PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This rulemaking requires registrants of residential fumigants to create and maintain a stewardship policy, conduct initial and annual stewardship training, conduct quality assurance reviews of licensees using its residential fumigant, and issue stop sale notices or cease distribution of its product to users not complying with applicable laws, regulations, or the residential fumigant's label requirements. This rulemaking also requires registrants to maintain attendance records for stewardship courses and to assist, if requested, the Department with removal of residential fumigant containers from licensees issued a stop-work or stopuse order by the Department. The effect of this rulemaking is improved structural fumigation safety and regulatory oversight.

SUMMARY: Stewardship requirements for registrants of residential fumigants

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS (SERC) AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION: The Agency has determined that this rule will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on this assessment.

The Department's economic analysis of the adverse impact or potential regulatory costs of the proposed rule did not exceed any of the criteria established in Section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. As part of this analysis, the Department relied upon an economic analysis, which determined that the regulatory costs of the proposed rule are negligible. Additionally, no interested party submitted additional information regarding the economic impact.

5E-2.0105 Definitions.

- (1) through (12) No change.
- (13) "Stewardship Policy" means a written plan that addresses the education and training of all fumigation employees and includes requirements for continued sale and use of the registrant's residential fumigant, instructions to follow the residential fumigant's label requirements and submission to quality assurance inspections conducted by the registrant or designated representative such as distributors and contractors.
- (14) "Fumigation Employee" means any of the following persons who is an employee of a licensee or a person conducting fumigation at the direction of or under the control of a licensee:
- (a) Certified Operators in the fumigation category pursuant to Section 482.111(2)(a), F.S.;
 - (b) Special Identification Cardholders;
- (c) Employee Identification Cardholders with the Fumigation Identification Card endorsement.
- (15) "Residential Fumigant" means a registered pesticide labeled for structural fumigation including or encompassing residential areas in the state of Florida.
- (16) "Licensee," as the term is used in this Rule chapter, means a person, partnership, firm, corporation or other business entity having a license issued under the provisions of Chapter 482, F.S., by the department for engaging in the business of structural pest control in the category of fumigation pursuant to Section 482.111(2)(a), F.S.
- (17) "Permanent stop-sale" means the action taken by the registrant to stop the sale of a residential fumigant to a licensee on a permanent basis after the department has revoked a licensee's license to perform residential fumigations.
- (18) "Extended stop-sale" means the action taken by the registrant to stop the sale of a residential fumigant to a licensee for a determined period of time.

- <u>5E-2.0312 Additional Registration Requirements For Registrants of Structural Furnigants Labeled For Application to Residential Structures.</u>
- (1) Stewardship Policy. Each registrant of a residential fumigant shall adopt and maintain a written Stewardship Policy applicable to each residential fumigant registered with the department. Registrants must submit a copy of each Stewardship Policy to the department prior to selling or distributing a residential fumigant in the state of Florida and within 30 days of making any changes to the policy. A registrant shall not sell or distribute a residential fumigant to any licensee who has not agreed, in writing, to the Stewardship Policy for the residential fumigant sold or distributed.
 - (2) The Stewardship Policy shall include the following:
- (a) Training requirements. All stewardship training shall be conducted by the registrant or their designated representative including distributors and contractors, for all fumigation employees that perform fumigation using the registrant's residential fumigant.
- 1. There shall be an Initial Stewardship Training and an Annual Stewardship Training. All related courses, sessions, and instruction must be identified accordingly.
 - 2. The Initial Stewardship Training shall include:
 - a. Proper use, handling, and storage of the registrant's residential fumigant;
 - b. The proper use and calibration requirements for label-approved clearance detection devices;
 - c. The proper use of label-required safety equipment including the self contained breathing apparatus;
- d. Review of the label, manual, Safety Data Sheets, safety procedures, and Stewardship Policy for the registrant's residential fumigant; and
- e. Dosage calculation for the registrant's residential fumigant.
 - 3. The Annual Stewardship Training shall include:
- <u>a. Review of the proper use, handling, and care of safety</u> equipment and clearance detection devices;
- b. Review of labeling and registrant stewardship requirements for worker protection and public safety;
- c. Review of any updates to registrant's residential fumigant labeling; and
- d. Review of any updates to registrant's residential fumigant Stewardship Policy.
- (b) Quality assurance reviews (QAR): QARs must be conducted by the registrant or their designated representative at least once per calendar year for each licensee using the

- registrant's residential fumigant. The QAR shall include an on-site observation of the licensee's fumigation employees conducting a structural fumigation using the registrant's residential fumigant. The QAR may be conducted at different sites and on different fumigation employees of the licensee in order for the registrant to complete subparagraphs 1. and 2.
 - 1. The QAR shall include observations of:
 - a. Preparation of structure for fumigation;
- <u>b. Introduction of chloropicrin and registrant's residential</u> fumigant;
 - c. Initiation of aeration and active aeration; and
 - d. Final clearance testing.
- 2. The QAR shall include verification that the following items are at the fumigation site:
- a. Two (2) self-contained breathing apparati according to the product label;
 - b. Secondary locks;
 - c. Proper signage in accordance with Rule 5E-14.112, F.A.C.;
 - d. Registrant's residential fumigant label-approved clearance devices.
 - e. Registrant's residential fumigant label-required personal protective equipment.
- 3. The registrant or designated representative must document the date, licensee's name, fumigation employee(s) observed, phase of fumigation process observed, and registrant representative conducting the QAR. These records shall be maintained for a two-year period from the date of the fumigation and are subject to department inspection.
- (c) Probation and Stop Sale. The Stewardship Policy shall include procedures for the issuance of probation or stop sale notices to licensees who use the registrant's residential fumigant. The Stewardship Policy shall also describe options for corrective actions to be completed by a licensee in the event the registrant places a licensee on probation or issue a stop-sale notice and shall describe how corrective actions shall be determined.
- 1. The registrant shall place a licensee on probation or issue a stop-sale notice to a licensee if the registrant receives verifiable documentation of an observation by the registrant's employee or designated representative or a report of an inspection conducted by the department that the licensee has failed to follow critical safety procedures including the proper use of the following as determined by the registrant's residential fumigant label and Rule Chapters 5E -2 and 5E-14, F.A.C.:
 - a. Chloropicrin;
 - b. Self-contained breathing apparatus;
 - c. Approved clearance devices;
 - d. Secondary locks and barricades; or
 - e. Any other safety procedure critical to the protection of

workers, bystanders, homeowners, or the public as prescribed by the residential fumigant's label and Rule Chapters 5E-2 and 5E-14, F.A.C.

- 2. The registrant shall notify in writing, the licensee, all Florida distributors of the registrant's residential fumigant, and the department of a decision to place a licensee on probation or stop the sale and distribution of a residential fumigant to the licensee, within 15 business days of the registrant receiving confirmation that the licensee has failed to follow a critical safety procedure as outlined in subparagraph (c)1. of this rule.
- 3. Notification to the department shall be made by utilizing the department's electronic fumigation notification website, http://fumigation.freshfromflorida.com, or by submitting a completed Registrant Notification of Stewardship Compliance Action (FDACS-13001, 01/17), which is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and available online at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-

XXXXX , by email to biirfumigation@freshfromflorida.com or by facsimile to (850)617-7968.

- 4. The registrant shall place a licensee on probation for no less than six months if the licensee fails to follow at least one critical safety procedure as outlined in subparagraph (c)1. of this rule while using the registrant's residential fumigant. Probation may be terminated at any time during the probationary period if the licensee completes all corrective actions recommended by the registrant and submits to a QAR in compliance with paragraph (1)(b).
- 5. The registrant shall issue an extended stop sale and stop the distribution of its residential fumigant to a licensee if within a six-month period, the licensee fails to follow two or more critical safety procedures as outlined in subparagraph (c)1. while using a residential fumigant, or if the licensee fails to follow at least one critical safety procedure while on probation. The registrant shall lift the extended stop-sale only if the licensee completes all corrective actions recommended by the registrant. Once the extended stop-sale is lifted, the registrant can resume the sale and distribution of the registrant's residential fumigant to the licensee. Upon resuming the sale and distribution of the residential fumigant to the licensee, the registrant shall place the licensee on probation for no less than six months. If the licensee fails to follow at least one critical safety procedure while on probation after the extended stop-sale, the registrant shall notify the department and recommend suspension or revocation of the licensee's license to perform residential fumigations. The registrant shall re-issue the extended stop-sale notice to the licensee if the department suspends the licensee's license to perform residential fumigations. The extended stop-sale shall remain in place until the department lifts the suspension.
 - 6. The registrant shall issue a permanent stop-sale notice

