and adult student a financial aid fee equal to ten (10) percent of the student's required fee amount.~~

(1) All financial aid fees collected from the optional financial aid fee authorized in section 1009.22(5), F.S., shall:

(a) Be deposited in the district's Financial Aid Fee Trust Fund. Revenue in this fund is to be used to pay in full or in part the fees of persons with demonstrated financial need. Funds used to pay students' fees shall be transferred from the Financial Aid Fee Trust Fund to the district's General Fund. Districts may implement an alternative accounting procedure in which financial aid fees are recorded in a discrete General Fund account which is subsequently reduced as these monies are used to pay course fees.

(b) Be used to pay in full or in part the fees of eligible students as quickly as possible. Funds not needed to pay fees may be carried forward for use in the following fiscal year.

(2) A student applying for ~~adult and vocational student~~ financial aid must be a Florida resident and must complete a Pell Grant application. Districts shall use the Pell Grant assessment of the financial need in establishing criteria and procedures for approving financial aid fee awards ~~waivers~~.

(3) Districts shall be required to report on students who were awarded financial aid from this fee through the Department's Comprehensive Management Information System, as prescribed in Rule 6A-1.0014, F.A.C. ~~The Division of Applied Technology and Adult Education shall prescribe an annual report format in which each district shall provide sufficient detail necessary to evaluate the effectiveness of this financial aid program. The annual report shall include at least the following:~~

~~(a) Criteria used to determine student eligibility for financial aid fee payments, the amount and number of payments in full or part by type of student.~~

~~(b) Student demographic data as required by the Commissioner. The data requirements will be limited to data contained in the Division of Public Schools, Student and Staff Data Base.~~

~~(c) Financial data on:~~

~~1. Amount of financial aid fees collected during the fiscal year;~~

~~2. Amount of financial aid fees paid; and,~~

~~3. Balance of financial aid fees unused or unobligated at the end of the fiscal year and carried forward to the next fiscal year.~~

(4) All financial aid fee revenue shall be reported in the district's annual financial report, as prescribed in Rule 6A-1.0071, F.A.C.

(5) Districts shall be required to collect and provide to the Department of Education on request an annual report of financial aid fee data to include the following:

1. Amount of financial aid fees collected during the fiscal year;

2. Amount of financial aid fees paid; and,
