Services required to be provided under the Continuing Service Contracts include the development of record drawings by the Continuing Service Consultant for projects designed by that consultant to reflect as-built conditions to facilitate the University's space management program. Any new construction projects should have the ability to be USGBC LEED certified, to a minimum certification level of Silver, if required by the Owner and shall be included as part of basic services and will not be considered as an additional service.

The Mechanical/Electrical/Plumbing Engineer Continuing Services contract shall be in compliance with the selection provisions in <u>Section 287.055</u>, Florida Statues, and <u>Board of Governors Regulation 14.005</u>.

In addition to General Liability and Automobile Liability insurance, Blanket Professional Liability insurance will be required for this Contract in the amount of \$250,000 and will be provided as a part of Basic Services.