- when the department revokes a licensee's license to perform residential fumigations.
- 7. The registrant shall notify all Florida distributors of the registrant's residential fumigant in writing when probation or a stop-sale is lifted.
- (d) The Stewardship Policy shall require licensees to return any unused residential fumigant and all residential fumigant containers to the registrant upon notification of a permanent or extended stop-sale and shall require all Florida distributors of the registrant's residential fumigant who are no longer contracted by the registrant for distribution of the registrant's residential fumigant to return any unused residential fumigant and any and all residential fumigant containers to the registrant. At the request of the registrant, a department representative shall be present at the site of the licensee during the removal of the registrant's residential fumigant containers.
- (3) Continuing Educational Approval. Registrants or their designated representatives must apply to the department for Continuing Educational Units (CEU) for all Stewardship Training programs. Registrants are required to use the department's designated CEU registration program website at https://ceu.freshfromflorida.com/.
- (a) The department shall approve Annual and Initial Stewardship Training programs for the granting of CEUs in fumigation when the Stewardship Training programs meet the criteria set forth in Rule 5E-9.029, F.A.C. Annual Stewardship Training will be allocated one (1) fumigation CEU. Initial Stewardship Training will be allocated two (2) fumigation CEUs. All Stewardship Training programs shall be conducted in-person and must comply with paragraph (2)(a) of this rule.
- (b) The department shall be allowed to attend and monitor Stewardship Training courses conducted by the registrant to evaluate whether the training requirements set forth in paragraph (2)(a) of this rule have been met. Department inspectors shall document their observations using the Stewardship Monitoring Report, (FDACS- 13003, 01/17) which is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference and available online at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-

SUMMARY: This rulemaking creates stewardship and continuing education training requirements for licensees purchasing and using residential fumigants. It also revises general fumigation notification requirements and specifies standards for recordkeeping.

40D-8.624 Guidance and Minimum Levels for Lakes PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose of this rulemaking is to adopt revised minimum and guidance levels for Lake Juanita, Rainbow Lake, Little Moon Lake, and Horse Lake located in Hillsborough County. The effect of the rule is to support the District's water supply planning, water use permitting, and environmental resource permitting programs. SUMMARY: Section 373.042, F.S., requires the District to establish minimum flows and levels for lakes, wetlands, rivers and aguifers within the District's boundaries. Section 373.0421(3), F.S., further requires the District to periodically reevaluate and revise adopted minimum flows and levels. This rulemaking is necessary to delete the previously adopted levels, and adopt new guidance and minimum levels for Lake Juanita, Rainbow Lake, Little Moon Lake, and Horse Lake located in Hillsborough County. The establishment and periodic evaluation of minimum levels is required by statute to ensure that the minimum hydrologic requirements of the water resources and ecology of this lake are maintained. The revised minimum and guidance levels for Lake Juanita, Rainbow Lake, Little Moon Lake, and Horse Lake are being developed using previously peer-reviewed, Governing Board adopted methods.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

Federal policy clarifying application of the MBTA to nest destruction indicates that no federal permit or other authorization is needed to destroy an inactive nest. RULE TITLE: Basic Abilities Test Requirements for Applicant Admission into a Law Enforcement and Correctional Basic Recruit Training Program

