PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The proposed rule is being developed to update testing offered at the Bronson Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory and the fee schedule associated with the testing. Industry partners including Pilgrim's Pride, Florida Cattlemen's Association, Cal-Maine, and the Animal Industry Technical Council (AITC) were consulted and they are in agreement with the proposed changes. THE lab offers this testing as a service and not as a required regulatory fee.

SUMMARY: To update tests offered by the Bronson Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory and associated fees to fall in line with national standards.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF ESTIMATED REGULATORY COSTS AND LEGISLATIVE RATIFICATION:

The Agency has determined that this will not have an adverse impact on small business or likely increase directly or indirectly regulatory costs in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate within one year after the implementation of the rule. A SERC has not been prepared by the Agency.

The Agency has determined that the proposed rule is not expected to require legislative ratification based on the statement of estimated regulatory costs or if no SERC is required, the information expressly relied upon and described herein: The Department's economic analysis of the adverse impact or potential regulatory costs of the proposed rule did not exceed any of the criteria established in Section 120.541(2)(a), Florida Statutes. As a part of this analysis, the Department relied upon the fact that the testing offered at the Bronson Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory is a service provided and there is no regulatory requirement that the lab must be used. 5C-13.0035 Definitions

(1) Enhanced Virus Isolation- virus isolation techniques requiring specialized media.

(2) Food and Fiber animals- animal species commonly used as a food source or in food production. Species include cattle, swine, goats, sheep, poultry, captive cervids, alpacas, llamas, and rabbits.

(3) Non-poultry- any of a class of (Aves) of warm-blooded vertebrates distinguished by having the body more or less completely covered with feathers and the forelimbs modified as wings that are not defined as poultry in 5C-13.0035(5) F.A.C.

(4) Other animals- any animal not meeting the definition of Food and Fiber animals, non-poultry, or poultry as defined in 5C-13.0035(2)-(3),(5) F.A.C.

(5) Poultry- domesticated fowl, including chickens, turkeys, ostriches, emus, rheas, cassowaries, waterfowl and game birds (including restocking supplies of game birds), except doves and pigeons, which are bred for the primary purpose of producing eggs, meat, or for breeding these categories of birds.

(6) Surveillance- a form of data recording that encompasses gathering, documenting, and analyzing data to evaluate disease status for disease eradication or control. Rulemaking Authority 570.07(23), 585.002(3) FS. Law Implemented

(c) Requested testing not available at Bronson Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory will be sent to an accredited laboratory or a lab that can accommodate the request. These tests will incur additional charges based on the fee schedule of the other lab.

(d) Shipments to outside laboratories will be charged \$10.00 per accession.

(e) Enhanced Virus Isolation will be assessed \$30.00 for Food and Fiber animals and \$60.00 for all non-Food and Fiber animals.

(3) Cremations will not be performed for animals except those received as part of a diagnostic testing submission.

(4) No portion of an animal's body, ashes, collars, tissues or other articles will be returned following a lab service listed in Table #1 of 5-13.004(1) F.A.C.

(5) Necropsy includes all in-house testing except for rabies test, where no human exposure was established.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: The purpose and effect of this rulemaking is to repeal Rule 5E-2.040, Florida Administrative Code, made obsolete by revisions to Section 487.041, Florida Statutes related to supplemental registration fees for certain pesticides that contain active ingredients for which the United States Environmental Protection Agency has established food tolerance limits which were effective July 1, 2017.

SUMMARY: The provisions related to supplemental registration fees for certain pesticides that contain active ingredients for which the United States Environmental Protection Agency has established food tolerance limits were removed from Section 487.041, F.S. effective July 1, 2017. Specifically, Section 487.041(2), F.S. removed the requirement for the biennial publishing of the list of active ingredients for which a brand of pesticide is subject to the supplemental registration fee. This list adopted and incorporated by reference in Rule 5E-2.040, F.A.C., is no longer required by statute and this rule is obsolete.

60A-1.011: Identical Evaluations of Responses

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: This Notice provides a substantial rewording of rule 60A-1.006, F.A.C., which removes unnecessary wording and provides clarification of the criteria by which the Department evaluates possible vendor suspension and reinstatement, and repeals rule 60A-1.011, F.A.C., which is unnecessary to accomplish the objectives of the laws implemented.

SUMMARY: The amendment of rule 60A-1.006, F.A.C., to clarify the responsibilities of vendors, agencies, and the Department when a vendor fails to fulfill its specified contractual duties. The repeal of rule 60A-1.011, F.A.C. eliminates duplication of multiple statutes.

(e) Upon placement out-of-state for residential treatment, the child welfare professional and CBC point of contact shall remain involved in the child's treatment and discharge planning. 90-Day Reviews are an essential component to this monitoring and have the following requirements:
