(a) Meats/Proteins: the agricultural product must be derived from animals born, raised and finished in Florida. Slaughter and processing must take place in a USDA inspected facility in Florida or within 21 days of exiting the state of Florida en route directly to a USDA inspected slaughter facility, and must comply with USDA labeling guidelines.