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on January 10, 2017, the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission received a petition for a permanent waiver of paragraph 11B-35.0011(1)(h), F.A.C., from Paul J. Kiley, Director of Basic Training and Career Development of Miami-Dade College on behalf of Jose Hernandez. Petitioner wishes to permanently waive that portion of the Rule that states: "(1) To comply with Section 943.17(1)(g), F.S., applicants who apply for entry into a Commission-approved Basic Recruit Training Program after January 1, 2002, shall obtain a passing score on a Commission-approved Basic Abilities Test (BAT) for the law enforcement or correctional disciplines, prior to entering a program. The BAT shall be administered in the state of Florida...(h) A passing score on a Commission-approved Basic Abilities Test is valid four years from the date of the test." Petitioner states that Mr. Hernandez passed a Floridaadministered BAT on April 30, 2012, giving him a valid BAT score until April 30, 2016. Mr. Hernandez subsequently enrolled in a Basic Recruit Training Program offered by Miami-Dade College, set to begin prior to the expiration of his BAT score. However, in an effort to meet its minimum class size criteria, Petitioner rescheduled the start date of the Basic Recruit Training Program to June 13, 2016, a date after the expiration of Mr. Hernandez's BAT score. The error was discovered on November 8, 2016, and Mr. Hernandez sat for and passed a second Florida-administered BAT on November 9, 2016. Mr. Hernandez ultimately completed and passed the Basic Recruit Training Program on November 17, 2016. The Petitioner asserts that Mr. Hernandez would suffer an economic hardship should the waiver not be granted, as Mr. Hernandez would be unable to obtain employment as a law enforcement officer without completing and passing another Basic Recruit Training Program. The Department of Environmental Protection (the "Department") has established an application submission cycle and will accept grant applications for the Recreational Trails Program ("RTP") for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 under the following terms:

APPLICATION SUBMISSION PERIOD: The Department is accepting applications from February 15, 2017 through February 28, 2017. Completed applications must be postmarked on or before February 28, 2017.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: Eligible applicants include all local governmental entities and state or federal agencies, federally or state recognized Indian tribal governments which have the legal responsibility for the provision of outdoor recreational sites and facilities for the use and benefit of the public, and active Florida nonprofit corporations which have an agreement with a governmental agency to develop public lands.

INELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: A grantee with two incomplete RTP projects by the closing date of the application submission period shall not be eligible to apply.

APPLICATION LIMIT PER SUBMISSION CYCLE: The maximum number of applications an applicant may submit shall be as follows: local governments may submit one; consolidated city-county government may submit two; nonprofit corporations may submit one; state and federal agencies may submit one per district.

ELIGIBLE PROJECT SITES: The site of a proposed RTP project shall be on public lands. The site shall be owned by the applicant or government on or before the closing date of the application submission period. A site not owned by the applicant or government shall be under the applicant's or government's control by a 99-year lease or similar control, such that the applicant has the legal ability to dedicate and manage the site for public recreational trail use pursuant to subsections 62S-2.076(1) and (2), F.A.C. School board property used primarily for educational or school related purposes is not eligible. In addition, nonprofit corporations must provide a letter from the land owner or managing agency stating that it supports the project and will abide by the compliance requirements of this rule, and the Guidance.

The federal requirements for funding 30% motorized trails has not been met in recent years due to low application submissions for motorized projects and federal funding has been reduced for not meeting this threshold. Therefore, staff encourages submittal of applications for motorized trail and motorized recreational projects.

ELIGIBLE PROJECT TYPES: The primary purpose of the project must be for providing recreational trails for the public and may include Motorized Trail, Nonmotorized Trail, and Mixed-Use Trail projects which facilitate recreational trail use. Recreational Trail means a thoroughfare or track across land or water, used for recreational purposes such as bicycling, day hiking, equestrian activities, jogging or similar fitness activities, trail biking, overnight and long distance backpacking, roller skating, in-line skating, running, aquatic or water activity and vehicular travel by motorcycle, four-wheel

drive, all terrain off-road vehicles or dune buggies per 62S-2.070 (39), F.A.C. Projects may include facilities such as boat launches, docks, and related facilities to create or enhance recreational trail opportunities.

PERMISSIBLE USES OF RTP GRANT FUNDS: Maintenance or renovation of existing trails; Development or renovation of trailside or trailhead facilities or trail linkages; Purchase of trail construction or maintenance equipment; Construction of new trails on local and state lands; Construction of new trails crossing federal lands; Operation of educational programs to promote safety and environmental protection which specifically relate to the uses of recreational trails, to the extent the Department has not chosen to use the educational funds in whole or in part, to further a statewide goal of the Greenways and Trails Plan.

MAXIMUM GRANT REQUEST: The maximum grant amount per project type is as follows: Nonmotorized Trail: \$200,000; Mixed Use Trail: \$500,000; Motorized Trail: \$500,000. Grant awards are distributed on a reimbursement basis and are contingent upon an apportionment from the Federal Highway Administration and expenditure authorization by the Florida Legislature.

MATCH REQUIREMENTS: The RTP grant is provided on a 50:50, 60:40, or 80:20 matching ratio (program: grantee).
